

Forward to Adventure!

In my former parish, there were various experiments we made to make the most of the unique atmosphere of the preparation and the excitement accompanying Advent. Shortest-lived was what we called the Nativity Crawl, which involved the familiar festive cast dressed in costume



and released in stages onto the high street, to work their way along the five pubs situated there, finding 'no room at the inn' until culminating (with carols and swaddled doll) in carols at the last pub en route. It was fun but didn't quite catch light. More successful was what we called The Adventure, whereby each evening in Advent, a small space around the benefice -someone's garage, or a school porch - would open for just one hour to give a glimpse of something festive and hope-filled. Different households or groups would take responsibility for one night each, so the load was spread: some would simply sing carols and serve mulled wine, others were more adventurous and creative, but all were exciting steps along the way to Christmas Eve, which took place in the lychgate of one of the churches.

I recall this project (which wasn't my idea, by the way) fondly, because it began to change the rumour about church in the community and brought alive a season that still kindles spiritual yearnings among so many. My seventeen-year-old daughter told me this week that 'getting ready for the party is better even than the party itself'. In Advent, I am inclined to agree.

The Poppy Appeal 2023



Lower Pertwood Farm: Public Rights of Way



The farm has over 8 miles of public rights of way crossing our beautiful farmland, including long stretches of footpaths for those on foot and bridleways for cyclists and those on foot or horseback. We welcome people using these ways responsibly to enjoy spectacular views of the stunning chalk downland in the Cranborne Chase

Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and observe the wide range of wildlife and wildflowers we support on the farm. Those of us who work on Lower Pertwood Farm are fortunate to meet many wonderful people crossing the farm on rights of way. What is important is they act as our eyes and our ears on the farm, reporting any problems, letting us know of animals in trouble or telling us of people engaging in illegal activity such as hare-coursing.

We are currently planning to open a series of new and additional paths and bridleways for people to use, whether permissive footpaths or permissive bridleways. This will enable us to increase the number of routes that can be used and also to improve access to the right-to-roam land on our farm. We are installing new gates and stiles where they are needed to allow easy access.

These new routes will also increase the opportunities for long circular walks and rides on either side of the farm where there are many more footpaths and bridleways to enjoy. What is not generally understood is that these clearly marked footpaths which criss-cross the British countryside must be kept open by law. Unfortunately, not all our neighbours comply with this which means people who wish to go on long walks are often frustrated because they can find a footpath on the map does not exist in real terms. It is Wiltshire Council's responsibility to enforce the law and to keep these paths open but they appear to be reluctant to do that. We will post details of new permissive routes, footpaths and bridleways, on our website when they are ready for use. We are working with various organisations to prepare them, including the Open Spaces Society, the British Horse Society and the Ramblers Association.

We already support many organised groups - schools, clubs and wildlife groups - to visit the farm to walk, cycle or ride.

In the spring of 2024, we are planning to provide a Ride Out day for British Horse Society members, as well as other local riders.

Nature Notes

Today must be the first day for ages it hasn't rained, but there is still time for it to turn into a wet evening. I went for a walk this afternoon and it was lovely not to have one eye on the sky watching for rain; there were no threatening clouds at all. I saw a red kite, a buzzard sitting proudly in a hawthorn



bush (it seemed to be enjoying the sun), a kestrel hovering and then 2 more buzzards calling, probably a pair. I noticed there were still lots of hawthorn berries in the hedgerows, in fact I don't think they had been touched. I have only just recently seen and heard redwings and fieldfares but not in great numbers. They would usually eat the berries but I think their arrival from Scandinavia has been hampered by the strong westerly winds that have been predominating our weather system. They may also have had plenty of food over there and so not been in a hurry to migrate. Similarly, I have not seen many blackbirds. Usually, at this time of the year, our resident blackbirds are joined by ones coming from the continent. They too will have been slowed up by the strong winds. One morning towards the end of October we did have a small flock of 6 or 7 blackbirds come to the pond, I fancy they were migrants but they didn't stay for long.

With all the rain we keep having the river levels have been kept high and the water very fast flowing. This makes it difficult, if not impossible, to fish if you are a kingfisher or a little egret. We have seen kingfishers coming to the pond most days; I know we have had a male and a female, not fishing together, but clearly identifiable with the female having orange on the lower bill. They have fished successfully too; with it staying relatively mild the fish are still up near the surface. I am surprised we haven't been visited by a little egret or a heron; I have seen the little egrets hunting in the fields where cattle are or have been.



The hedgehogs are still taking food, but not so regularly now. We invested in a second hedgehog house and I put it at the front of our house. It was soon in use and I am pretty sure that one is now hibernating; I want to look but I don't want to disturb it. The house at the back is being used but I have not looked in recently so I don't know if there is one hibernating;

I put the food out for the hedgehogs just as it's getting dark; when it's been a still dry evening the tawny owls have been very vocal. They have been very close by, it's such a lovely sound, though one evening there was a loud 'kee-wick' call close to me and it nearly made me drop the bowl of hedgehog food.

The strong winds have brought a lot of the deciduous leaves off and branches too and the trees are beginning to look rather bare yet it doesn't seem long ago they were getting their lovely autumn colours. Only 5 weeks to the shortest day! Happy Christmas to you all.
