

Dear Friends - old and new!

But now another new journey is about to begin as I am licensed to the Cley Hill Benefice as Associate Priest on Thursday 5th September at 7.00 pm in St. Margaret's Church Corsley, working with the Rector Pauline. So I do feel that I have rather gone around in a circle, that I am completing a cycle but also beginning a new one, I am looking forward to reconnecting, to renewing relationships and making new ones over the years to come. In the grand scheme of things seven and a half years is not all that long and in God's economy it is but a twinkling of the eye, but much can change in that time and so I have some catching up to do. I look forward to meeting old friends and

making new and hope that many of you will be able to come to St. Margaret's on **Thursday 5th September** to share the beginning of this new ministry together, with me. I look forward to seeing you there.

temperatures and then unusually strong gales. It feels very autumnal to me at the moment. The breeding season is now over for most birds. They seem to have done well this year, we are seeing lots of young birds in the garden: blackbirds, robins, dunnocks, house sparrows, goldfinches, blue, great and long-tailed tits. The house sparrows appear to have bred very well with one nest still active. The swallows in the stable have produced a second brood of four or possibly five, which started flying about a week ago. Both compartments of the dual house martin nest box have well grown youngsters, being fed well by the parents; I have just heard a feed delivery now, the boxes are outside the window behind me. I don't think the swallows or house martins will have a third brood as it is getting late now. The swifts have already left our shores, there may be odd ones still around; such a quick turn around coming early May, finding a suitable breeding site, laying eggs, rearing young and leaving the beginning of August. Finding a nest site is not always easy with lots of old properties being done up and roof spaces blocked off. To help them, special bricks with all a swift requires to nest can be included in a building or boxes put up under the eaves.

The moorhen youngster is still with us and was joined by an adult, we assume one of its parents, on the 19th July. It has grown well and is as big as the adult if not bigger. It is more wary of me since the adult came on the scene which is a good thing. We have not seen any ducks since the end of July. The kingfisher has been visiting the pond quite regularly, often early in the morning. I am not sure if it has been successful at fishing; quite a few fish are quite big now though I have seen the fish spawning over the last couple of months so there could be some



We didn't see the mass exodus of toadlets/froglets we expected to have, probably due to the weather as it was rather hot and dry when they might have wanted to leave. I am not sure how many were left in the pond what with moorhens and ducks. Hopefully we did have some go and maybe they left under the cover of darkness on a damp night. On sunny days there have been lots of damselflies and a few dragonflies around the pond.

I have still not seen many butterflies. Most of the species I can count on one hand. There always seems to be more of the whites. I have seen red admiral, peacock and small tortoiseshell but just a few of each. I can remember a time when a buddleia bush would be covered in butterflies but now I struggle to find one. It is very sad. I did see another humming-bird hawkmoth on the 28th July, this time feeding on the phlox in the evening. I have yet to see a painted lady butterfly.

The berries on the old rowan tree in the garden are ripening now; it won't be long before the blackbirds strip it bare! In the hedgerows the berries of the hawthorn are turning colour too, blackberries are ripening and all too soon summer will be over.

God's World, Our Business

Over the summer I have read two important reports. The first was a report by the Food, Farming and Countryside Commission set up by the RSA. The executive summary of the report starts 'Our future depends on the land. The land nourishes and supports us. It provides for our nutrition, our health and our wellbeing. Food and farming depend critically on the fate of the countryside. Those who live and work here are the stewards of this relationship but the responsibility for it rests with us all.'

The report highlights the urgency for us to recover and regenerate nature; and to restore health and wellbeing to both people and planet. Decades of policy to produce ever cheaper food has created perverse and detrimental consequences. The UK has the third cheapest food amongst developed countries, but the highest food insecurity in Europe. It calls for radical change, the development of sustainable systems, an investment in skills and rural infrastructure.

The second report 'Counting lives' comes from the Children's Society. It highlights the exploitation of children for criminal gain, particularly through the 'county lines' model of distributing drugs around the country through the use of dedicated mobile phone 'lines' and calls for statutory agencies to have access to appropriate resources to identify and support victims. There are some children particularly vulnerable to exploitation particularly those growing up in poverty, having learning difficulties, being excluded from school or a looked after child and there is increasing evidence that primary school age children are targeted.

All these issues are not just words on paper, but our issues, involving people in Wiltshire and Dorset. They involve God's world and God's children, and force us to look at ourselves and our churches to see what we can do. Both reports are shocking in their own way, they call for us to look outwards, to see with eyes of faith what is happening in our towns and villages, our countryside and farms, our economy and social provision and to speak and act.



I hope that as a diocese we can partner with others in taking forward some of the recommendations of these reports and contribute towards a better world and that as individuals and churches we continue to think about life around us and respond as we are called to do. Acting with care and compassion and speaking up for justice, equity and those whose voices are seldom heard.




