

### Dear Friends,

Pauline is away for a few weeks, visiting her daughter who lives in New York. So, she invited me to write these 'Rectors Notes' in her absence; as I write Pauline is relaxing and sipping coffee somewhere in Brooklyn! April and May were very busy months for the church and already June is upon us.



We had our very successful Lent projects, separately in both Parishes of the Benefice, to enable us to become more engaged with the local community. Whilst not duplicating other ventures, we organised a 'Spring Lunch with Friends' in Corsley and an 'Easter Tea' in Longbridge Deverill, both events aimed to introduce different parts of the community who do not usually meet together. They drew in the schools (the children designing and producing invitations and posters), a church team producing the food and guests from the Parish. In the Deverills we had over 40 people attend, with a mix of members from the congregation, a group from Longbridge House and a number of other residents from the villages. We were also joined from the Diocese by the Archdeaconry Rural Field Officer. Both events were a great success, many thanks again to all who participated.

In a packed church we celebrated this next stage of Pauline's ministry and then had the opportunity to meet the Bishop over tea.





By the time you read this, and as we look forward to the Summer, we will have celebrated Rogation Services at Corsley's Orchard and Wild Flower Garden and at Manor Farm at Kingston Deverill. Rogation Sunday is one of the services that mark the agricultural year and is the day when the Church traditionally offers prayers for God's blessings on the fruits of the earth and the labours of those who produce our food.

The next 'special' service will be a Pet Service on Sunday 2nd June at 4 o'clock in Longbridge Deverill. This could be a 'fun' outing for you and your pets, we would love to see you there as we celebrate God's creation.

### **Crime statistics - latest quarterly figures**



Wiltshire has seen a drop of 3 per cent in the number of overall recorded crimes in the county, according to crime statistics out at end of April. Between January 2018 and CommunityPolicing December 2018, Wiltshire Police recorded 42,483 crimes overall – a decrease compared to the previous 12 months.

Burglaries and vehicle crime dropped by 25 per cent and 26 per cent respectively, while thefts from a person dropped by 15 per cent and thefts, in general, went down by 10 per cent. Angus Macpherson, Wiltshire and Swindon's Police and Crime Commissioner, welcomed the latest figures and said they showed Wiltshire was continuing to 'punch well above its weight' for a small, rural force and was working hard to deliver the best service possible within the funding awarded.

### **Nature Notes**

I am pleased to report that swallows have returned to the stables and house martins are back in the two artificial nests on the front of the house. We have actually added another house martin nest box hoping to increase the population (so far no takers). Swifts have returned; I first



heard and saw them when I went to Mere on the 8th May. The following evening walking round to the shop there were a good number of swifts flying very low over the river and watercress beds feeding on the insects. I love watching their amazing flying display and hearing their screams. In the summer months the skies would be very empty without these three birds; swift, swallow and house martin.

We have a good population of house sparrows. I know of six nesting sites, two in boxes. One nest is under the eaves (single storey height) near the back door of the garage, where I come out to feed the birds and I quite often catch one of the parents coming or going to the nest. They use the nearby roof of the greenhouse as a 'stepping stone' to come and go. The youngsters within must be getting quite near to fledging. I know that we had three sparrow nests in the honeysuckle by the patio, as I sadly found three dead chicks of varying sizes on the ground one morning. If it had been just the one dead chick I would have thought it had fallen out of the nest, but that number made me think that the nests had been predated. We have sparrow hawk, magpie, jackdaw and crow that come to the garden regularly all of which predate nests. My money would be on the sparrow hawk.



We still have a pair of mallards. I am pretty sure that the duck had laid a clutch of eggs and had started incubating them. I had seen them mating on numerous occasions and she would go off for a time and then return, then she went off and I thought she had left. But one evening she came back

looking for food, very hungry, had a good wash in the pond, preened and then flew off again with real purpose. This continued for several evenings and I was convinced that she was sitting on eggs. But yesterday the duck and drake were on the raft in the morning, the duck was very subdued. She wasn't interested in food and seemed depressed. I can't be sure but I think her nest had been predated and the eggs lost. Thankfully today she is brighter and is eating better and the drake has been with her.

The countryside is full of colour at this time of the year. The hedgerows are white with the hawthorn blossom and the verges are also white with cow parsley. There are bluebells in the wood along with white wild ramsons. Then the pink of red campion, and the yellow of the wild azalea, plus the mauve of the rhododendron. So many of these colourful plants have super perfume too. The trees also have gorgeous colour; the fresh new green of the beech is absolutely beautiful. A lot of the trees are 'in flower' at the moment; the beech tree at the front here is shedding 'bits' which, from my book, I can identify as the male flowers. When I went round to the shop this evening the forecourt of the garage was covered in willow seed blowing around and drifting so that it piled up in areas.

# **Salisbury Cathedral Organ Restoration Project**

The project to restore Salisbury Cathedral's magnificent Father Willis organ began in January and will take 14 months. It is 50 years since the organ last underwent a comprehensive restoration. The pipes will be cleaned, the mechanics, bellows and reservoir will be repaired. The work is being done by Harrison and Harrison, renowned organ builders and restorers from Durham who have cared for the Cathedral's organ since 1978.



Salisbury's Father Willis organ was built in 1877 and cost £3,500, a sum given by Miss Chafyn Grove of Zeals. It has just under 4,000 pipes, ranging in size from that of a matchstick to others standing 32ft high. The project will cost about £700,000. The Friends of Salisbury Cathedral have given a substantial grant towards project and the Cathedral received a grant of £82,300 from the Heritage Lottery Fund. The organ exhibition, *Pulling out the Stops,* in the north transept runs until November and explores the history of the organ including a virtual organ with stops visitors can play on a touch screen to recreate the unique sound of the Father Willis organ.


