Dear Friends,

I write on a glorious day of bright sunshine, the snowdrops are out and the daffodils are not far behind. We are almost in Lent with Ash Wednesday on the 2nd March. We live such frantic lives, even if you do not subscribe to the Christian faith, the six weeks of Lent are an opportunity to take stock; slow down a little and appreciate the good things in our lives. To be aware of the natural world unfolding into spring, to consciously identify moments of joy which come unexpectedly and to help facilitate those moments for others.



We have not been able to have a proper Lent course for two years so I am thrilled Rev Marian has agreed to run our course this year, which you are warmly invited to join. The **Cley Hill Lent Course** will meet at Marian and Ian's home, Short Street Farm, 160 Short Street, Chapmanslade, BA13 4AA, there will also be a zoom link for those who prefer to join from their home. **The five meetings will be on: Wednesdays 9th, 16th, 23rd, 30th March & 6th April at 10.30 am.** Each week is self-contained so missing one is not a problem. After two strange and challenging years, it feels good to use this opportunity to root ourselves into our scriptures, to reflect on how God's people in the past found their faith informed and guided them on their journeys, and what our faith means to us in our changing and uncertain times. We will be following a York Course called **The Psalms - Prayers for Today's Church**. The ancient poems we call Psalms are over 2000 years old. They were written in very different times from our own but have stood the test of time for they address many of the problems we still face: violence, injustice, anger and bewilderment. There are many resources online, if undertaking a course with other people is not for you, if you Google 'The Big Church Read' to find suggestions for Lent reading and links to corresponding videos for some of the books. I am going to read Rachel Newham's book '**And Yet: Finding Joy in Lament**'. In the depths of depression Rachel never thought she would find herself writing a book on joy. Yet, if her journey with mental health has taught her anything, it is that lasting joy can only be experienced when we allow ourselves to enter into lament and be honest about our pain before God. Lament seems important in these difficult times so I am looking forward to immersing myself in the book and videos. Whatever you choose to do during Lent I pray you may be able to experience something of God's love in these coming weeks.

Church Electoral Roll

Under Church of England rules, we are required to update the Electoral Roll. If you have not already registered and wish to add your name to the Roll it will be necessary to complete a new application form. This is in order to prepare the Roll for the **Annual Parochial Church Meeting on Sunday 24th April**, which will take place after Evensong in Longbridge Deverill Church. The Electoral Roll is the formal list of members of the Church who are entitled to vote at the Annual Meeting. There are eligibility requirements but most baptised worshippers over the age of 16 will be eligible. It is important everyone who is eligible joins the Roll in order that the membership is truly representative of the Parish. It is also helpful to the clergy to keep in touch with church members and to offer appropriate pastoral care. Application forms will be available in the churches after Sunday 13th March or from the Electoral Roll Officer, Diana Abbott 840763 or decabbott@gmail.com. **Please return the forms before the closing date of Sunday 10th April to Diana at 29 The Marsh, Longbridge Deverill, BA12 7EA or to a Church Warden.**







Bishop Andrew's monthly letter

Earlier this week I was asked by a group of Year 7 pupils what church was 'for' and what it was 'like'. I responded that church was 'a rehearsal space for the kingdom of heaven', following this somewhat baffling description by explaining how my favourite part of secondary school was the annual school play: the thrill of belonging to a cast and working together for a final production. The plays and musicals (Bugsy Malone my first, I recall) were like a heightened version of everyday life and rehearsing them took much commitment, collaboration, and hilarity.

Church does seem to me almost like that: the place where we enact the drama of salvation, learning the words and ways that help us to know and play our part in the Christian story. The congregation is not the audience but invited into the cast – just as Jesus called disciples not simply to watch and appreciate him, but to 'go and do likewise'.

Lent is offered as a time of intensive practice for Christ's coming Kingdom: a season for adopting, or deepening, the habits of faith and learning our role as Christians before a watching world. These weeks, culminating in the dramatic events of Passiontide and Easter, ask a great deal from us, but are eternally rewarding. See you at rehearsals!

History of The Alms House Clock

Many will have noticed that the Clock on the Alms House in Longbridge Deverill has recently been completely refurbished and now graces the building in all its former glory.



The Clock was made in 1857 by John Moore & Sons of Clerkenwell, London, who were considered one of the best makers at that time. In a letter to the Steward of the Alms House Trustees, dated January 1873, the Revd WD Morrice, Vicar of Longbridge Deverill, wrote: "As you are aware the Clock on the Almshouse at Longbridge Deverill was given by my mother as a memorial of some pleasant visits to the Vicarage, and permission was given by the Trustees to place it where it now is, as the most prominent and convenient position to be found." He also said "... in the course of 13 years it has only required cleaning twice, and that was more as a precaution than as a necessity." In another letter dated 1884, Revd Morrice also wrote: "It has occurred to me whether the clock, having now been up a quarter of a century, it would be well to have the woodwork and works overhauled to see whether they are in good order." This seems to confirm that the clock was originally placed on the Almshouse around 1860.

We are planning a series of wildlife talks in the Village Hall, the first one 'Glimpses of Animal Behaviour', will be given by Simon and Mandy Martyn. In April and May we will walk a number of routes in the valley and on the downs to find and record key species in a study designed by Peter Marsh. We are beginning to plan our first habitat project, in which we seek to provide a haven for mammals, birds and insects in Kingston churchyard while taking great care to maintain the beauty, solemnity and tranquillity of this sacred place.

Nature Notes

It is lovely to see the garden starting to come to life, we have snowdrops, crocuses, pulmonaria and cyclamen out. The early mauve crocuses are a picture, especially on sunny days, on the rockery and spilling down into the lawn where they show up better in the grass. I liken their movement from the rockery to a lava flow from a volcano. I love it when plants do their own thing and the result is so much better than I could achieve. We have more snowdrops in the garden this year thanks to a donation from a kind neighbour. I can see lots of daffodils coming up which appear to have a good number of buds, hopefully the weather will be kind when they are in flower and not bash them around.



I have tried to get out in the garden as much as possible in an attempt to get it under control before the sudden spring growth. When I am pottering invariably I have a robin near me singing, providing music while I work, and as soon as I leave the area the robin is down on the ground looking to see what I have disturbed. The other day I also had male great tit singing loudly

close by. The call is repetitive, 'teecher-teecher-teecher', and I must confess I did ask him to give it a rest after a time! I have also noticed when I have been outside a lot of raven activity, vocalisation and, one day, several circling high above me. Other corvids also seem to be more noticeable, I expect this is because they all nest early in the year and are pairing up. The male blackbirds are singing in the evening now, a gorgeous sound taking me back to childhood when I would fall asleep to the blackbird song and a hand lawnmower; just as good as a lullaby.

We have a pair of moorhens, who arrive mid-morning and stay to late afternoon. We are in two minds if we want them to breed here again; they are great entertainment but I think their guano contributed to the growth of the pondweed but their presence may deter mallards and little egrets.

A sparrowhawk visits the garden regularly. I don't often see it but hear all the alarm calls of the other birds. It came today; I looked out at the feeders and it was on the ground below with something in its talons. A month ago there was a spectacular sparrowhawk ambush. I just happened to look out and saw a flurry of white feathers falling down around this sparrowhawk which was sitting on a fairly large bird that was obviously still alive. The hawk was in a classic mantle position using its wings to guard the prey, it needed to, because a buzzard was lurking in the nearby cherry tree and a pair of magpies were hanging around hoping for something. The sparrowhawk shot off with the prey at a low level pursued by the buzzard and magpies. I think the victim was a poor collared dove looking later at the leftover feathers.
