

#### Dear All,

I write on a bright autumn day in a week that has shaken the world. We are reeling from the death of our beloved Queen; yes she was 96 but her death when it came felt sudden and utterly shocking. She was without doubt a unique figure, an inspiration to us all in her embodiment of duty and love of neighbour; an extraordinary example of faithful Christian service lived out with grace and humility.



On Sunday 11th September churches throughout the land said special prayers for the late Queen, giving thanks for her many years of dedicated service to our country and the Commonwealth. We gathered together to pray and comfort one another as we mourned the person whose presence symbolised stability and order in our increasingly chaotic and bewildering world. We ended our services by singing the National Anthem, how strange it seemed to sing 'God save our gracious King'.

Our hearts go out to the royal family whose grief is being played out under the watchful gaze of the word's media. Yes, we mourn our Queen, and even though most of us had never met her, her death seems personal, she was woven into the fabric of our lives. But this most famous of monarchs was also a wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother whose family is broken hearted and sad at her death. As we remember the Queen, let us pray for her family in their grief, particularly the King and Queen Consort, whose lives will now be very different.

The end of October heralds a season of remembrance as we mark All Saints and All Souls Day on 30th October. All Souls is an opportunity to remember and give thanks for the lives of those we have loved and lost. All the churches will be open over the weekend of the 29th to enable people to come and sit quietly or write a prayer to hang on a prayer tree. On Sunday the 30th at 10.00 am at Chapmanslade we have a Eucharist for All Souls, and Evensong for All Souls at Longbridge Deverill at 4.00 pm.

Of course it is perfectly possible to remember on our own, but there is something very comforting and moving about being with others and finding solace in shared experience. The church buildings themselves have seen centuries of both joy and sorrow; walking into a church I am always struck by the thought that the walls are soaked in years of prayer and remembrance. By the time you read this the late Queen's funeral will be over and the condolence books closed. But we will never forget her, we will talk of her with love, respect, and gratitude in the years to come. May she rest in peace and rise in glory.

# **Upper Deverills Parish Council**

<u>Sundays</u> It has been bought to the Parish Council's attention that in the past villagers in the Deverills were encouraged not to use loud



power tools such as hedge trimmers, leaf blowers, chainsaws or noisy lawn mowers on a Sunday. This was to make one day a week as tranquil as possible for neighbours, especially in summer when people may be enjoying their gardens and entertaining friends outside. We know occasionally such activities can be essential but this seems a reasonable initiative. This 'code of conduct' would be a voluntary policy or statement of desirability, without legal force, which villagers can choose to respect or not. We know how noisy the countryside can be, one day of relative peace was welcomed and, we are told, would be again. If you have views on this idea, positive or negative, please let the Parish Council know (via the Parish Clerk) and it will discuss it at the next meeting.

Road safety During discussions and consultations which took place during the Parish Plan process, a number of road safety concerns were raised. These included the sheer volume of traffic, speeding on the B3095 through villages and between villages, speeding on other unclassified roads, safety for all road users, safety on narrow bends, damage to verges and HGV related problems. Some residents put forward potential solutions, some of these were not practical and others might even have been contradictory. There were a range of views on potentially trying to change the current speed limits. The Parish Council has considered carefully the best way to approach these various issues. The Parish Councillors are not experts in traffic management whereas Wiltshire Council has officers who deal with these matters, therefore it was agreed the Parish Council invite a Senior Engineer from the Traffic Engineering Team at Wiltshire Council to visit so the problems could be explained at first hand and advice sought. This visit took place on 16 August and we await a report from the Senior Engineer.

<u>Cllr Belinda Stewart-Cox</u> is on Wiltshire Council operational flood working group. <u>The next Parish Council meeting</u> will be **Wednesday 9th November** at 7.00 pm in the village hall, see page 14 and the website for further details.

Please do continue to provide the Environment Agency with feedback, email floodwessex@environment-agency.gov.uk. Many of you will have registered in the past for Flood warnings. You can still call 0345 988 1188 or go on line to GOV.UK Check for flooding. The goal of Check for flooding is 'To provide timely, up to date flood information in one on line location, including local knowledge from communities and information from partners, enabling people to understand their 'flood risk easily, take action and recover from flooding.' STAY SAFE and TAKE CARE this winter.

# **Deverills & Crockerton - Records at the History Centre**

At the Wiltshire & Swindon History Centre we safeguard records from parishes across the county. These records were created or accumulated by officials at local parish churches and transferred to Chippenham once they had served their original purpose. Here they become part of the historic written evidence of our county and can be made



available to researchers. IMAGE: Detail from the 1773 Andrews & Dury Map

The parish records of St. Peter & St. Paul's, Longbridge, and of the Holy Trinity, Hill Deverill, tell us a great deal about issues, activities, and decision-making within the area. The collection includes the records of incumbent ministers, the churchwardens, and parochial church council, and the records of charities associated with the church. These include the parish's official Overseers of the Poor, replaced in the Victorian era by the Board of Guardians. This organisation collected and distributed monies for the less fortunate of the parish, the financial records start in the 18th century continuing through the nineteenth century. The parish collection also includes evidence of charities established by individuals; such as the 20th century Brocklebank Charity whereby the Reverend JWR Brocklebank bequeathed 7 Church Street to the parish to house a sexton/caretaker for the church, plus £1,000 for their salary. He left £500 towards repairing the church's east window to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the founding of the church. The collection also includes the 19th century Patriotic Fund for the relief of the widows and orphans of soldiers, sailors and marines raised in Longbridge and Monkton Deverill.

We also house parish registers of baptisms, marriages and burials, the oldest dates from 1682. As was common at this time, one register recorded all baptisms, marriages and burials, all immaculately handwritten, later this changed to separate registers for baptisms, marriages and burials. All pre 1916 registers have been digitised, their contents can be searched via Ancestry.com, in doing so we have withdrawn the original volumes from public access due to their fragility.

If you are interested in our holdings simply type Wiltshire and Swindon History Centre Catalogue into your search engine and you will be provided with a link to our searchable online catalogue. If you would like to visit us we recommend making an appointment (by emailing archives@wiltshire.gov.uk), as our search room is often fully booked. We are open Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. We also provide free use of Ancestry.com, and house an extensive Local Studies library and the Wiltshire Building Record who maintain 18,000 records of individual Wiltshire buildings. We look forward to welcoming you.

#### **Nature Notes**

Thank goodness it finally rained, but the ground is still like concrete and it is going to take a lot more rain before it softens. Usually, I move the feeder stands on a regular basis to prevent the ground beneath becoming worn and to help reduce disease, but if I could pull the stands out I certainly would not be able to insert them back in, so they have stayed put. There are less birds coming to the feeders now; it is mainly goldfinches, long-tailed tits, and blue and great tits. One day there were 8 or more blue tits on the fat, along with some long-tails, I can't remember that number of blue tits feeding altogether before. There has been a young male green woodpecker feeding on the lawn recently, there are lots of



ant nests in the lawn so there is an abundance of food for it. You can tell it's a youngster as the plumage is streaked and there is just the hint of red in the developing moustachial stripe to identify it as male.

The house martins at the front have flown and the nests appear to be quiet now, I think they sometimes use them to roost overnight. I thought all the swallows had flown but when I looked in the stables at the end of August, I spotted another nest which was in use with a youngster on the edge flapping its wings. Since then, I have been taking a look each day and managed to count 4 youngsters which are now all flying. I wondered why there was still swallow activity around the stables. I had been focusing my attention on the nest regularly used; the low light makes it difficult to see in and the parents get agitated, dive bombing you, making it very clear you are not wanted around. I have already seen the swallows and house martins gathering and flying about in large flocks, feeding up and getting ready to fly south.

The pond looks better for some rain and we have seen the fish again. So have the kingfisher, heron and little egrets; the kingfisher comes most days, the other 2 are less frequent. One morning we had a pair of moorhens on the pond, they stayed a few hours and have not returned since. On warm sunny days there is often a big green dragonfly, a southern hawker I think.

I am relieved the countryside has greened up quite quickly after the rain, and surprised at the abundance of fruit in the hedgerows; blackberries, sloes, hips, crab apples and hawthorn berries, after such a prolonged dry, hot spell. Our apple trees are laden but the fruit is understandably on the small side.



I am still feeding hedgehogs in 3 places. One station at the back is outside the dining room window which means we quite often hear the bowl rattle when the hedgehog comes. Sometimes the hedgehog coming to the front arrives before me and when I put the bowl down gently next to it doesn't seem to mind, they don't' see me as a threat and have me well-trained.
