

I am sitting writing this letter on the evening of Ash Wednesday which is the very beginning of Lent, when you could be reading it in the last weeks of March which is the end of Lent and almost Easter. So, what do I write about? I will content myself, and you I hope, with sticking to the subject of journey, which is after all what Lent is about. It is a journey of 40 days through Mothering Sunday, Palm Sunday and Holy Week eventually arriving at Easter Day.

It is traditional to 'give something up' for Lent in order to focus more effectively on matters of a spiritual nature. The trouble is with giving something up is often that 'thing' becomes the focus of our attention, whether it be chocolate, alcohol, or watching box sets on TV all in one go: because we can't have it 'it' looms large in our imagination, exerting an almost irresistible urge to give in to our desires. There is no doubt trying to do without something can alert us to how dependant we are on our particular fix, it is no bad thing but I prefer to approach Lent in a positive way by trying to set aside time to pray and reflect in a focused manner, it is not easy and I need the help of my old friend poetry do this. So I am reading Malcolm Guite's book 'Word in the Wilderness: A poem a day for Lent and Easter.' It is a wonderful book and it will be a good companion for my journey towards Easter.

Speaking of journeys, I promised to tell you more about my sabbatical journey. I am not going away but I will be spending chunks of time at Hilfield Friary, a Franciscan community deep in the Dorset countryside. If you are now envisaging a quiet, monastic place you couldn't be more wrong! It is a working farm and centre of ecological excellence attracting young and old to spend time in community as a guest to experience life there. All meals are taken around the huge table in the refectory where I have met people from all over the world; I think the last time I went for a few days I met some Franciscan brothers from Papua New Guinea, a man of the road who had stayed there for some time but now felt he had to go back to his former life, a few other clergy on retreat, some very elderly folk who had come as church group, and a couple of young people who were spending a year there. The brothers from Papua New Guinea asked me why I loved Hilfield so much and my answer explains why I want this place to be a focus for my sabbatical; it is the prayer. Undergirding and holding all that goes on at Hilfield is the daily round of prayer; morning begins with half an hour of silence, followed by Morning Prayer, Eucharist at noon, Evening Prayer, and Compline, the ancient office of Night Prayer at 9.00 pm after which silence is held until after breakfast the next day. There is such depth of prayer here, such a connection to the created order, it is a way of life that speaks volumes about what living lightly on this beautiful earth looks like, and how important it is to love and care for our neighbour. So I hope at the end of my sabbatical I will return refreshed and inspired with a deeper understanding of myself and my relationship with God, and what it means to serve these communities. Meantime, Lent is to be lived! Love and Prayers

Nature Notes

What a difference it makes when the sun comes out and we have a dry day! Walking back from the woods this evening it felt quite like spring. The days are getting longer and the flora and fauna are responding to this. The birds are beginning to sing and establish territories. We have a pair of blue tits showing interest in the nest box on the beech tree at the front of the



house. I am hearing blackbird, songthrush, robin, great tit, dunnock, blue tit, nuthatch, coal tit, chaffinch, greenfinch, and goldfinch on a regular basis. I thought I had heard siskin in the garden ("tzu" and "tsy-zing" calls) and today I spotted a male bird on the sunflower heart feeder. The male siskin is rather smart; olive green and yellow with a black cap and bib. The female has duller plumage but is still pretty.

The snowdrops are looking good and it is lovely to see them growing naturally in the banks and hedgerows. The red stems of the dogwood are particularly fetching at the moment especially when the sun catches them. The hazel catkins are also standing out and seem rather long this year. We went to Stourhead about ten days ago and Kingston Lacy earlier this week (both National Trust properties) and the snowdrops were super especially at Kingston Lacy. Coming back from Stourhead, over Mere Down, we spotted a different bird of prey. We think it was a female hen harrier. It was basically brown, about buzzard size but with a distinctive white band on the rump. I have been seeing a red kite more regularly. They are such expert flyers that wind poses no problem for them and it can be the only bird flying in bad weather.

We have three regular visitors to the fallen apples in the garden; a male green woodpecker, a fieldfare, and a squirrel. The woodpecker appears to be taking some of

apple pulp but is probably looking for maggots and grubs. The fieldfare has claimed the apples for itself and I have seen it chase other thrushes away. It tolerates the woodpecker and squirrel. Several times I have seen the squirrel carry an apple in its mouth, stopping a few times to rest and re-position the fruit. I don't know where it caches the apples, possibly in the hedge. One evening at dusk I disturbed a rare visitor to the apples; a roe deer.



I have been watching the pond for amphibians. I am not the only one! A few days ago we had a buzzard sitting in the cherry tree looking for movement. It was a lovely sunny morning but the pond was still frozen so the chances of any life were low. Still it spent the best part of an hour, moving from the cherry to the silver birch tree and then the summerhouse roof. It did seem to find something but I couldn't see what. We usually have an influx of toads when the weather warms up a little.

Most of the hedges are looking neat and tidy having been cut. A hedge nearby is being laid, a real work of art. It will make a good stock proof barrier when finished and be better for wildlife in the long run. Soon the hedgerows will be coming into life. It seems spring is taking a while to come this year. There are a few daffodils out and lots in bud, with all the rain the countryside is green but it will be nice to see more yellow.



We have continued to work with Longbridge Deverill Care Home, our first group of children this term, visited residents and joined in with some arts and craft activities. Everyone seems to really enjoy these visits and we continue to be so proud of the children who interact and speak to the residents confidently and so politely. These visits have now been planned on a monthly basis until the end of the school year!



Our youngest pupils in Potters class, visited Westbury, White Horse Pottery, which I recommend if you have yet to visit. They spoke to the Potter who explained some of the items he makes, showed them the kiln and demonstrated how he creates all sorts of things on his potter's wheel, the Beehive was fascinating. The most exciting thing for them was making their own faces out of clay.

I was delighted to be appointed as the Head Teacher this term too. We are all very much ready for our half term and staff are already planning next term's topic which includes Shakespeare Plays across all 4 classes.
