## Dear Friends



The life of a vicar in the time from late August until Christmas is a busy one with lots of remembering. I imagine in this period of flux and change, of worry about rising food and fuel prices and the possibility of shortages of day to day goods, most of us are a bit twitchy. Then there are warnings about a serious Flu epidemic and uncertainty of how the Covid infection will behave when we spend more time indoors this winter. We may look back and remember with nostalgia those halcyon days when we didn't have to worry about such things.

It is at times of change and uncertainty I really appreciate the seasons and festivals of the Church which come around every year, providing a framework to hold the worries and uncertainties which are part of our lives at the moment. Every year we give thanks to God for all the good things we enjoy at Harvest. We remember those with whom we have shared love at All Souls, those who give, and continue to give, their lives in the service of their country on Remembrance Sunday. In a few weeks time it will be my favourite season of the Church's year, Advent, when we look back to the great prophets who spoke of a future that for most of them was centuries in its fulfilment. At Christmas we look back at the moment, 2000 years ago, when God chose to be born as a vulnerable baby to share the vulnerability and uncertainty of what it means to be human.

Some may ask what the point is in looking back, remembering events we cannot change: *Footfalls echo in the memory/Down the passage which we did not take/towards the door we never opened. (T.S. Elliot)*. Often, it's when we remember and reflect we discern patterns and meaning in the maelstrom of daily life, that elude us. I have found a lovely description of this, Susan Philips writes: *The Christian faith is familiar to me, the Bible my daily bread, and I have witnessed diverse manifestations of God's grace in human life, I lean towards the flutter of the numinous, and I am filled with wonder when I see it, however briefly and incompletely.*

This image of *the flutter of the numinous* is an extraordinary one; like coming upon the delicate beauty of a butterfly. Sometimes we glimpse something of God and recognise it instantly, but often it is only when we allow ourselves the time and space to reflect and remember, that those glimpses are able to seep into our souls to colour and ultimately transform our view of the world. Every single human being on this earth is made in the image of God and as such holds within themselves a spark of the divine. Every single human being is passionately loved by God who comes to each of us in a myriad of different ways.

So as we immerse ourselves in these weeks of remembering, when we struggle to find meaning and purpose in these challenging times, I hope you can find the space to look back and wonder at the mystery of it all, and I pray you too might recognise the flutter of the numinous in the story of your life.

## Upper Deverills Village Hall Sign

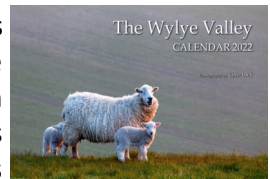

## Nature Notes

I have been noticing how quiet the countryside is at the moment. I am sure a lot of it is because we have had such beautiful still autumnal days. There are birds calling; buzzards, ravens and other corvids, green woodpecker and the robin, which never stops whatever the season. I have heard the occasional burst of song from chiffchaff, nuthatch and blue and great tit. The long-tailed tits are around in their family groups flying and continually calling to each other to keep contact. The bird feeders are very quiet, though today I saw a few more birds on them and they have left their 'calling card'! I have listened out for the seeping call of redwing; I am not convinced I have heard it so far, I might have just caught one this evening and I have it on good authority they are about now and have been spotted in the village. I find the best time to hear them is just after dark. The fieldfares will follow a little bit later.

There is certainly a lot of food in the hedgerows for the wintering thrushes this year. The hawthorn berries in the field nearby seem bigger than usual, the top hedgerow there is especially good and colourful with spindle dotted in amongst hawthorn with field maple and crab apple. Spindle fruit looks exotic with orange and pink colouration, almost plastic-like or from a sweet shop.

We have lost the moorhen, it went around the end of September. We had some good advice on the pond and so I have started removing the invasive weed. We were looking at old photos and it made us realise how much this weed had grown. I am being as gentle as I can not to disturb the wildlife and goldfish. I use a rake to drag the weed across to the side and then remove it in small amounts, letting it drain over the pond. I leave all the weed I have removed on the side of the pond for two days or more to dry, then it is lighter and easier to handle, but also so anything in the weed I have taken out can find its way back into the pond. It's going to be a long job; think I have done it six times so far and there is still loads in there. It literally is like one big mat with the fronds all interwoven, I don't know how the fish have been managing to swim around. I am creating more clear water and they seem to be enjoying the space and freedom; I have to watch out for them when removing the weed as some are inquisitive and come to investigate. Dragonflies also come so I have to be careful not to step on them or put weed on top of them.



We had a jay in the garden recently; we often get one at this time of the year. They bury acorns in the autumn and we have a young sapling by saddle stones where the jay tends to frequent. They are wary birds tending to keep to deep in woodland. I have noticed wagtails, grey and pied, and seen the grey coming down to the pond looking for food and the pied feeding on roofs.
