



Dear All,

My husband and I are sitting in a café in Frome on one of the hottest days the UK has ever experienced and tomorrow it is going to be even hotter. The world is in a mess and the weather with it, and it's all down to human beings' extraordinary gift of living as if they owned the place (the earth, the cosmos, etc), with total disregard for the damage they are inflicting on themselves, other species and the delicate eco system we inhabit; you could be forgiven for feeling rather downcast at this scenario.

Added to the above, I arrived home after taking a service with my back screaming in protest at the necessity of standing up for a while. Several painkillers and a hot water bottle later it was not quite as bad. As I ate my lunch feeling rather sorry for myself, I thought about the usual things I do to try to cheer myself up. If I tell you that cleaning the fridge out cheers me up, properly with the shelves taken out and washed, salad drawer likewise, you will probably think I am mad. Cleaning out the larder is even more pleasing, but that is perhaps too big a job for such a hot day.



But when things are bad, and despair sets in, I seek solace elsewhere. Some of you will not have been in St Mary's Kingston Deverill. It is a beautiful little church, much altered by the Victorians but in a very restrained way. In the chancel on a plinth wall, is a carved 14th century statue of the Madonna and child. Once she was brightly painted, now there is the merest hint of colour here and there. She is weathered and worn and one hand is missing, a mere stump. But it is her brokenness that speaks to me so powerfully of beauty and pain; she holds the Christ child almost as if she is offering him to us, she seems to be gazing into the future and saying, 'here is suffering and pain, this is what it means to be human, this is the reality we live with.'

I cannot quite explain why I find this statue so calming, I think it is because gazing at this battered Madonna I feel but a tiny, tiny part of something much bigger and deeper than myself. I feel drawn into another perspective in which myself, this world, this suffering, this despair is held by something I cannot understand nor articulate. T.S Elliot wrote: 'Here or there does not matter/We must be still and still moving/Into another intensity/ For a further union, a deeper communion'. Do go and visit this beautiful Madonna and child, I hope she speaks to you and brings you peace.

Dog fouling, continuous noisy barking dogs and bonfires

The Parish Council have received complaints of increasing dog faeces being left, dogs continuously barking and bonfire nuisance. Please be a good neighbour pick up after your dogs, minimise their barking and refrain from lighting bonfires. It is an offence for a dog owner not to immediately clear up after their dog has fouled. Dog faeces left on the ground by irresponsible dog owners is unsightly and anti-social and also a potential health risk to young children. Faeces should be bagged and taken home or placed in a litter bin. Dogs bark naturally but the constant barking or whining of a dog can be disturbing and annoying for neighbours. Often this problem occurs when you are out of the house and you may not realise someone is being affected. www.wiltshire.gov.uk/env-health-dogs

Wessex Water Work

Wessex Water (WW) is planning to carry out water main replacement works on the B3095 and various other roads in Kingston and Monkton Deverills. The work is planned to start on **Monday 5th September 2022**, it may last for 29 weeks. Due to the narrowness of the B3095 it is likely to be closed to through traffic. The section of the B3095 where the main will be replaced is from Kingston Deverill Church to 91 Monkton Deverill (BA12 7EU), a road closure will be required separately for each road. WW will hold an open day on **Tuesday 9th August** from 10.00 am to 8.00 pm in the Upper Deverills Hall to give more details and answer questions about the work and implications for residents. This is an opportunity to raise concerns about access or continuity of supply during the work.

Nature Notes

Global warming seems to have really started with record temperatures predicted in the next few days. I suppose it was inevitable as Europe has been getting hotter in recent years. I am not a fan of heat; I hate watching the countryside burn up and loose it's greenness. The ground is now like concrete, so any creature trying to dig for food has no chance. Plants are withering away; I water in the cooler part of the day when it's almost dark to try and help them. There was a saying that our summers consisted of two hot days and a thunderstorm, that seems to have gone awry. It is forecast for some rain next week, but not much, and then back to wall-to-wall sunshine which may stay until the end of the month. Nothing grows without rain. Grass will be short and farmers will have difficulty feeding their livestock and keeping them watered. I hope it does not last as long as it did in 1976, but the temperatures weren't as high then.

The moorhens have not had a second brood. One morning three weeks after we first spotted the chicks, there was a change and then we only had two youngsters on the pond. An adult, I think the female, returned in the afternoon and stayed overnight with the young on the nest. Then it was just the two youngsters until the 30th June when both adults appeared and I saw nesting material being collected. For a couple of days there were three youngsters, then only one remained. On the 9th July Clive found a dead adult moorhen at the top of the garden. We have the one youngster which is developing well and seems to be quite content on its own.

The swallows have done well and when I looked this morning there were three well grown youngsters sitting on the edge of the nest on the verge of flying; the second brood. I had counted five beaks earlier in their development but only these three appear to have survived; it does not surprise me as they were having trouble

keeping cool in the extreme heat. Food should not have been a problem as it is all collected in the air and insects are plentiful. The house martins have flown but I don't know how many they produced as any nest activity is hidden from view. I am not sure if they are sitting again.

We have had great spotted woodpeckers coming to the feeders and have seen a youngster; easily identified by its red cap. Green woodpeckers have also been in the garden working around the ant nests which we have plenty of in the lawn. There was a young green one close to the house giving good views with the scope.

Judging by the number of young birds I have seen it would appear to have been a successful breeding season. Goldfinches have done well; young are easily spotted

lacking the red on the head. The male blackbird still comes for sultanas, collecting for his young, probably his last brood. The live mealworms I put out are readily taken in these conditions. The abundance of young birds does not go unnoticed; the sparrowhawk often visits and this morning a hobby flew overhead after the swallows and house martins.
