



A fleeting glimpse of Salisbury Cathedral spire from the surrounding landscape is often the first sign you are approaching the city. 'S P i R E' is a collection of mixed media plein air drawings made over a year and a half, documenting that 'first glimpse', looking back at the spire as far as possible beyond the city, from 32 compass points. Most depict the stunning wider landscape around Salisbury through the seasons. This project has given Nick a wonderful excuse to explore the beautiful and varied landscapes around Salisbury, guided by 32 points of the compass, making drawings from downland, wooded ridges, hill forts, farmland and ancient sites, discovering views of the S P i R E, some so distant it appears size of a thorn glinting in the sunlight, as the South-Southeast view from the National Trust grounds of Philipps House in Dinton, 9 miles away, or the view from Figsbury Ring, 5 miles to the Northeast. Some are closer, with hints of urban surroundings, such as from North-Northwest at Fisherton Farm allotments, just a mile and a half away. Become a Wiltshire Tree Warden

Following a £294,800 grant from the Government's Forestry Commission and DEFRA Woodland Creation Accelerator Fund,

the national Tree Warden Scheme is being relaunched across Wiltshire. This is a national initiative led by the Tree Council and volunteers are being recruited in each Wiltshire town and Parish area. Tree Wardens will work with council Woodland Officers and act as local tree champions helping to plant, promote and protect trees in appropriate locations in their area. Projects Tree Wardens' involvement may include: Arranging local tree planting days; Watering and caring for local trees; Working with the local authorities and community groups to plant and care for street trees; Rejuvenating local woodlands; Raising funds and finding land for tree planting projects. Nature Notes

July turned out to be a real disappointment weatherwise; cold, wet and windy. Some days it felt more like October! Thankfully August is looking better though it does feel rather autumnal. Looking into the hedgerows the hawthorn berries are beginning to turn red and the early sun this morning was picking out hints of autumn colour in the trees and hedgerows. The beech tree at the front is full of mast and the small hazel tree at the top of the garden has lots of nuts on it. I noticed the other day when watering the rhubarb that there was a collection of hazel nut shells in the corner of the planter, courtesy of some small rodent.

Despite the awful weather in July there was an exceptional number of butterflies. When I did the butterfly count a week ago it was difficult to count the number as there were so many all moving about on the buddleia. In recent years it has guite often been a case of spot the butterfly! Two species are particularly abundant this year; red admiral and peacock, but I have seen more gatekeeper,



comma and blue. We have also seen hummingbird hawkmoth at least five times. We have had kingfishers visiting more often and sometimes being



successful on spearing a goldfish. We have also had a heron coming but thankfully I have managed to chase it away before it starts fishing. A moorhen has visited occasionally, one morning there were a pair on the pond and they began behaving as if to mate;

whether they did I am not sure as they kept disappearing into the water lilies, they can breed into the autumn but we have not seen them again recently.

There has been no more swallow activity up in the stables, I wondered if July had been better they might have tried for a second brood. I am not sure about the house martins; the juveniles from the first brood in both compartments of the dual nest box flew and afterwards the single box was being used. There was activity this morning. Yesterday morning there were twenty or so, young house martins flying about and swooping up to the swift box on the back of the house, some landing on the top. They have done this in other years, and I can only assume the activity helps to remind them where they are so they can return next year. On the 31st July when I was delivering the Parish News in Homefields, I noticed at least ten swifts flying around but I have not seen any since, that may be my last sighting this year, swifts only come here for three months to breed.

There are fewer birds around now in the garden so I have reduced the amount of feed; occasionally a robin or blackbird comes to me for a suet pellet or piece or sultana. The birds are more secretive as they are moulting and more vulnerable to predation. There is little song from them either; the most predominant call at this time of the year are the long-tailed tits flying in family groups calling to one another; I have also heard nuthatch and treecreeper.
