The season of Advent begins on Sunday the 27th November. Like Lent, it is a penitential season when the liturgical colour is purple and a time of preparation to celebrate the feast of the Incarnation without which there would be no feast of the Resurrection. We are called to exhibit those Kingdom values in our lives until at last our prayer will be answered and God's Kingdom will 'come on earth as it is in heaven'. May the God of peace make you completely holy, ready for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.



ANAROCHAUK PROJECT It is almost 7 years since the launch of Eco Church in 2016 and there are already 2,000 awarded churches, 500 of which now have a silver award. A Rocha UK's goal is to see at least 25% of churches in England, Wales and Northern Ireland engaged in

deliberate and on-going action to care for nature practically on churches' premises, in the community and by using their voice. The achievement of awards, especially for churches moving through the award scheme to reach silver and gold, is a touchstone for ongoing action to care for nature practically, especially when the government seems less inclined to do so. That is why it is A Rocha's second goal to see 12% of total churches in England and Wales awarded with least a Bronze award by the end of 2025. Nature Notes



A few days after I wrote the last article I heard the seeping calls of redwings, one of our winter migrants, just as the light was failing. That was on the 19th October and since then I have heard and seen them regularly but not in great numbers. About a week later I heard and saw my first

fieldfares; I love their "cha-cha-chack" call. Once again, I have been aware of fieldfares since seeing them for the first time but so far not in great numbers. There should be plenty of food in the fields and hedgerows for them, so until the weather gets colder and supplies run down, they won't need to come into gardens looking for food. When they do, they will find lots of windfall apples in our garden which we leave on the ground for them.

The garden is still very quiet. We get a flurry of small birds coming to the feeders mainly blue and great tits and goldfinches, and then nothing for ages. We did have a coal tit one day which was zooming in and out to the sunflower hearts taking seed away to store for the winter. The long-tailed tits still come in a group but not so often. One day we had a bird on the fat slab which I identified as a starling when looking through the binoculars, the first we have

had in the garden for years. Sadly we have not seen it since. We visited Poundbury in Dorset a few weeks ago, it was full of starlings and house sparrows, I have not seen so many for a long time; I imagine they get some super murmurations from the starlings. Not long ago we had small flocks of starlings in the village



displaying in the evenings but sadly they appear to have moved elsewhere.

The weather has made up for the lack of rain earlier in the year, now everywhere is very soggy. The warmest November day has been recorded. Nature is confused, some birds have been singing as if it was early spring, the dunnock in particular. We have had dragonflies on the pond, a wasp nest still active and butterflies on the wing (small tortoiseshell and red admiral, both of which overwinter). I am still feeding hedgehogs, or at least one which I saw after dark by the food bowl near the feeders. I think it's the small one I spotted still trying to build up its body weight; we are due to get colder weather later this week so that might prompt it to hibernate.

I have not got used to the darker evenings, the light seems to suddenly disappear, especially when it is overcast. I don't know how people who live in the north cope with very short days, I suppose you just get used to it. There are already signs of spring, clearing leaves I uncovered the shoots of snowdrops poking through, it seems a bit early. I wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Looking ahead into the New Year the annual RSPB Garden Birdwatch runs from the 27th to the 29th of January.
