
Longbridge Deverill Parish Hall



CROCKERTON VILLAGE COMMITTEE

Please help cover Crockerton in Poppies to mark the centenary of the end of the First World War. The Committee aim to cover the village in poppies!



Knitted Poppies Pattern

Using 4mm needles cast on 120 stitches in red DK wool. Knit 4 rows in garter stitch. Next row - knit 3 together to the end of row (or slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over). Knit 4 rows in garter stitch (if you would like to knit the centre, change to black wool and ignore instruction about button etc.)

Next row - knit 2 together to end of row. Knit 4 rows in garter stitch. Next row - knit 2 together to end of row. Fasten off last 10 stitches by threading wool through remaining stitches and sewing up the side. Sew on a black button or wool to create a centre.

Crocheted Poppies Pattern

4.5 hook. Ch3, join with slip stitch to form circle. Ch3, work 9dc into centre of circle and join with slip stitch. Work three petals separately. Petal 1: Ch3, work 1st dc into same stitch, work 2dc into each of the next 3 stitches Ch1, work 2sc into each stitch, tie off. Petal 2: Work 2dc into last dc of previous petal, work 2dc into each of the next 3 stitches Ch1, work 2sc into each stitch, tie off. Petal 3 as second.

Nature Notes

The garden is full of young birds and food disappears fast, the youngsters have no table manners and keeping the feeders relatively clean is never ending. I have seen lots of young goldfinches, they are very noisy and messy. They lack red on the head of the adult which easily tells them apart. We have lots of young blue tits who are constantly calling to the parents. A family of starlings came to the feeders, which is unusual and was lovely to watch, there were 4 youngsters which were quite well

grown and feeding for themselves. Young starlings are brown in colour contrasting with the almost black colour with starring, of the adults. There have been a good number of young blackbirds still enjoying the sultanas I have been putting out. There are also lots of young house sparrows equally as messy.



Both green and great spotted woodpeckers are regular visitors. The green one spends time feeding along the edge of the pond, where I know there are ant nests. The great spotted one feeds on the peanuts. I have seen both sexes of both types, they must have

active nests nearby. We have a pair of swallows in the stables and I am hoping to see or hear youngsters soon. Both compartments of the artificial house martin nest box appear to be in use, but I have not heard young yet. There have not been many swifts here or in town, I understand nationally their numbers are much reduced this year. All summer migrants will have a shorter breeding period due to the very late spring. Swifts usually leave by the end of August, it takes about 9 weeks before the young fledge, so hopefully they are sitting on eggs now.

In mid May I walked up to Bidcombe Hill through an old wood which has not been touched for years. I was hoping to see the bluebells, I was not disappointed, they were gorgeous. Before reaching them I walked through white ramsons, their onion smell was overpowering. Returning down the hill I was lucky to hear a cuckoo from nearby woods towards Longleat, it is the only time I have heard a cuckoo this year.

We are fortunate to have good numbers of farmland birds around us and I quite often walk around a field nearby and hear and see yellowhammers, corn bunting, skylark, linnet and lesser whitethroat, a summer migrant. The yellow head of the male yellowhammer is like a beacon as it sings "a little bit of bread and no cheese". The corn bunting's song sounds like jangling keys; it is a fairly non-descript brown bird slightly smaller than a blackbird.

The pond is alive with tadpoles at various stages of development and young amphibians climbing out up the ramps. I think they are young toads as they are black, most of the tadpoles are black, but in amongst the writhing mass I have seen light brown amphibians which are frogs. On 'Springwatch' they said toads exude a toxic substance making them unpalatable so they escape being eaten by predators, this explains why there are more toads than frogs.

Upper Deverills Parish Council - reminder River Weed cutting

Anyone undertaking river weed cutting in the Upper Deverills will be required to remove the weed from the river in accordance with Regulation 38(1) of the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2010, which makes it an offence to cut vegetation in inland waters without taking all reasonable steps to remove it. The Environment Agency have powers under local Land Drainage Byelaws to control how weed is cut and to ensure proper disposal. Cut vegetation cannot be left along the bank and must be appropriately disposed of. If you intend to move the cut weed from the river side to another place of disposal, you will need to register this activity. Please contact the Environment Agency for details. If the weed cut is to be performed in a Site of Special Scientific Interest, you will also need an approval from your local Natural England office (Tel: 0300 060 4628). If you require further information on weed cutting please contact the Environment Agency Customer Contact Centre on 08708 506 506 or visit Environment Agency website: www.environment-agency.gov.uk.

Please be neighbourly, ensure you do not cause any cut weeds or silt to drift downstream causing build-ups and blockages that others will have to clear up!
