

Dear Friends,

Necessity dictates I write my letter for the Parish News early in August, which means I have no idea what will be headline news when you read it. The world continues to feel very unstable and a confusing place. Meantime, the seasons roll on, the sun rises, the moon waxes and wanes and some things, dogs having to be fed and walked, never change. The English weather, true to its reputation, is cold and wet and so I am sitting here with a hot water bottle having made myself a hot chocolate to try to warm up! And, September is the start of a new academic year.

However, many Septembers come and go and however many years it is since I had children at school, this month will always speak to me of new beginnings; new shoes, new school uniform, gloriously pristine, at least for a few days anyway. I had four children and it used to take me ages to get them and their accompanying lunches, homework bags, PE kit and everything else ready for school; I remember getting up at the unearthly hour of 5.30 am to manage it all. Now, my grandchildren are at school and my son is in charge of the proceedings; how quickly those years have passed. As Paul Simon put it so succinctly in his beautiful song *Leaves that are Green* 'time hurries on'. Sometimes time hurries on in such way we seem unable to actually inhabit our days in any meaningful way, nor appreciate our surroundings.

I have written about the glorious countryside around us many times but I cannot help but refer to it again as we approach autumn, my very favourite time of year. There is something so magical about the way in which the season unfolds and deepens as the weeks pass. Below is an excerpt from a poem by Siegfried Sassoon. It is written from the perspective of a soldier in the trenches of the First World War, who, in the midst of utter horror, is dreaming of autumn in England:

He sniffs the chilly air; (his dreaming starts), He's riding in a dusty Sussex lane, In quiet September; slowly night departs; he's a living soul, absolved from pain.

Beyond the brambled fences where he goes,

Are glimmering fields with harvest piled in sheaves,

And tree-tops dark against the stars grown pale;

Then, clear and shrill, a distant farm-cock crows; There's a wall of mist along the vale Where willows shake their watery-sounding leaves,

He gazes on it all, and scarce believes, That earth is telling its old peaceful tale; He thanks the blessed world that he was born.

There is such poignancy about Sassoon's reference to 'brambled fences' in the poem; the fences are part of his life in the trenches and are barbed wire pointers to hell, the brambled fences in the poem give way to 'glimmering fields' where 'the earth is telling its old peaceful tale'. We need to allow that peaceful tale to be told, and do all we can to make it a reality and thank the blessed world we were born.





Nature Notes

I was beginning to think summer had gone because it was colder and wetter; it was feeling so autumnal. But now in mid-August when the sun comes out it is still lovely and warm and hopefully we can look forward to at least another month of summer. I am pretty sure that the house martins delayed having their second brood due to the cold snap. I can hear cheeping coming from at least one of the two nests just outside the office window. The second brood of swallows flew from the stables at the end of July; there were 3 possibly 4. I thought the adult swallows had now moved on, with the weather being so poor, but this morning when I went up to have a look 2 birds flew out and I am fairly sure they were the adult pair. If they were to successfully mate they could just fit in a third brood.

The honeysuckle has fallen silent today so that indicates all the house sparrow nests have fledged. There will be no more for this year now. There was another house sparrow nest just under the utility roof but it sadly failed. I found a fledgling late one afternoon on the ground just below, which I managed to revive and put back



into the nest space (there were at least 2 more gaping beaks inside). The fledgling was not ready to leave the nest, I think it may have ventured further out of the roof space seeking an adult returning with food and fell down the drain pipe. I watched to see if the adults were still tending the nest but I didn't see any, although I could hear the youngsters cheeping still late into the evening. The following morning all was quiet. Whether the adults had just given up, which is unlikely, or more likely had become food for a sparrow hawk. However, I do know that particular nest had already raised 2 broods.

Even when it hasn't rained overnight the grass is still wet with the morning dew now. After a particularly heavy dew, I noticed a young great spotted woodpecker behaving oddly. Looking through the binoculars I realised it was bathing in the wet grass, wriggling around and splashing! In contrast when it was hot and sunny I spotted a group of house sparrows having a dust bath in the really dry patch under

the shrubbery. Quite often you can see birds sitting still in full sun with their wings spread out, blackbirds especially, they are anting; sitting on an ant nest so the ants crawl over them. It is thought the formic acid the ants spray helps to rid the bird of feather parasites.



We have had a young green woodpecker visiting with a parent; the youngster is recognisable as its plumage is pale and streaked. It is difficult to see if the adult is male or female unless you spot the red stripe the male has both sides in its moustache. I was sure we had a deer about as the odd rose was being eaten overnight. I have now spotted the culprit in the early morning several times; a doe with a youngster in tow. The youngster is not, so far, able to spring over the garden fence so waits outside sometimes a bit anxious to be separated from mum.

Recipe: Devonshire Scones Preparation time: about 15 minutes Ingredients: Makes about 20 scones

450g (1 lb) self-raising flour

75g (3 oz) butter, at room temperature 2 eggs

2 rounded teaspoons baking powder 50g (2 oz) caster sugar about 225 ml (8 fl oz) milk

Method: Lightly grease two baking trays. Pre-heat the oven to 220°C/425°F/Gas 7.

Measure flour and baking powder into a processor, add butter and process until a crumble, add sugar; or by hand rub butter into flour using fingertips until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs, stir in sugar. Beat eggs and make up to 300ml (1/2 pint) with milk, put 2 tablespoons of egg/milk aside for glazing. Gradually add egg/milk mixture to dry ingredients until a soft dough. The scones will rise better if the scone mixture is 'wet'. Turn the dough onto a lightly floured surface and flatten to a thickness of 1 - 2 cm ($\frac{1}{2} - \frac{3}{4}$ inch). Use a 5 cm (2 inch) fluted cutter to stamp out dough, push cutter straight down and lift straight out to ensure scones rise evenly and keep their shape. Gently push remaining dough together, re-roll and cut out more scones. Arrange on prepared baking trays and brush tops with reserved beaten egg/milk mixture. Bake for about 10-15 minutes or until well risen and golden. Cool on a wire rack, covered with a tea towel to keep them moist. Serve fresh, cut in half and spread generously with strawberry jam and top with a spoonful of thick cream.
