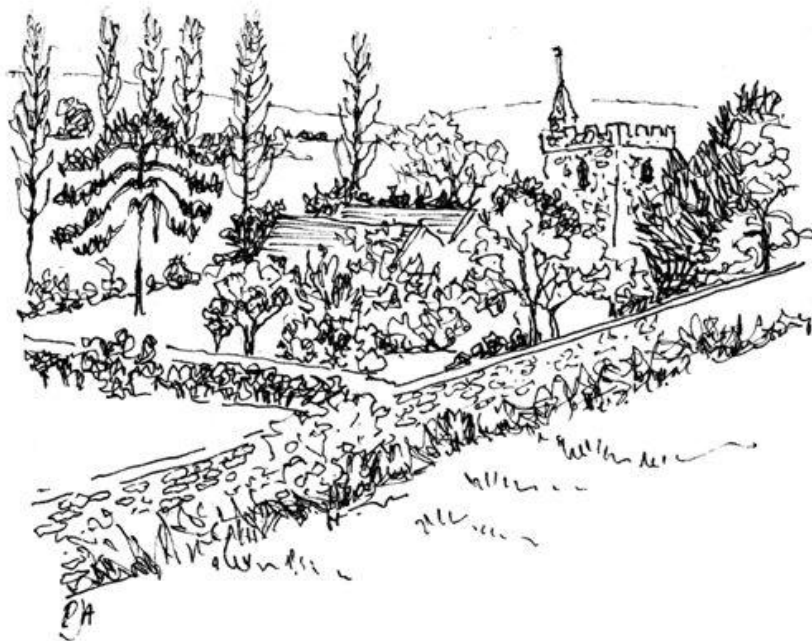

*Dear Friends,*

The last few weeks have been unremittingly dry with dire warnings of drought; it has been lovely for those of us who share our lives with furry companions, as there has been a lull in the business of washing paws and clearing up muddy imprints all over the floor and often the walls too. Today the tide has turned and the rain is pouring down, so back to bedraggled fur and soggy towels. Wanting to do the best for my erstwhile companions I recently purchased two towelling coats to help with the drying process; it was Betty's birthday earlier in the month so she had a magenta pink one, and Alf, of course had to have one too, a smart red one.

We all want to do the best we can to look after those we love and most of us also want what is best for our local community; we work hard to try to provide the best possible environment for our children and grandchildren to grow up, at the other end of the spectrum, care and wellbeing of elderly and frail family members.

On **Thursday 8th June** we will have to make a decision about which political party we think will best lead our country and that decision will of course be influenced by our own context, our own needs, and our own place in wider society. It hardly needs saying that desire to promote that which is best for our own needs should not be the only driver in the decision making process.



I don't think General Elections feature in the biblical canon, but we can learn much from looking at how those ancient peoples organised themselves as a community. The ancient Israelites were fiercely tribal; they had a profound sense of self-identity as the people of God and it was a heinous crime to take a wife outside their community. Their lives were often short and brutal with much fighting and bloodshed. And yet, running through the biblical stories is the golden thread of justice, and not, extraordinarily, just for members of their own tribe. Again and again God exhorts them to look after the stranger and the alien, the widow and the impoverished, the poor and the destitute.

Mahatma Gandhi said: "A nation's greatness is measured by how it treats its weakest members." And I seem to remember Jesus saying a thing or two about loving our neighbour and caring for those less fortunate than ourselves. So when we come to vote on 8th June let us have the courage to look beyond our own narrow self interest and think about the needs of those who struggle in our society.

I leave you with a quote from a prayer attributed to St Francis of Assis: "Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace. Where there is hatred let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy."

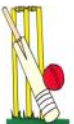

Update from Openreach regarding Super-fast broadband implementation in Crockerton “We were on site 7th May in the hope that we could clear the blockages in our duct to enable us to feed the fibre for the Superfast broadband cabinet, unfortunately we identified blockages either side of the roundabout and were unable to clear them, we would need civils/traffic management to clear the blockages and once clear there would be no guarantee there would be no further duct blockages in between the ones we have located which would cause further delay. The alternative solution from the above is bypass the blockages with new duct, we are currently planning this complex solution.” The Parish Council will continue to pursue the matter.

## Recipe: Vanilla ice cream

This easy recipe for creamy vanilla ice cream doesn't require an ice cream maker. Preparation time over 2 hours. Cooking time less than 10 minutes Serves 4



### Ingredients

- 2 vanilla pods
- 500ml/16fl oz double cream (see tip)
- 70g/3oz sugar
- 3 egg yolks

### Method

1. Halve the vanilla pods lengthways and scrape out the seeds.
2. Add the pods to the cream and bring to the boil, then add the sugar and stir until the sugar has dissolved.
3. Meanwhile, whisk the egg yolks in a large bowl then slowly whisk in the hot cream mixture.
4. Pour the mixture through a fine sieve into another bowl and whisk in the vanilla seeds.
5. Pour the mixture into a freezer-proof container and freeze for 2-3 hours, or until set.

**Recipe Tip:** Due to the absence of milk in this recipe, the ice cream does not crystallise in the freezer bowl. So there is no need to stir it. This is ideal for anyone without an ice cream maker.

### Security advice

SPRING IS HERE... As the warmer weather starts to appear it is tempting to throw open the windows and leave doors ajar to allow for the fresh air to flow through, BUT, this is often an open invitation to opportunistic burglars. Please do be mindful about keeping windows closed, many modern windows allow you to lock them whilst slightly ajar and I would urge you to do this if you have the capability to do so. Even if you are only in the back garden hanging out the washing or mowing the lawn, please ensure that your front door remains locked. Don't give these opportunists any excuse to try their luck at your property.



## Nature Notes

'Our' house martins returned on the 8th May; a month after the swallows. I think they may well have found one of the compartments of the man-made dual nest box at the front of the house being used by a house sparrow, as there were some rather noisy disputes going on for a day or two. But things have settled and there is one pair of house martins now in residence. We had them looking at the back of the house, they have done this before but not actually built anything. Now that we have had some rain they will have more chance of finding some mud to construct a nest. April was unseasonably dry with hardly any of its showers. This last month has also seen great fluctuations of temperature between night and day with some very sharp frosts. In our garden quite a few hardy plants had their soft new growth tickled; among those affected were laburnum, lily of the valley, buddleia, hebe and wisteria. Spring sown crops have been suffering from lack of moisture with very poor germination and some may have to be written off.



The ground has dried out so much that great cracks have appeared in places, animals and birds that need to dig for their food have been finding it difficult. Blackbirds for instance have struggled to find enough worms or grubs, and for a time I was putting out mealworms to help them feed their hungry youngsters. We had some badger damage to a border, I wondered why until I realised there was a bumble bee nest there. The soil was easy to dig and the prize of honey was too much temptation for the badger. Luckily we managed to make the garden badger-proof and the plants that it had dug up thankfully survived.



Swifts have also returned; I first saw them in town on the 5th May. They are masters of the air spending nearly all of their life on the wing, only touching down to lay and incubate eggs. I heard a cuckoo on the 7th May in Southleigh Woods, but I know it was heard several weeks before. I have had some lovely woodland walks recently in Southleigh and on Bidcombe. The bluebells have been gorgeous, a real sea of blue, giving a wonderful smell on a warm still day. On Bidcombe the bluebells compete with wild ramsons, the smell of garlic is almost overpowering; great rafts of blue and white. In Southleigh Woods I discovered an area of lily of the valley, it is a woodland plant but I can't remember finding it growing wild before. The woods around Shearwater have the lovely sweet scented yellow azalea together with mauve rhododendron. This time of the year is so full of colour and scent.

Several bird boxes in the garden are in use; we have a pair of blue tits on the silver birch and another pair on the stables, a pair of great tits are in the box on the beech tree. All three pairs are busy feeding their young now who will soon be ready to fledge as will the three families of house sparrows. Lots of activity with more to come.
