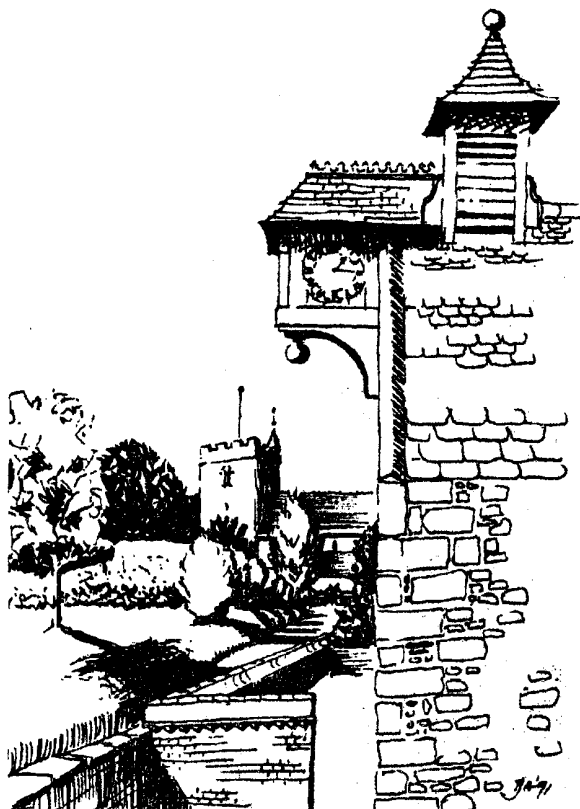

Dear Friends,

August is a funny month in the church's year. There are no major festivals, the schools have broken up and lots of people go away. Of course, there will always be weddings, baptisms and funerals, but generally it feels like a bit of a lull. I refuse to hold planned meetings in August and use the time to do a bit of theological reading, reflect on the year so far and plan for the maelstrom of special services that occur in the latter part of the year. If I am honest, it is basically all go from September until next Easter!



However, we do have a lovely service in August though when we gather to celebrate Lammas or Lughnasadh as it can be called. The word *Lammas* derives from the Old English phrase *hlaf-maesse*, which translates to *loaf mass*. In early Christian times, the first loaves of the season were blessed by the Church. In Wessex, during the Anglo Saxon period, bread made from the new crop would be brought to church and blessed and then the Lammas loaf was broken into four pieces and placed in the corners of a barn where it served as a symbol of protection over the garnered grain. Lammas was a ritual that recognized a community's dependency on what Thomas Hardy once called '*the ancient pulse of germ and birth*'.

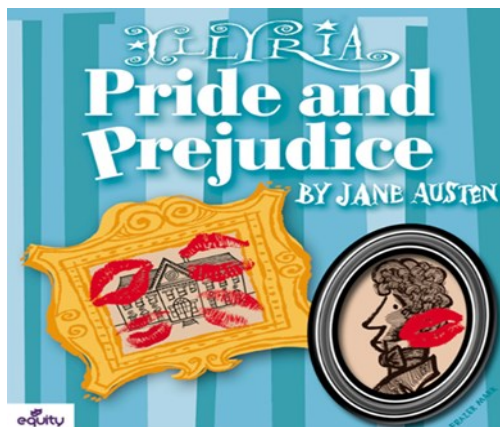
In our modern world, it is often easy to forget the trials and tribulations our ancestors had to endure. For us, if we need a loaf of bread, we simply drive to the supermarket and buy one; if we run out, it is no big deal, we just go and get more. When our ancestors lived, hundreds and thousands of years ago, the harvesting and processing of grain was crucial. If crops were left in the fields too long, or the bread not baked in time, families could starve. Taking care of one's crops meant the difference between life and death.

I think it is really important we hold church services like Lammas and Harvest; having a readily available abundance of food, or indeed over abundance, means we have forgotten our dependence upon the earth, and you don't need me to tell you the devastating consequences of that.

So, come to our **Lammas service at Kingston Deverill at 10.00 am on Sunday 13th August**; it really should be the first Sunday in August, but it fits with the rota better on the second. We will be celebrating the first crops and the skill of the baker and brewer who turn the grain into something delicious. Do bring along some homemade bread of any description and we will bless it and the eat it! But please don't worry if you are not a bread maker, just come and enjoy the service, everyone is very welcome. See you there!

Nature Notes

Beware what you wish for! I kept wishing it would rain and it has certainly done that now. On a selfish note, I am very glad it has kept moist since I treated for vine weevil at the week-end with nematodes. Quite often in the summer I have been struggling to keep the containers damp. The wind accompanying the rain seems to be stronger than usual for this time of the year. The plants being in full foliage it is very damaging. It will have been knocking down the crops in the fields making it much more difficult to harvest and allowing easier access to the grain for pigeons and corvids, all of which reduces yield. I heard a combine working just before the week-end in the rain, cutting the field of barley near us, and a few days later a mower was cutting a field of grass (in the rain!) for silage; summer sounds and memories of the farm days.



We don't know what happened to the moorhen chicks. On the morning of the Friday 23rd June I did my usual roll call, 6 chicks and both parents, and all seemed fine. When I returned from an appointment in town at about 2.30 pm, the pond was eerily quiet; not one moorhen in sight. It was a hot day so I wondered if they were all in the shade of the irises. Since then, not a sighting of a moorhen in the garden. The evening before I had cleared the ramp at the top end of the pond so the chicks could walk out as they were not big enough or strong enough to jump straight out of the water onto the side like the parents. Clive reckons the parents walked the chicks away but I am afraid they were predated. Past times, when the adults walk them out they did so early in the day, and there were quite a number of predators about that morning; magpies, crows and I expect the odd cat or two. The pond has been quiet since apart from a heron visiting a few times.

On a brighter note I can report all 5 swallow chicks have flown successfully from the stable. I was lucky enough on several occasions to catch all 5 sitting together on the cane we have positioned across one corner of the stable for them to use and they certainly do; there is a thick line of guano below. I have been looking to see if the adults will go for a second brood as there is still plenty of time. So far, no sign; I put a new piece of black plastic on the floor below the nest (an old compost bag turned inside out), held down by stones, so I can watch for any new guano. The house martins are very busy in the dual nest box which is on the outside wall behind me as I write. Both compartments have well grown young in them with heads looking out. Of course, with there being lots of young hirundines in the air there will be predators. One evening, walking across the field, I heard a lot of alarm calling, looking up I saw a hobby being chased by a mob of mainly swallows.



The majority of the garden birds have finished breeding and rearing young now, just a few blackbirds and robins come to collect and take away food.
