

Dear Friends.

A few week's ago I went away for four days to Swanwick in Derbyshire for Salisbury diocesan conference where all the clergy, including Archdeacons and Bishops, gathered together for a time of teaching, worship and let's be honest, sleeping! There were



excellent speakers and workshops but it was very noticeable that quite a number of people were so tired that the minute they sat down they fell asleep, and I admit to being one of them. I did imbibe some wisdom I think, and it was lovely not to have to cook for a few days, but now it is back to real life with the reality of trying to visit where I can, write interesting sermons (that don't result in half the congregation asleep!), baptise babies, marry lovely couples, plan and take funerals and just do what a parish priest does as best I can.

The theme of the conference was 'Faith in an age of uncertainty'. My words in the July magazine about living in uncertain times and the difficulty of responding appropriately at the right moment were horrifically fulfilled in the shape of the fire at Grenfell Tower. While of course we are all still incredibly shocked and saddened by those events, time marches on and the tragedy is no longer headline news, what with all the debates about Brexit and the prime minister's leadership. But those involved in the events of that night have no choice in the matter, they can not decide to push what happened to one side to focus on happier things because they are living day by day, moment by moment, with pain, grief and terrible loss that will change them irrevocably, and which will haunt them for the rest of their lives.

I must admit to a personal connection to all this; as many of our church family know, my youngest son works at the Clement James Centre next to Grenfell Tower and has been and continues to work with the children and families who lived there. He has told me terrible stories of unimaginable suffering, but also stories of hope and generosity, of community and human kindness. How deeply sad that it has taken a tragedy like this to make us see our failings clearly and recognise the need for a better way, a more compassionate way.

Part of me wants to talk to you about holidays and such like, about happier things and yes, there is much to celebrate and give thanks for. But it seems important to keep articulating what has gone wrong; we cannot go back to where we were before, our eyes have been opened to injustices that must be addressed. Jesus said the poor would always be with us and they will, so it is up to us to make sure we speak for them and make sure they are not forgotten.

Do enjoy this lovely month of August, hopefully with family and friends. And if you are waiting for exam results, good luck! A new adventure awaits you.



Nature Notes

The house martins are very active just outside the window as I write this. Both nests have now fledged and I think that the adults are contemplating a second brood. I have just been up to the stables to check on the swallows and could see 2 beaks poking out from the edge of the nest. They must have only just hatched and I am hoping



that I will see more beaks when I look again in a day or two. I thought that the nest the house martins had started building on top of the swift box had been abandoned but it is now being visited again. I doubt if it will produce anything this year and might be for roosting purposes only. I have certainly seen house martins going inside the swift box so they probably use that to roost in too.

House sparrows have fledged from the nest box near the front door (the first time it has been used) and from the nest in the eaves just outside the utility room, and also from at least one nest in the honeysuckle on the east wall of the house. We have still got blackbirds collecting food (and grateful for the mealworms I have been putting out) and I can see that the adult birds are beginning now to moult. This will be their last brood of the season. We have had lots of tits on the feeders,



mainly blue but recently a family of long-tailed tits. I know when they are about as they are constantly calling to each other. I also know when there is a family of goldfinches near the feeders as the young are so noisy constantly demanding food from the parents. We have had a young great spotted woodpecker coming to feast on the peanuts regularly; easily identified as a youngster by the

red crown on its head. The increase in young naïve birds in the garden has attracted the sparrow hawk. Some days the amount of food taken is a lot lower than I would expect and I am then pretty sure that the sparrow hawk has been about and 'cleared' the garden. Either that or a cat has been lurking.

The hot weather in June brought the dragonflies and damselflies out over the pond. Butterflies and bees were about in good numbers too. One day I walked around the margin of the field nearby and saw lots of marbled white butterflies. I thought when I saw them that there seemed to be some which were larger, and looking up in the book I found that the female is indeed bigger than the male and apparently paler though I had not spotted that. One evening when watering I saw a leaf cutter bee disappear with a piece of leaf in its mouth (made identification easy!) into the bottom of a flowerpot. Recently I have seen some lovely red admiral and peaceth butterflies, newly batched I would think, as their

and peacock butterflies, newly hatched I would think, as their colours were so vibrant. Just 2 days ago I had a very fleeting glimpse of a humming-bird hawkmoth feeding on the everlasting sweet peas just outside the kitchen window.

Longbridge Deverill Parish Council

The meeting scheduled for 3rd July was brought forward a week to accommodate a planning application where comments were due back to Wiltshire Council. Update on Implementation of Superfast Broadband in Crockerton, Openreach have confirmed a blockage in the duct from Warminster to cabinet Warminster 7 (cabinet on the Green on A350). This will involve traffic management and out of hours working to build the 400m of duct across the carriageway. They are currently working with planning, their supplier and highways to complete the works. They have confirmed that the physical build is complete, which means the cabinet is stood with a power supply and connected with copper cables. The Parish Council would like to remind landowners it is their responsibility to ensure hedges, trees and vegetation does not encroach onto paths, highways and rivers.

The issue is important for the Upper Deverills as it risks a dramatic increase in HGV traffic, west-bound, on the B3095. Other ongoing matters include an invitation to Wiltshire Council to become more actively engaged in flood mitigation measures in Brixton and Monkton Deverill, together with the continued deployment of the Speed Indicator Device.
