Praying for the People God Knows We Need

This autumn it has been a joy to institute and licence a record number of clergy to new posts and as well as being the beginning of new ministry for individuals, communities and parishes, these services represent the culmination of months of careful work. The appointment of clergy is one of the most important tasks of being a bishop, overseeing the right person appointed to the right place, not only fulfils the vocation of parish and priest, but also ensures faithful ministry now and in the future.



Sometimes the departure of a parish priest is sudden, sometimes it is planned, whatever the period of vacancy it ensures time is taken to review the needs of a particular place or places, of a particular church or churches, to make sure that the defined task is realistic and forward looking. This can involve vision days and consultations with Patrons and other interested parties. The role needs to be accurately defined and the drawing up of a profile and advert a careful process, bearing in mind that some weeks well over forty church leadership posts are advertised nationally in the Church Times.

The recruitment and appointment process, co-ordinated by the archdeacon and our local office, involves careful managing, as applications arrive, shortlisting takes place and interviews and visits are organised. Patrons, parish representatives all participate in what is ultimately and most importantly a task of prayerful discernment as references are sought and read, candidates welcomed, and a day of interviews held. Presentations are made, homilies preached, and the local school visited. Then following appointment all the necessary checks are made before an announcement and plans for moving take shape, including the preparation of the house and organisation of the licensing service itself.

As often is the case much hard work precedes a joyful celebration. Prayer is essential, so often the temptation is to ask for the person we all think we want, rather than trusting God will provide the person God knows we need. I am forever thankful for all those who at the end of these processes come to the diocese to serve the church faithfully as priests. We welcome those who have arrived recently and continue to pray for parishes in, or soon to be in, vacancy.

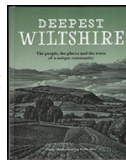

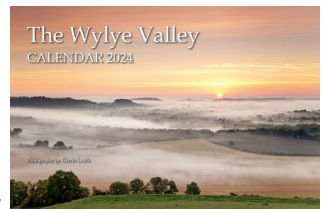

Ruth was born at Cliff House, Brixton Deverill in 1932 where she was brought up and lived on the farm with her three brothers. She lived there for a number of years before moving to The Laurels, Crockerton (which the family also owned) to continue living with her parents as the two farmhouses, Cliff House and

Humphries House were then occupied by her two brothers and their families; the youngest brother had moved to London. She married Donald Sutton in 1969 and they moved to South Africa for 15 years, where he was Professor of Chemistry at Natal University. When he retired they returned to England to live at Crocks Cottage, Crockerton. Donald sadly passed away on January 4th 1989. Ruth was very active in the Deverill Valley & Crockerton WI, firstly as their treasurer, before being appointed President for 3 years. With her sister-in-law, Leah Allard, she was a devoted attendee at Brixton Church and regularly helped to prepare the services. Ruth, a good cook and gardener, with a wry sense of humour, was a lovely and generous person who will be sadly missed by the local community. Don't let your hedge be a hazard

As we enter the Autumn season and annual cutting of roadside verges starts, I thought I would write about roadside hedges.

Travelling around villages I see many overgrown hedges alongside footpaths and country lanes. These pose a hazard to disabled people, the visually impaired, young children and other pedestrians who risk injury or damage to clothing from thorns and branches. If the pavement (footway) is narrow they may be forced into the road. This is particularly dangerous for wheelchair users or people pushing a pram or buggy. On junctions and bends overgrown hedges may obstruct sight lines and a clear view for motorists, obscure traffic signs or streetlights and with many country lanes being narrow increase the risk of accidents. Many hedges grow on the edge of highways marking boundaries with private property. It is the responsibility of the adjacent landowner or occupier to maintain them and any trees or other vegetation the hedge contains. They are required by law to trim any hedge next to the public highway where growth is preventing passage or affecting safety of the highway user. Please check hedges on your land bordering highways regularly, cut them back if obstructing visibility or passage of vehicles or pedestrians, check vegetation is not obscuring signs.

If Wiltshire Council, exercising its powers as the Highway Authority, identify an obstructive hedge or potentially dangerous tree on your land, they can send a letter saying what work you need to carry out to make the vegetation safe as stated in The Highways Act 1980. If you do not deal with the obstruction, they may do the work and claim back the cost from you. If trees, shrubs and hedges are regularly maintained to within your property boundary there will be no need for the Council to ask you to take action.

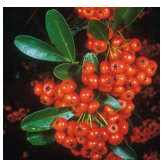


Nature Notes

The whole countryside is very quiet. I went for a walk this afternoon and the only noticeable bird sound came from corvids. The garden is very quiet; I hear the occasional robin, wren and dunnock but little else. I am still putting out a small amount of food but not a lot is eaten, and when it is wet and windy the birds tend not to come at all. I am not putting the feeders out, I put a little on the ground in three places in dishes; a bit of seed, a few sultanas and some suet pellet pieces. The suet tends to be taken most days but if the birds haven't eaten it, the hedgehogs eat it up when they emerge in the evening. One bird we see regularly at the moment is the kingfisher. It comes most days and a moorhen visited one morning, the first time for ages.



I have been feeding hedgehogs now for over a year and I have one that is very trusting. It goes under an upturned hanging basket rack where I put the small amount of food for the birds, and when it's cleared the dish it sits there looking out. It is quite a big hedgehog and I wondered at first if it would manage to get out alright, I have had a hedgehog walk off with the rack on it's back! I decided to very gently approach with the torchlight shining onto the ground, not to dazzle it, and I carefully removed the rack. Now if it goes under the rack, once it's finished eating, it sits there looking directly at me as if asking to be released. I am not sure how many hedgehogs come to feed, I have counted four on numerous evenings. I feed at two sites, at the front of the house and at the back. They are eating well, building themselves up in preparation for hibernating for the winter. We decided to buy a hedgehog house and I put it out at the back of the house a week ago. I put a little sprinkling of food in the entrance and passage to encourage them to look in. It didn't take them long to inspect it, so I put some hay in the hibernation chamber. I could see a hedgehog had been in as the hay was flattened. Overnight Thursday to Friday it was wet and windy, on Friday morning I checked the house and found quite a big hedgehog sound asleep snoring. I put the lid down quietly and left it alone. It was gone when I checked in the evening. I am told they don't like to feed where they hibernate. I suppose that is for safety reasons; food could attract predators and being asleep they would be off guard, so I am not putting food in the house now. I am not sure if they hibernate on their own or share; perhaps we will find out. I have them eating together and assume they are either siblings or parent and offspring.



It is a very good year for berries and fruits. The pyracantha bushes in the border at the front are laden and the beech tree has produced the most masts we have seen. The leaves are beginning to fall, the frost last night will certainly hasten their drop and bring about the lovely autumn change in colour to the foliage.
