Residents were very generous filling the donation bucket with £772, once costs were deducted £308 remained to go towards our defibrillator fund. We would like to thank the Village Committee and partners for organising and the residents of Crockerton who make this village such a wonderful place to live. Planning has started for next year's party which we hope to tie in with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

Get out of the car! - Tranquillity and Darkness in the Deverills



It was a typical Friday night in October and I was driving to Tisbury to meet my daughter and a friend off the London train. As I drove I was listening to music on Radio Wiltshire; between tracks the programme host mentioned something about the International Space Station

being visible that evening in South Wiltshire at 9.25pm. I met my passengers and as we drove home we turned on to the Hindon Road for the descent into Monkton Deverill, I glanced at the dashboard; it was 9.24!

I braked suddenly and pulled the car on to the verge. "Get out of the car!" I shouted. "Just get out of the car and look west!". The girls clearly thought I was mad or that the car was about to explode. I turned off the lights and, together, we looked west towards Mere and Wincanton. It was dark, very dark, the only visible lights were the red lights of the Mendip transmitter in the distance beyond Little Knoll. Then we saw it. Coming towards us in a low orbit was the International Space Station together with the Shuttle with which it was about to dock. So dark was the sky both were clearly visible; so low was the orbit that they moved fast across the sky above us. We were all impressed by a sight we will never forget; not only the combination of the Space Station and Shuttle but also by the glory of the Wiltshire dark sky.

The Cranborne Chase AONB was designated an International Dark Sky Reserve in October 2019, hence residents of the Deverills are urged to embrace and enjoy the darkness. This can be a novel and even scary experience for new residents and visitors. We had relations to stay from London and they were almost traumatised by the silence of the night and the darkness. One confessed the bedroom was so dark she had to sleep with a side-light, the darkness was too scary. The contrast between Hackney and Monkton Deverill was too stark. She missed slamming taxi doors and the noisy pub next door.

During this wonderful summer we have often, with friends and neighbours, walked on the hills as late as 10.00 pm, and relished the darkness, stars and the silence but both are threatened. Cotley Hill roundabout, west of Heytesbury constructed in 1986 as part of the Heytesbury by-pass, at a stroke destroyed the dark skies of Heytesbury, Sutton Veny and Norton Bavant. To this day, there is an ugly glow from the roundabout lights which is at odds with the beauty of Cotley Hill, Scratchbury Hill and Middle Hill. In short, inappropriate lighting should be viewed as environmental pollution. We all have the privilege of living in a Dark Skies Reserve where silence and darkness are valued and preserved. So get out of the car, relish the darkness and listen to the silence!

Nature Notes

It happens every year; I suddenly realise the house martins and swallows have gone, the house and garden are quieter and the skies are empty; I had seen flocking together on the wires. It doesn't seem long ago they



arrived. As they go other birds will arrive for the winter, redwings and field-fares should be here in about a month.

We had a redstart in the garden coming to the feeders, a first for us. It is very robin-like but more orangery-red all over. It will be migrating south for the winter having come to breed here in summer. They like to nest in ancient oak woodlands. Another bird I have seen recently, also migrating south for the winter, is the wheatear; a very smart erect looking bird. I have seen them in the fields, not in the garden, as they are an open country species.

The moorhen has taken up residence in the pond and is constantly on the move feeding. On warm sunny days there are dragonflies, it takes notice of them but they are too quick for it. The kingfisher has started visiting the pond again. We had not seen it for a long time and I had not spotted any on the river either but thankfully I am seeing and hearing them regularly again. A little egret made a brief visit but I chased it off just before it tried to spear a fish.

I am still seeing a lovely lot of butterflies. There are more red admirals now with small tortoiseshells and whites; but I haven't seen any peacocks. The buddleia by the side of the house is well in bloom and attracting a lot of insects. I spotted a humming bird hawkmoth on it one day. This morning at the top of the garden, I heard a really loud hum coming from the hedgerow and realised it was the ivy flowers attracting lots of bees and other insects. Ivy is a really important source of food especially as it flowers late in the season. It is also a good place for insects to hibernate. At the moment there are lots of crane flies around, daddy-long-legs.



The hedgerows are changing colour as berries in them ripen, lots of red hawthorn berries which the redwings and fieldfares will enjoy when they arrive. The blackberries and sloes look good too. The beech tree in front of the house is shedding nuts, the ground is covered in them; they are crunchy to walk on.

There are berries in the garden ripening; the pyracantha is laden with fruit and the cotoneaster too, all food for the wildlife during the winter.

The light goes quickly in the evenings now. On a few late evening walks I have seen a kestrel hunting, a roe doe with two well grown fawns feeding on the brow of the hill and a fox coming out to hunt. I quite often hear tawny owls hooting and a heron calling on my return. The heron can sound quite close and as they hunt at night I fear for the fish
