

Dear Friends.

I am writing this at the end of a beautiful day; when I walked the dogs there was the smell of spring in the air and I saw the brilliant yellow of daffodils for the first time. When you read this, spring will have truly sprung, although we might still be encased in snow such is the fickleness of English weather. However, the light is returning, bulbs are opening and the sunshine is gaining strength every day.

This month in the church we observe the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday when the sign of the cross in oil and ash is made on people's foreheads. Not many people come to the **Ash Wednesday service**, (6th March 6.00 pm in Longbridge Deverill church) which is a shame as it is a very thoughtful and moving occasion. In towns and cities churches quite regularly take the ash and oil out onto the streets and offer the ashing, as it is called, to passers by. I love that idea as I think the church needs to stop hiding itself away and get out where people are. It is not quite the same in villages though, there are not exactly loads of people wandering about and in the places people gather, like our pubs, it wouldn't go down well if I turned up with my oil and ashes. If you want to read a wonderful book telling the story of what happened when a church did 'get out there' read 'City of God' by Sara Miles; this is what the blurb says: City of God is a captivating account of venturing beyond the borders of



church. It tells the story of one day in Sara's ministry: Ash Wednesday, when she takes a bowl of ashes from her local church to public places including bus stops, bakeries, beauty shops, fast food joints, hospital waiting rooms and street corners. She invites strangers to receive the sign of the cross on their foreheads, and offers blessing to waitresses and drunks, mothers and babies, believers and doubters alike.

It would be wonderful if some of us read the book and got together to discuss it, in the pub or something; if anyone fancies doing that do get in touch with me.

Why is Ash Wednesday so important? Well because it reminds us that we are dust, in other words, one day we will die, that is what it means to be human and we are very bad at talking about that in our society. It reminds us being human involves getting things horribly wrong and now an again we need to acknowledge the reality of that. But mostly, above all else, it reminds us we are loved, we are loved, we are loved; the oil of healing is for all of us no matter who we are or what we have done

I finish with another quote about the book:

Where most aim for the clouds, Sara's focused on the dirt, sweat, blood and struggle of this world and the presence here in it with us – which is, of course, the best news of all.

Nature Notes

What glorious spring weather we are experiencing, only two weeks ago, there was a good thick blanket of snow everywhere! It could just as easily revert back to being very wintery as we are so early in the year. I hope not, as the spring flowers are looking absolutely beautiful.



It seems to be a very good year for snowdrops which are perfectly designed to withstand snowfall and were soon standing up proud despite being flattened. We have a carpet of light mauve crocuses which extend from the back of the rockery out onto the lawn; today in the sun they were fully open and looking particularly splendid. I also noticed today that we have our first daffodil out. I hope the winds stay away as I hate to see the daffodils knocked about.



We finally got around to checking and cleaning the nest boxes out. We had to leave checking the nest box on the silver birch tree as to do so would have meant treading on the carpet of crocuses. I am fairly sure last year the box was only used by bumble bees. Out of the other 9 boxes, 5 where used, 2 by

house sparrows and 3 by tits. I am tempted to put up a starling nest box as I have noticed some hanging about in the hedgerow at the top of the garden.

The pond is becoming quite active. A heron has been visiting daily, quite often several times a day and despite shooing it away it remains very persistent, we saw it catch one of the larger fish the other day. It is now not just coming for the fish; toads are arriving in the pond, coming to mate and spawn. I heard them croaking at dusk this week when I went to feed the fish. Last night with the torch I actually saw three. If the weather remains settled and relatively mild there will be loads in there. The toads attract the attention of other predators too, buzzards and tawny owl. We have had a pair of mallards recently, first time for ages (end of August last year according to my diary); they will be looking for the toad spawn, caviar for ducks!

The birds are beginning to sing well now. This morning I could hear blackbird, song thrush and mistle thrush singing together. We have a nuthatch and tree creeper and I heard siskin but only spotted one.



Both great spotted and green woodpeckers come to the garden daily. When we had the snow, I expected an influx of fieldfares and redwings to feast on fallen apples but we only had the odd one, so the apples remain should winter return. There are many goldfinches and watching them I have realised they are feisty; not a big finch but will chase house sparrow, chaffinch and even robin. No wonder they are on the increase.

When working in the garden at the end of January, clearing away some long grass and debris from around the base of the old cherry tree, I came upon a hibernating toad, it was well camouflaged and seconds before I had been using a trowel nearby! Moments later I came upon a hibernating newt, a couple of feet away. I covered both amphibians back up again, the toad with a broken terracotta flower pot as it was more exposed than the newt. I always try to watch out for amphibians because of the pond.

Lasting Power of Attorney - why should I make one?

Many know it is important to write a Will, but few consider making a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA). The Alzheimer's Society estimate by 2025



more than 1 million people in the UK will have dementia, currently 1 in 5 people over 85 already suffer from it. For those without an LPA handling their financial affairs, making medical or care decisions for them can become virtually impossible. An LPA is a legal document where you appoint trusted individuals, relatives, friends etc to make decisions on your behalf, known as 'Attorneys'. There are two different types of LPA: Property and Affairs This LPA will allow your Attorneys to help you manage your money, property and finances. They can pay your bills and transfer or invest your money for you. You can tailor the LPA to give as much or as little power as you like. Health and Welfare This LPA allows your Attorneys to make decisions about your

health and care which may include medical treatment you receive and where you live. If you are capable of making decisions yourself your wishes will be paramount and your Attorneys will be permitted to liaise with medical professionals etc. Nowadays care homes and medical professionals are asking if residents and patients have this type of LPA in place as many believe it is equally important as the Property and Affairs.

What will happen if I do not make an LPA and then lose mental capacity? If you do not have an LPA in place and later become mentally incapable your relatives must apply to the Court of Protection to obtain a Deputyship Order. This allows them to take control of your assets and finances, it is a lengthy, stressful and costly process and involves obtaining a medical report confirming loss of mental capacity which is hard to obtain. The Deputy role is onerous, Annual Accounts and Annual Bonds are legally required.

I do not want to give up managing my affairs yet, should I wait to make an LPA? Like writing a Will you need to have sufficient mental capacity to make an LPA. It does not mean you give up all your rights, your Attorneys must allow you to make decisions as long as you can. When they make a decision it must always be in your best interests. Strict rules prevent Attorneys mishandling your money. Carefully consider who you appoint as your Attorneys and whether they are capable of assisting you.
