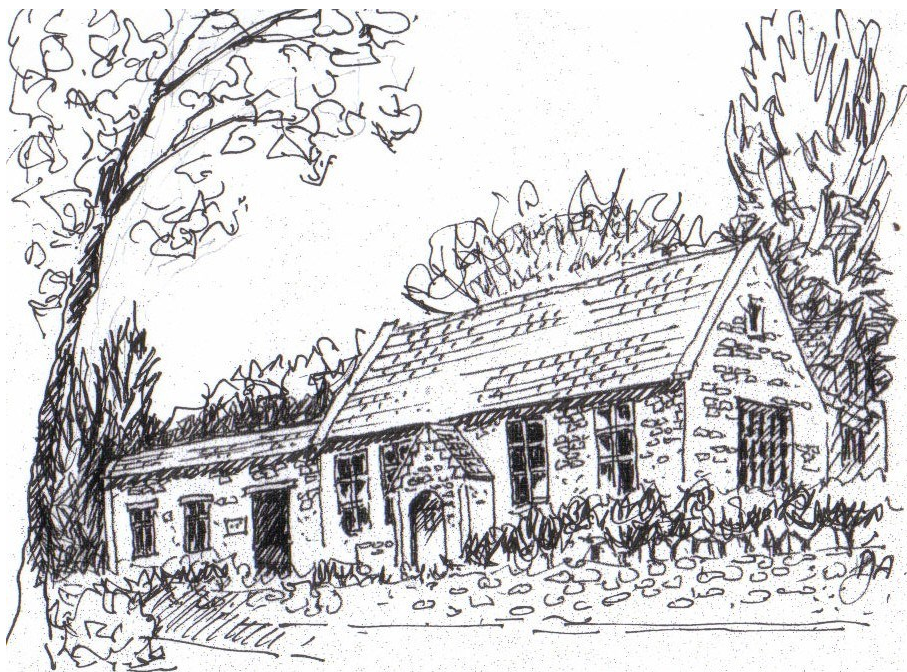

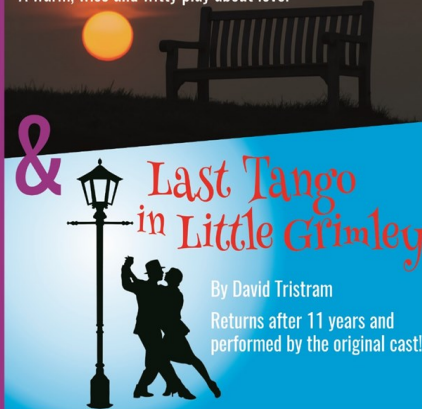

Why not Join the Club! The valley's 50/50 club raises funds to help run and preserve our four beautiful valley churches, for the benefit of everyone fortunate to live here and appreciate the unique community spirit of village life. Upper Deverills Wildlife & Conservation Group



Have you noticed some changes in the Kingston Deverill churchyard? You may have seen patches of grass and flowers left to grow in areas usually mown. This is part of one of the first projects to be undertaken by the Wildlife & Conservation Group, set up earlier this year following the new Parish Plan.

The Group is working with Ron Dix, who does an excellent job of maintaining the churchyard as a whole. Two areas will be allowed to grow without mowing throughout the summer. Although they may look a little untidy to start with, we are taking great care to preserve the overall beauty, order and tranquillity of the churchyard. One such area is a small circle in front of the Church, where a variety of grasses, self-heal, speedwell and sorrel now flourish.

In the shady place behind the church, next to where Ron has already cultivated a lovely bank of snowdrops, the Group are adding a range of native plants including Red Campion, Foxgloves and Garlic Mustard, which are host to the caterpillars of the Orange Tip butterfly. Further along, beneath the Ash trees, is a pile of dead wood that should provide food and shelter for all sorts of creatures.

A promising patch is the un-mown rectangle in the churchyard extension. This piece of former meadow-land has never been cultivated and therefore has the low fertility our native wild plants need. In early June Penny Lee, a professional ecologist, visited and pointed out to us wild flowers such as the quaintly named Common Mouse-ear, Corky-fruited Water Dropwort and Common Cats-ear, as well as Self-heal and Bird's-foot Trefoil. Penny recommended these areas be left to seed, then cut in late summer, with the mowings removed to keep the soil fertility down. In this way we hope to encourage many more wild flowers and grasses, which will support a wider range of insects, and so on up the food chain.

The churchyard is a long-term exercise, but another of the group's projects is close to completion. We chose three farmland birds that are on the national Red List of declining species: Skylarks, Yellowhammers and Corn buntings. Members of the Group walked two routes in each of our three villages in April, May and June and carefully recorded sightings of these birds. The results have been collated and will give a base-line for monitoring changes in these bird populations.

Members share wildlife stories and sightings. One of the Otters living on our lovely chalk stream has a cub, the pair were recently recorded on a camera trap. A Fox has been seen with her cub near Kingston Deverill church and a Barn Owl has been hunting over fields nearby. Kingfishers, Grey Herons and Little Egrets have all been seen along the river.



Future potential projects include surveying the river and building bird, bee and bat boxes to put up for next year.

Nature Notes

To say we are desperate for rain is an understatement. We need light showers to soften the ground; if it were to rain really hard it would only run off at the moment as the ground is just like concrete. Everywhere is looking very sad and dry and it is hard to find any green. Our field next to the garden with the footpath through is green at one end due to a spring. It is very worrying for the farmers who are having to take food out to their stock in the fields, food which is supposed to be for next winter. Arable farmers are harvesting in dangerous conditions when a spark or machinery overheating can set light to a tinder dry field causing loss of grain and straw and machinery. Hopefully we will get a decent amount of rain in the next few months to get a good flush of growth in the fields which will allow some more silage to be made.



It appears to be a good year for wasps. Walking up the garden earlier I had to be careful where I stepped as there are fallen apples on the ground, some were covered in them. We think there is a nest in the roof space at the front of the house as they are coming and going at gutter level. So far, they have not bothered us and I know they do a lot of good in the garden. I saw a hummingbird hawkmoth this afternoon on the stocks at the front; I had seen one at the back in June on the valerian. I have also seen quite a few gatekeeper butterflies, commas and whites and dragonflies on the pond, mainly southern hawker.

The pond is looking sad with the water level down and, due to the excessive heat, some algal growth. We have not seen any fish swimming about for a while or any dead ones floating on the top. There have been more visits from the kingfisher and heron but I have not seen either bird manage to catch anything. The young moorhen has gone, it disappeared at the beginning of the month.

The garden is very quiet now, just a few birds coming to the feeders; long-tailed tits to the fat and goldfinches to the seed. There were blue tits feeding earlier today, an adult looking very ragged in moult with a completely bald head. The blackbirds and robins no longer come for food as they have finished feeding their last brood. We still have two active nests; a house sparrow in the swift box and one house martin nest. The house sparrow nest lost two of the brood; I found a chick on the ground below on two consecutive evenings; they were alive but no hope of rearing them or returning them to the nest.



I am feeding hedgehogs, they appear to be grateful as by morning the bowls are licked clean. They will be short of their natural food as the dry weather has greatly reduced the slug and snail population and digging for earthworms has become impossible. There are definitely two hedgehogs, possibly three, that I feed; I always make sure there is plenty of drinking water available for them and any other animal, whether it be cat, fox, badger or deer.
