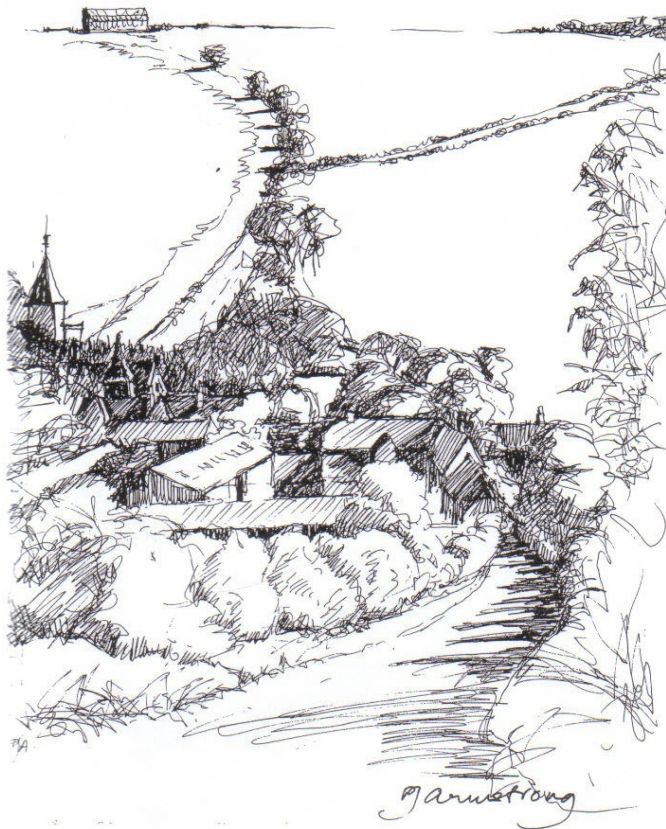

Letter from Bishop Stephen

This month marks two years since my service of inauguration in the Cathedral and so its two years since I first ordained people deacon and priest, a powerful and humbling experience.

June 2024 will see more ordinations and a special service to mark 30 years since the ordination of women to the priesthood on **Saturday 15th June** at 11.00 am in the Cathedral. Everyone is very welcome to attend this service, to give thanks for the gift of women's ministry in this diocese and across the Church. Please join me in praying for all those who are preparing for ordination, as well as those who serve, and have served, in all forms of ministry across the diocese.

At the service for the ordination of deacons, the bishop explains that deacons are 'called to reach into the forgotten corners of the world, that the love of God may be made visible.' Never before has the world been so connected, so visible, with its remotest parts so easy to reach. Yet despite this, many people still feel forgotten and invisible.

Our fast-paced news culture means that stories of suffering, of tragedy or disaster quickly make way for the next headline. The world moves on, but not for those who still dwell, every day, in a place of great difficulty. There will be people around us who have been forgotten and who feel invisible, those who need support but struggle to access it; the lonely, the housebound or those who cannot access technology. You may feel that way yourself.

'Reaching into the forgotten corners' of our world and local communities and making visible the love of God, is a calling to all of us, lay and ordained. This is what we see in Jesus, going to the forgotten places; the forgotten people and showing them that God is with them; that God forgets no-one. Let us, as the church of today, 'Go and do likewise.'

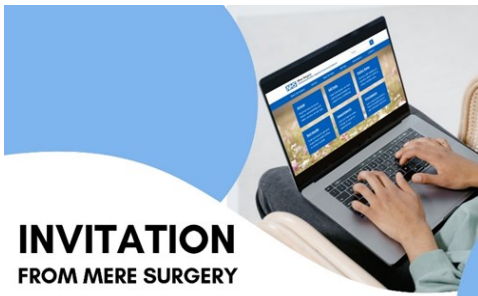

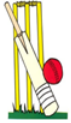

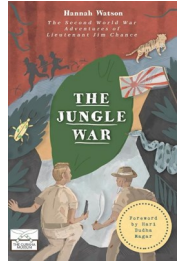

The Jungle War by Hannah Watson

This little gem of a book brings the Burma Campaign to life. Written for 9 to 16-year-olds but eminently readable by all ages the book follows the early military career of Lt Jim Chance and his platoon of Gurkhas. Retreating from the **Sittang Bridge** north through the jungles of Burma he eventually reaches India before returning as part of the first Chindit incursion on **Operation Longcloth** in 1943.



This short historical novel, hopefully the first of a series (the Forgotten War did not end in 1943!), is the brainchild of the BBC, the **Burma Book Club**. First envisaged by Mary-Rose Cooney pre-Covid in the back of a Land Rover whilst we were travelling in the Middle Hills of Nepal, visiting projects with **The Gurkha Welfare Trust**. It was her belief that there were no well-recognised children's books available that told the story of the war in Burma. There is now!

Hannah has created a genuine 'fizzer' with her first venture into historical fiction, both as author and illustrator. Her father-in-law, Rob Lyman, Field Marshal Slim's authorised biographer, has ensured factual rigour, supported by the wealth of material from the **Gurkha Museum** in Winchester. **Dame Joanna Lumley** has given her patronage to this fabulous tale and **Hari Budha Magar**, a former Gurkha and now the renowned double amputee above-the-knee mountaineer has written a compelling foreword. It's a must and available from Amazon. Profits, when distributed, will benefit the Gurkha Museum, The Gurkha Welfare Trust and the **Kohima Educational Trust**. Go on, treat yourself.

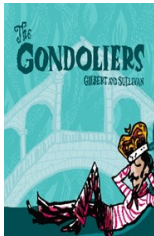

“MAY-be we’ll have a Summer after all!”



With the weather becoming warmer and brighter, residents at LDNH have enjoyed being out in the garden and feeling part of the local community as we walked to the George Inn to attend the monthly coffee morning on Wednesday 8th May. That afternoon, being VE day, residents chatted, reminisced, and sang along with some nostalgic, wartime songs. It was heart-warming to be reminded of how much we each must appreciate the here and now. We have had patriotic celebrations, residents enjoyed hearing the story of St George and some were happy to dress up for a moment, feeling victorious with the dragon around their neck! We also held a wonderful Coronation Anniversary party, with dressing up if residents chose to. They enjoyed singing along with nostalgic British songs and eating delicious snacks prepared by our brilliant kitchen staff. A wonderful experience recently, was a visit from twin baby boys on ‘Baby Day.’ This certainly brought cheer and welcome cuddles with residents and staff alike.

On 16th May, we started a ‘**Dementia Café**’, where the public are welcome to pop in and relax with a free coffee and continental breakfast, on **Thursday mornings, from 9.00 - 11.00 am**. Bring a friend, we would love to see you there.



There are times in our lives when we find ourselves at a low ebb, never a nice feeling. Some will share with family and friends but some will not. Being in crisis is the worst feeling in the world and it can feel so bad at times there seems is no light at the end of the tunnel, sadly, we may know some one who has taken the lonely decision to opt out. Salisbury Samaritans receive over 20,000 over calls a year from people all over the British Isles, from self-harming young people, prisoners, lonely folk who never leave their homes and have no visitors. Farmers too have a high rate of suicide, and young men around the age of 40, people suffering with mental health problems to name but a few. Not every troubled soul looks miserable, we all hide behind a mask. Samaritans listen to all calls. No call is a waste of time. Samaritans are on duty 24 hours a day every day of the year to take your call. We are very keen to promote awareness of our free **help line 116 123** and we are always ready to train new Samaritans in our Salisbury branch. Volunteers give their time freely but to keep Salisbury branch open costs about £52,000 a year, we are desperate for financial support no matter how little. It would be wonderful if villagers and your friends and businesses would help Salisbury branch to continue to listen. Nature Notes

Having had a taste of summer we have now gone back to cooler unsettled weather. There doesn't seem to be an intermediate phase for our weather these days; cool to hot without anything in between. The warmth definitely accelerated the growth of everything especially the grass and the weeds.

We have two nest boxes with great tits in them and they are busy feeding. I knew the beech tree box at the front had great tits in it, but this afternoon I was looking out at the back garden and saw a bird regularly coming and going between the hanging suet block and the old cherry tree box; it was another great tit nesting. We have young blackbirds and robins; a young robin even came into the lounge when we had all the windows and doors open during the heat (fun and games). I also spotted a young house sparrow being fed on the top of the feeder stand. I think there is a family of long-tailed tits around, but they have been keeping to the undergrowth for safety; there is certainly plenty of noise for a family. A pair of bullfinches have been coming to the feeders; it amazes me that with such a big powerful bill they go for the small seed instead of the larger stuff. I spotted a pair of blackcaps at the front of the house.



I saw my first swallow on the 19th April and we now have some swallow activity in the stables, there is guano on the floor beneath where they usually nest. I try to make sure there is black polythene on the ground so I can monitor what is going on. A couple of days later, on the 21st, I heard the sound of house martins coming from the boxes at the front of the house; I always think they sound like budgies. All three boxes have been of some interest in them. Last Saturday I found a house martin on the ground; it wasn't in a good way and checking it over it looked as if it had been attacked. I don't think it was a cat, possibly another house martin competing for the nests. I popped it in a shoe box for a couple of hours but didn't expect it to survive and it didn't. It was carrying at least four keds or louse flies; they revealed themselves once the bird had died. They suck the blood of the host so would have made this house martin weaker. Keds are rather grotesque looking. So far, I haven't seen a swift.

The hedgehogs are feeding well, I am tending to see them more now that the evenings are lighter. However, I still have no idea how many there are in the garden. Longbridge Deverill seems to have a thriving population. I like to encourage them into the garden as they do good unlike the grey squirrel which recently came. I have tried chasing it off but to no avail. I thought I was going to have help from the moorhen as it chased it up the cherry tree this morning but then when the squirrel returned the moorhen lost courage. It is a big squirrel with a splendid tail which makes it look even bigger. The moorhens are nesting; the male tends to chase everything away, even the two big crows which came earlier today, we expect to see moorhen chicks any day now.
