Nature Notes

I am enjoying the beautiful autumn colours, appearing particularly good to me as I have had an enforced stay in hospital for the best part of 3 weeks. Some of you already know I am Bipolar, diagnosed in 2009, after a manic attack.



This episode, my second ever, was particularly high so I was whisked off for treatment. Back home now I am appreciating the countryside and wildlife around me even more. Last Sunday, 15th, we went to Stourhead to see the autumn colours before they were blown away by the oncoming Hurricane Ophelia. It was very busy but despite this a heron was fishing on the bottom lake quite close to the main path standing so still it looked artificial! On Monday Ophelia arrived and we got away with just strong gusty winds but a strange light and a red sun. The eerie red glow was due to a lot of dust in the atmosphere, sand from the Sahara and soot from forest fires in Spain and Portugal. Most birds kept flying to a bare minimum but a pair of red kites performed wonderful acrobatics twisting and turning, engaging and then tumbling down.

Yesterday, early afternoon, we had a handsome young (2 prong) roe buck in the garden. He was feasting on lush long grass near the apple trees where the lawn has not been cut to leave the fallen apples alone. I think he could see us moving in the house but felt safe enough to stay and feed for a good 10 minutes.

It is a very quiet time of year for bird sound. Blackbirds call first thing in the morning and are noisy at dusk when they are going to roost, robins are singing as they always do. Parties of long-tailed tits are noticeable as they are continually calling to each other as they move quickly through the trees and hedgerows looking for food. Pied wagtails frequent rooftops looking for food in amongst the tiles giving out a distinct shrill "chizzick" call. The pond is attracting grey wagtails.

Before being hospitalised we had just returned from a lovely holiday in North Wales, staying on a dairy farm which kept Montbeliarde cattle. I had forgotten how stunning the Snowdonian scenery is - breath-taking. Whilst there we did two railway trips; the Welsh Highland Railway between Caernarfon and Porthmadog (amazing) and the Snowdon Mountain Railway (tremendous feat of engineering completed in 1896 to take people to the top of Snowdon). At Porthmadog we spotted curlews on the shoreline. We spent two days at Plas Newydd, a National Trust property on the Isle of Anglesey. The first day the weather was good and we explored the extensive gardens and arboretum seeing lots of butterflies and bees. One plant stood out in attracting insects, verbena bonariensis, it was covered in bumble and honey bees, red admirals, small tortoiseshells and a painted lady butterfly. The second day we investigated the house, very interesting with an enormous Rex Whistler mural of a coastal scene. Going up to Snowdonia we stopped at Ynys-hir, a RSPB reserve, where we saw lots of dragonflies.

Recipe of the month - Pumpkin Pie



Ingredients

750g/1lb 10oz pumpkin or
butternut squash, peeled, deseeded, cut into chunks
350g sweet shortcrust pastry
plain flour, for dusting
140g caster sugar
½ tsp salt
½ tsp fresh grated nutmeg
1 tsp cinnamon
2 eggs beaten
25g butter melted
175ml milk

Method

1 tbsp icing sugar

Place the pumpkin in a large saucepan, cover with water and bring to the boil. Cover with a lid and simmer for 15 mins or until tender. Drain pumpkin; let cool.

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Roll out the pastry on a lightly floured surface and use it to line a 22cm loose-bottomed tart tin. Chill for 15 mins. Line the pastry with baking parchment and baking beans, then bake for 15 mins. Remove the beans and paper, and cook for a further 10 mins until the base is pale golden and biscuity. Remove from the oven and allow to cool slightly.

Increase oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Push the cooled pumpkin through a sieve into a large bowl. In a separate bowl, combine the sugar, salt, nutmeg and half the cinnamon. Mix in the beaten eggs, melted butter and milk, then add to the pumpkin purée and stir to combine. Pour into the tart shell and cook for 10 mins, then reduce the temperature to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Continue to bake for 35-40 mins until the filling has just set.

Leave to cool, then remove the pie from the tin. Mix the remaining cinnamon with the icing sugar and dust over the pie. Serve chilled.
