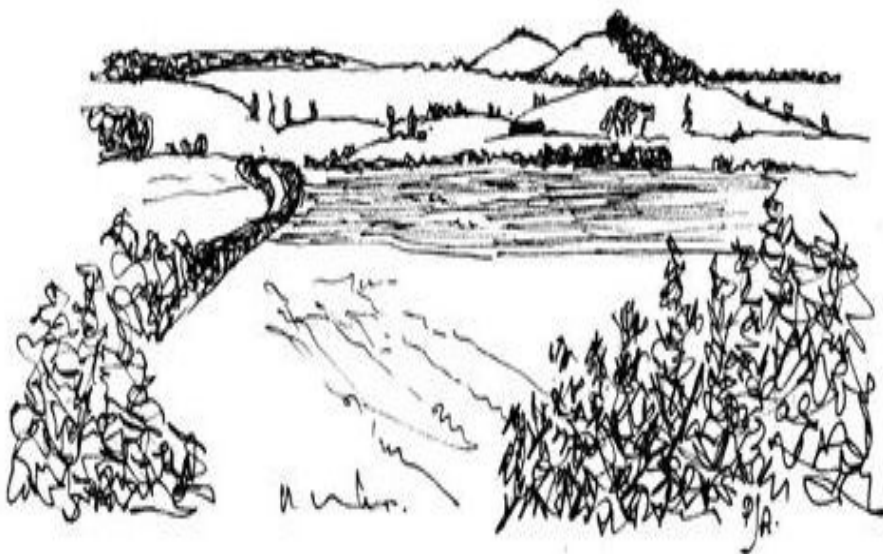

Dear Friends,

I have just been for a walk with Betty and oh my goodness how beautiful everything is! The limey green of the trees, the verges dripping with new grass and burgeoning cow parsley. The singing of the skylarks way up beyond sight, the fresh new crops just beginning to whisper in the breeze. And



holding all this fecundity, the chalk downs, ancient, majestic, beyond time. Old as the sea they go way back to a time when the earth was formed, and they will still be here centuries after we are gone; just thinking about this makes me feel very small and makes the things I worry about seem very trivial. As is often the case when confronted by such awe-inspiring beauty I turn to poetry to voice what I cannot, like Gerard Manley Hopkins who sees the natural world as shot through with the divine: *'The world is charged with the grandeur of God. It will flame out, like shining from shook foil; It gathers to a greatness, like the ooze of oil/Crushed.'*

Whether you subscribe to the notion of God or not I think at some point or another all of us experience that sense of smallness, of being part of something much bigger than ourselves; an old French prayer sees it this way: *O Lord, your ocean is so great and my boat is so small.* Reflecting on the 15th century Indian mystic and poet Kabir's work Roger Housden writes: *'This making love with the divine, this plunging into truth, requires what human love does – a falling away of your defences, a recognition of your vulnerability, a willingness to acknowledge that you are on the wave of an ocean far bigger than you are. Yet in the same moment that you cry 'yes!' to the immensity of life, you share its power and beauty. You are both everything and nothing. This is the great ocean that Kabir is urging you to experience, the ocean of Life that bore you into existence in the first place.'* What a profound description of transcendence, of a sense of the 'other' that often takes our breath away; to Hopkins once again:

*And for all this, nature is never spent;
There lives the dearest freshness deep down things;
And though the last lights off the black West went
Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward, springs —
Because the Holy Ghost over the bent
World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings.*

Next time I write the crops will be taller, nothing stays the same, such is the nature of life. The earth will turn, the seasons come and go, as we go about our daily lives; let's hope now and again we take time to reflect on our place in it all.

The team recently took a group of young people to a residential week in the New Forest where they enjoyed activities such as outdoor cooking, animal tracking and team-building. Some of Alabaré's veterans are involved with developing the Community Garden at Arundells House in Salisbury. Those taking part in all these activities are finding it of huge benefit to their wellbeing, confidence and self-esteem. Resident Ryan said, "I don't usually go out much due to social anxiety but Boots on the Ground allows me to meet new people in a comfortable environment. It helps me to interact with people and pursue my interests which will hopefully lead to employment soon." Knowing the positive impact this work has on the mental health and wellbeing of their residents, Alabaré is keen as many as possible are given the opportunity to join with a wide range of outdoor activities. Bishop Stephen's letter

One year ago, I became your bishop with that great service in the cathedral. It has been the fastest year in many ways, with changes coming at us all with a post-pandemic pace that has somewhat stunned us all. Changing prime ministers and monarchs, the cost-of-living challenges and international events moving faster than ever, just at the point when we ought to be reflecting on all that has happened to us. It has been an 'interesting' time to become a diocesan bishop!

I'm often asked if I'm enjoying it. There is no doubting the pace and the pace of change, but the answer is a certain yes, but mostly because this is the Diocese of Salisbury. I have visited as many places as possible and what is clear the church is all about the local, and the bishops (and those assisting in this co-ordinating ministry) are there to hold more than one locality together. We are truly blessed here with our rural/urban mix, with coast and countryside, with Islands and 'thin' places. In being blessed, it is how we respond which makes the difference. We have a chance to show this when the Archbishop of Canterbury comes to us this month. Much of my time, with the contribution of so many in the diocese, has been the preparation of our new Diocesan Vision and Strategy, our plan for the co-ordination of our common life under God as disciples; the details to come, under the title *Making Jesus Known*. For all our differences in each locality, if we are not to be about Making Jesus Known, then I am not sure what we are about. If we are all doing that, then yes, I am really enjoying it!

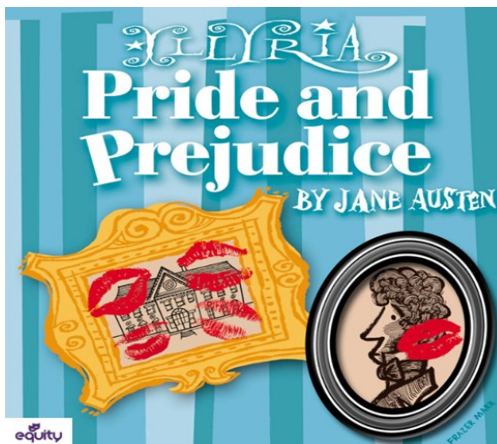
Longbridge Deverill Parish Council



At the Annual Parish Meeting of the Electorate on 24th April, the Chairman to the Council, Cllr Mark Duddridge, gave his annual and financial report and the following organisations gave presentations, for full details of the presentations please see the draft minutes: **Longbridge Deverill Parish Hall** its usage has increased with fitness classes, social fundraisers, artisan markets and private parties amongst some of the events to partake in. **Crockerton Primary School** very active both inside and out of the classroom, with dance, music, sport, visits and welcoming visitors, such as police & fire service. **Deverills Cricket Club** welcome all ages and abilities, play friendly games throughout the summer. They are keen to keep the club going and playing matches. **PCC of Deverills & Horningsham** the congregations are falling, raise funds from collections, donations and fund raisers to pay the diocese. Rely on volunteers for flowers, cleaners and bell ringing. **Neighbourhood Watch** sent a report. **Warminster Community Area Health & Wellbeing** incorporates surrounding villages and wish to reach out to villages to offer support. **AONB International Dark Skies** status was awarded in 2019, one of 21 worldwide, it is provisional, therefore important to keep the lights down.

Grants have been awarded to following organisations: - **Deverills & Crockerton Parish News** an important communication tool delivered to all households in the Parish. Financially supported by residents & contributor donations and grants from two Parish Councils. **Crockerton Village Committee** organise various social events, Easter Egg Hunt, Christmas Carols and Street parties (Jubilee last year and King's Coronation this year), they pay for and maintain the two defibrillators in Crockerton. **Longbridge Deverill Flower Show** work is under way for this year's show to be held on **Saturday 12th August** stalls, various classes to enter and live band in the evening. All organisations appreciate support received and welcome new volunteers.

Nature Notes

We are being treated to some lovely weather at the moment, today it felt like summer. Everywhere is looking lush and green; we have had the right conditions to promote growth; a decent amount of rain and warm sunshine. The farmers have taken their first cut of silage and the lawn mowers have been very busy in gardens. The weeds have grown like mad, especially the nettles and cleavers. Against the green background of the countryside, there is the white of cow parsley (also known as Queen Anne's lace) and hawthorn flowers. The other dominant colours are mauve from foxgloves, lilac and rhododendrons and yellow from laburnum, Welsh poppies, yellow flag irises and azaleas.



The birds are very busy. I know of three nest boxes with young in the garden. The beech tree box in full view of the kitchen window is being used by great tits. The young are very noisy, the food is being taken in frequently indicating they are growing well. The period between hatching and leaving the nest, the fledging time, is 16 to 22 days. There is another great tit family in the box on the end of the stables at the top of the garden, they are not so far advanced, not so noisy, the parents don't need to provide food so often. The third active nest I know of is in the swift box on the back of the house being used by house sparrows. They were alarmed the other evening when a pair of house martins started flying up to the swift box and landing on top of it and flying up and pointing to the wall either side of the box; all signs they would like to nest there. We have experienced this before; house sparrows using the swift box first and then being pushed out and house martins taking over. This evening I saw a house martin flying up to the dual box at the front of the house. I was getting concerned we had not seen any house martins here, especially as last year they didn't do so well. The swallows in the stables have refurbished the well-established nest; I looked in this afternoon and could see that a lot of new mud had been added making the cup deeper and safer.



The moorhens have nested and by my reckoning the chicks will be hatching soon. I first saw nesting material being taken into the irises at the end of April, they were mating daily and they have become more aggressive to other birds chasing them away in order to keep the area clear for their family. The incubation period is about 3 weeks and the parents share the job. The chicks will be very vulnerable, there are crows, magpies, cats and this afternoon I spotted a stoat in the garden. I realised there must be a predator about as all the birds were alarm calling. I thought it might be a cat (though the alarm call was not quite right for cat; each predator has a specific alarm call), then I spotted this red coated creature with a black tip to its tail.

Looking at the pond this morning I saw the fish were spawning. Later a kingfisher visited, a female (red on lower bill, females wear lipstick!), I spotted it with a small fish which it flew off with. The swifts are back and, I am told, the cuckoo although I have yet to hear it.
