Dear Friends,

When you read this you may have been lucky enough to hear the song of the cuckoo, a sound announcing spring has truly sprung. Once again the miracle of new life unfolds and little green shoots push their way through the soil.



Biblical writers were aware of the precious beauty of the natural world but they also had great respect for it as well. Life for these nomadic people was hard and food, water and security were understood to be gifts to be treasured; there was no illusion or indeed expectation life would be easy or human beings had everything under control.

We live in uncertain times when peace and stability seem to be slipping away and we fear for the future, both in terms of the environment disaster we can no longer ignore, and in which volatile leaders make decisions that have far reaching consequences for the whole world order. Most of the time we can push thoughts of our own human vulnerability under the carpet comforting ourselves we are in the 21st century and are more sophisticated than those biblical men and women, we have progressed and are completely in control of our own destinies. Now and then a catastrophic event or series of events jolts us out of this complacent arrogant assumption and I think the context we are in today is such a time.

Our perspective on life is different to our predecessors, we live in a different age, and unlike them our news channels supply us with graphic images of the human suffering of people thousands of miles away 24 hours a day on a relentless roll of grief and loss; there is something awful about sitting watching all this in the comfort of one's own sitting room.

So I give I thanks I live in this beautiful and peaceful place, I want to acknowledge I lead an astonishingly privileged life; I feel helpless in the face of the suffering I see in Ukraine and many other places of conflict or famine in our world. I may be repeating what I said last month, but I think we need to hear it again. I feel unnerved by world events, by so much avoidable suffering, but I also want to point to the Christian understanding of hope; however dark the world seems, and however impossible it looks new life will ever appear, love will prevail in the end, God is in there somewhere. St Francis of Assisi encapsulated everything I have been trying to say with these words: ***'All the darkness in the world cannot extinguish the light of one single candle.'***



Many of you will have seen me walking and taking services with the aid of a stick. I have a chronic back problem resulting in a lot of pain, and in the same area, a tendon that is basically useless. I was advised by my physiotherapist to use a stick for support. On good days I can function as normal, on bad days I really am in a lot of pain and cannot sit or stand for any length of time. My back also affects my ability to sleep which makes it even harder to deal with the pain. I take medication which helps slightly. I know when I have stood to take a service, I will be in pain afterwards, sitting with a hot water bottle on my back when I get home helps my muscles relax. I am learning to manage the situation with the help of meditation, walking when I can, and I see an osteopath once a month if not more. I am explaining all this in the hope that when I must leave a meeting because of sitting too long, or don't come to a social function because standing too long is agonising, you will understand why. As I said, I am learning to manage the pain and pace myself when it is not too bad. I still enjoy my work but now and then, I have to slow down, and things take longer than they might. Rt Revd Karen Gorham, acting Bishop of Salisbury

How many of us like to be kept waiting? I admit my feet start tapping when I end up in the longest queue in the supermarket, or sigh when traffic lights seem to change to red when I arrive. We are so used to getting everything now that delay makes us frustrated.



May 2022 will be a month of waiting. Firstly we wait for our new Bishop to be enthroned; having been elected and consecrated, Bishop Stephen will join us fully in June. Secondly, following the Easter season in our lectionary readings, we join the disciples as they wait for the coming of God's Spirit at Pentecost. So, it is good for us to reflect this month on how in God's rhythms (and not ours), waiting and prayer are used for preparation.

Whilst I have enjoyed my time as acting diocesan Bishop, it has been hard work juggling two roles and I look forward to handing over the diocesan reins. Pentecost is a timely reminder we do everything in the Lord's strength, without God's resources, we can do very little. The disciples were called to prepare, to wait together, patiently, expectantly and prayerfully. Please join me this month in praying for our new life together as a diocese, so we may be open to God's Spirit in the same way as the disciples were. A favourite prayer of mine from the Iona Community goes like this: 'You keep us waiting. 'You, the God of all time, want us to wait for the right time in which to discover who we are, where we must go, who will be with us and what we must do. So thank you...for the waiting time.'

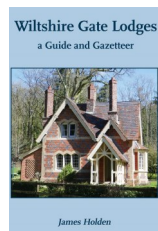

A welcome return of The Annual Parish Meeting of the Electorate took place on 4th April, the Chairman to the Council, Cllr Caroline Sawyer, gave her annual and financial report and the following organisations gave presentations: -

- Longbridge Deverill Flower Show: work is under way for this year's show to be held on **Saturday 13th August**, various fundraising events will lead up to it, including a car boot sale and race night.
- Crockerton Primary School: active inside and outside the classroom with dance, painting, visits, and planning the Queen's Platinum Jubilee events. They welcome volunteers to listen to children reading.
- Longbridge Deverill Parish Hall: has been redecorated, has a modular stage and Wi-Fi; its usage has increased with fitness classes, social and fundraising events, children's parties and other events to partake in.
- Deverills Cricket Club: has a mix of ages from 13 years upwards, they play friendly games through the summer and welcome all abilities. They are keen to keep the club going and playing.

Cllr Sawyer awarded grants to the following organisations: -

- Deverills & Crockerton Parish News: it is delivered to all households in the Parish, providing a 'comfy blanket' and important communication tool. Financially supported by residents contributions and donations and grants from two Parish Councils and other organisations.
- Crockerton Village Committee: organise many social events, Easter Egg Hunt, with Mr & Mrs Bunny and Easter Chick, Quiz nights (via Zoom during lockdowns), Street parties, bulb planting and pays for and maintains the two defibrillators in Crockerton.

All organisations appreciate all the support they receive and welcome new members and volunteers.

Analogue Phone Switch-off paused



BT has delayed the rollout of *Digital Voice* – their new home phone service that is delivered solely over the broadband network. They had planned to switch off the analogue network in December 2025. They now say that they “underestimated the disruptive impact the upgrade would have on some of our customers. With hindsight, we went too early. We recognise that we have more work to do on getting back-up solutions in place when things disrupt the service like storms and power cuts. We got this part of the programme wrong and we are sorry”. The Parish Council has been calling for such a re-think for some time and we are glad this has happened. However, BT were trialling the system in two places, one was Salisbury which included customers in Brixton Deverill, who have already been switched over. We have asked for clarity on their situation in view of the pause in the programme, particularly in the event of a power cut. We are also pressing central, local government and providers for a workable mobile network, which this development will call for.

20mph speed and weight limits

The Parish Council has been pressing ahead with work on 20 mph speed limits and the implementation of a weight limit on the valley’s roads. Councillors will be updated at the next meeting on Wednesday 11th May with the latest progression of the situation.

Annual Meeting of the Parish - Wednesday 20th April

More than 30 residents attended the meeting in the Village Hall on Wednesday 20th April. After a resumé of the Parish Council’s activities and successes in the last two years, a brief summary of the Parish Plan was given and the AGM of the Village Hall Committee was held, this was important because it led neatly into a discussion on Community Facilities in the Upper Deverills. There was a useful exchange of views regarding recreational resources in the villages followed by debate on the future function and look of the Village Hall. The Parochial Church Council was also invited to outline their vision for the churches in Brixton and Kingston regarding their development as community amenities.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on **Wednesday 11th May** at 7.00 pm in Upper Deverills Village Hall. This will include the Annual Meeting at which a new Chair will be elected. Everyone is welcome.

Bird Surveys



Last month we advised that surveys of Yellowhammer, Corn Bunting and Skylark would be starting in April. The first of these will now be complete, but there is still the opportunity to join the surveys during May and a final one in June.

In addition to the above 3 species, it is also intended to collect data on House Martins and Swifts which are also Red Listed birds of High Conservation Concern (2021). If you would like to help with submitting records of these 2 species please make contact. We propose to use the iRecord app which is a free download and easy to use, hopefully using a Group data entry approach (more info from village reps). Nature Notes

This is my favourite time of the year. Flowers and blossom everywhere, birds arriving for the summer to breed and resident ones already busy with the job. Last Sunday, 10th April, I spotted a swallow flying around near the stables and when I went to look there were three flying about together; a pair plus one. They have already 'moved in' to the stables, strengthening the existing nest with a layer of fresh mud, easily identified by the difference in colour. They arrived almost three weeks earlier than last year. House martins arrived this week too; I thought I heard one on Tuesday evening, then on Friday morning, the 15th, I definitely heard one and looking out of the office window I saw one sitting in the nest compartment of the dual box nearest to me looking out. Another summer visitor that appears to be arriving in good numbers, I have heard a good many, is the blackcap. Males usually arrive first and begin singing to claim a territory. I have not seen one yet as they are quite secretive and tend to sing deep within the undergrowth. The male has a black cap, aptly named, whereas the female's is brown.

We took the toad signs down on 27th March, as there wasn't any activity from them, probably due to the weather not being to their liking; they ideally want wet and warm evenings to move about in. It was quite dry with a lot of overnight frosts in March.



The following evening, I found 6 toads the most I had seen for ages. I wondered if the signs should be re-instated but it stayed cold and dry. We had rain on the 12th April, the toads responded that evening and for the next two; lots of them in the pond stirring up the weed and croaking. So, I think because the weather had not been perfect previously (I had only noted one good toad night on 10th March with lots on the move) they had another go when the weather was 'wet and warm' just as they like it. There are lots of tadpoles in the pond, the other day when it was warm and sunny there was a black line of them all the way along the lawn side. These are toad tadpoles, as they are black. Frog tadpoles are brownish. We seldom get many frog tadpoles, probably due to predation from mallards, with the frog spawn being laid and left to develop on the surface. We have had trouble with little egrets again taking the goldfish; but not today or yesterday.

Last Sunday, 10th April, at about 6.30 am, and I saw a lovely red fox hunting up near the stables. It was following various scent trails, one I knew to be rabbit as I had seen two there previously.

This last week was brilliant for sightings; swallow, house martin, orange-tipped butterflies, fox and then on Saturday night after dark best of all, a hedgehog! I have not seen a live one for decades. I saw it again last night; alerted to its presence by the sound of it eating a snail on the patio.
