Dear Friends,

I don't know what your thoughts are about the Bible, but I have to say it does contain some of the most profound words I have ever come across. When I was ordained all those years ago, I had to learn what it meant to be a parish priest, now I must learn what it means to be a retired priest. I have to say, even though writing a sermon is an interesting task, I am very much looking forward to not having to write one every week! I am also looking forward to reading the pile of books I have stacked up ready and maybe playing the piano again. So to be succinct, I think what I am trying to say is very simple; thank you. Thank you for making my time here so enjoyable, I will miss this place and miss you all so much. We are not going to be far away in Buckland Dinham so please do come and say hello if you are passing, the coffee and cake will be waiting for you.


Community Oral Histories Day - Thursday 26th October at St Mary's Church, Kingston Deverill. You are invited to share your memories, stories and thoughts about the



Bishop Stephen of Salisbury - Leaves on the line

October is one of those months when the leaves begin to change and fall, and somewhat comical excuses come into conversations about why things don't work. Leaves on the line may well be a technical problem for the railways, but we all know it also means, somewhat ironically, why is it somethings just don't work as they should. There are often leaves on the line in the life of the



church. Why is it sometimes things just don't work, especially when we rely upon the grace of God and seek his will? One reason is because we can spend too much time doing, and making mistakes, and not enough time praying. This is not the rather immature prayer of simply asking for this or that the way we want them, but the deeper prayer of spending time with God and being led by his still, small voice. So please do pray in October. We also suffer from our confusions and distractions because we place the leaves on the line with our judgements and preconceptions, our rulemaking and our creating in our own image. Our track must always lead to Jesus and our mission to make him known. The 4th October is the day the worldwide church remembers St Francis. In his day, the church wasn't working, and in prayer, his vision came to "Rebuild my Church". This was to be achieved by simplicity of life, by generosity to others and total commitment to prayer. His focus was Jesus Christ.

Recently, I was inspired by this vision again with a visit to Hilfield Friary in Dorset, and the licensing of a new Guardian. Hilfield welcomes all; do visit there (although you can't get there by train). When our frustrations slow us down, we would do well to follow the example of Francis: Lord God, You made your church rich through the poverty of blessed Francis. Help us like him not to trust in earthly things but to seek your heavenly gifts; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Do you have any time to help others with their tech? We can put you in touch with organisation where you can help others to bridge the "digital divide".



Nature Notes


The skies seem empty now and the house is much quieter. Most of the swallows appear to have gone, the last of 'our' house martins have left. When I last wrote I was not sure what the house martins were up to, but not long after I heard cheeping coming from the dual nest box and it was apparent both compartments were in use with second broods. I think both hirundines have had a good breeding season judging by the numbers flocking and gathering on the wires. It makes me feel sad when they go and it seems so early this year.

We don't have many birds in the garden at the moment which adds to the feeling of emptiness. I don't remember when I last saw a blackbird, I only assume they are out in the countryside feeding, there are certainly lots of berries there for them. We get sporadic visits of goldfinches and mixed tit flocks to the feeders which contain great, blue, long-tailed and

the odd coal tit. I had my friendly robin come into the garage this morning looking for food, it had to be content with suet pellet pieces as I have stopped the mealworms but she was happy.

We have not seen the moorhens again. We still see the kingfisher, not every day but it was here yesterday; it tried several times to catch a fish before disappearing. Thankfully no visits from heron or little egret as they tend to be rather persistent emptying a pond of fish. I don't think there are so many egrets or herons about perhaps they have been effected by avian flu.

There are still dragonflies around the pond which attract the attention of



out and we thought it would be spider food, but later that evening it emerged and after a chase we managed to trap it and put it outside. The dragonfly was the third encounter or incident with a winged creature. Firstly, we had a king-fisher fly into the lounge window, thankfully we heard it and Clive managed to rescue it from getting caught in the winter jasmine just below the window. It appeared to be fine and was wriggling hard in Clive's hand so we released it and it shot off. The second winged encounter was one evening when I was in the garage with the lights on and something flapped around in front of me. I realised it was a bat so we opened all the doors, turned the lights off allowing it to find its own way out.

This morning with the mist it was very autumnal; the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness. There is a lot of fruit around. The hawthorns are dripping with big berries and the blackberries are also good. The drive at the front is covered in beech masts making for crunchy walking and car driving.
