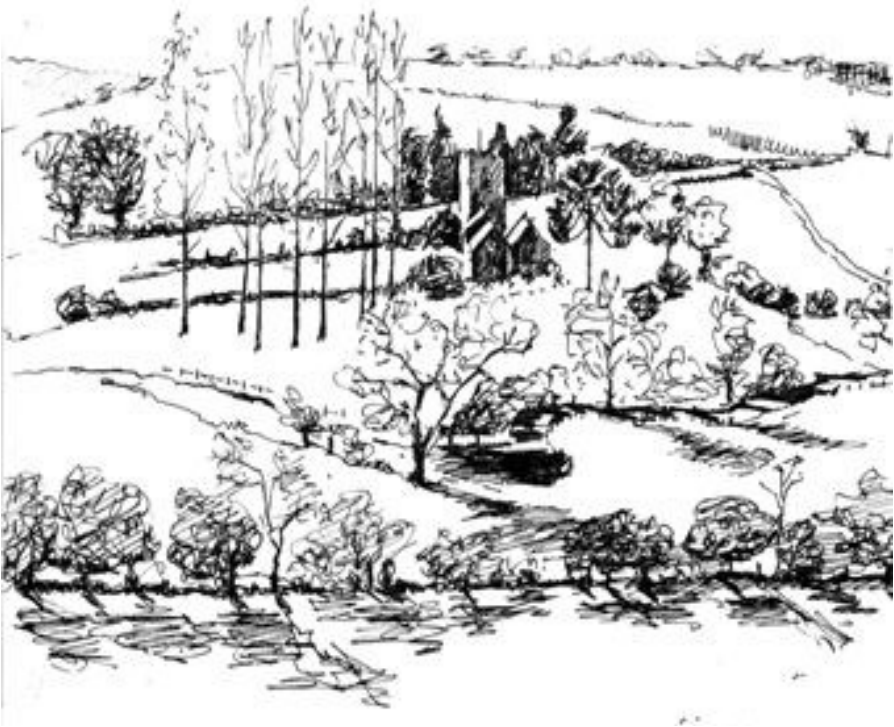

Letter from Bishop Karen - New Horizons

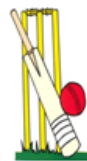

Ragwort – landowners please action

The Government has listed ragwort as one of the five weeds covered by the Weeds Act 1959; stating ragwort is harmful to equines and other animals.

The responsibility for controlling the spread and growth of ragwort rests with the occupier of the land on which ragwort is growing. Government advises that occupiers of all land, (including uncultivated land, derelict and waste areas) should be vigilant for the presence of ragwort. Action to prevent its spread should be taken where ragwort poses a high risk to land used for grazing, or forage production. Livestock owners need to be satisfied that their livestock is not exposed to the risk of ragwort poisoning. In order to prevent ragwort seed production, mowing is at best a short-term measure; as it causes plants to persist and re-grow. Pulling is a more effective strategy; but it is only feasible for small infestations and re-growth can occur from detached roots left in the soil. The Government support strategic management as opposed to last-minute control as the most effective way to manage the growth and spread of ragwort.

Nature Notes

We are not far off the longest day and still the weather is very unsettled. There have been some really cold nights and I am sure broods in nests have suffered losses; although I am seeing and hearing lots of young birds especially blackbirds, robins, and tits, so hopefully any losses are minimal. The great tits in the beech tree box have fledged; judging by the sound of young tits calling for food coming from the beech tree, I reckon there were a good number.



We had a family of long-tailed tits visiting the fat block, I managed to count 7 or 8 but they are continually on the move changing places with one another and not just on the fat block, so there could easily be a dozen (10 plus the adults). There were also young goldfinches who have quickly learned how to feed themselves from the seed feeders; juvenile goldfinches lack the

red head of the adult. A male great spotted woodpecker comes regularly to the fat block; it chisels away a bit of the block and flies off always in the same direction, so presumably back to a nest with young. Perhaps we might be lucky enough to see the young, if the adult brings them to feed here. There has also been a male green woodpecker feeding on the lawn, our lawn is full of ant nests so green woodpecker heaven.

The moorhens produced 3 chicks which we first saw on the 15th May. On the 19th May I spotted both adults walking away from the pond, not long afterwards I realised the pond was empty. I am not sure what happened; I don't think the chicks would have been strong enough to walk far, they had not even been out of the pond at that stage. So, they may well have been predated, plenty of predators about corvids, kites, buzzards, cats. Anyway, the moorhens appear to be on a second brood now; I saw nesting material being taken into the irises and have seen them mating. Maybe they will be more successful this time. The swans on the river have produced 8 cygnets this year; an amazing number.

I heard and saw 3 swifts for the first time on 15th May when I was at Westbury Leigh for my Pilates class but I have only seen and heard them a few times since which I am sure is due to the weather conditions; being insect eaters they need warmth. The house martins are active in the single box with young inside cheeping. One side of the dual nest box is also in use, possibly both sides. The swallows in the stable have built up the nest nearly to the roof so I can't see the adults sitting in the nest or young looking out but something is going on!

The squirrel continues to visit, so far it has been content eating seed on the ground, hopefully that will continue to be the case. The hedgehogs come each evening and clear the bowls, I see them more now.

The kestrel box in the village has been in use for the first time in a while, when checked there were 5 chicks which have since been rung.

A party of 20 gathered at Kingston Deverill Church on the evening of Thursday 2nd May to meet with Jenny Bennett (former BD resident) for a guided Bat Walk. Armed with numerous bat detectors we lingered around Dark Lane and the bridges, moving on later to the ford. A total of 9 species were detected and are listed below: (NB: There are only 18 UK bat species, so a good tally in just a few hours). Common Pipistrelle, Soprano Pipistrelle, Serontine, Natterer's, Brown long-eared, Lesser Horseshoe, Greater Horseshoe, Daubenton's, Noctule. On World Environment Day, there were a few days of multi-sensory activities: exploring Aquatic and Grassland environments, tasting seaweed, smelling essential oils, feeling textures, hearing water sounds, seeing and sorting creatures into the correct environment.



Residents have enjoyed exploring handmade paper from natural materials which was a lovely sensory experience as the papers all look and feel different. It was interesting to try and guess which paper is made from which natural material, the favourites were paper made from: thistle down, old man's beard and bracken. Residents also enjoyed a creative pottery painting workshop, painting their own piece for planting in. We all had a lovely time with the ZOLAB visit, Emily showed us a range of creatures including a giant African snail, Tarantula, Millipede, Leopard Gecko, and corn snake. Surprisingly, many residents were brave enough to hold the snake!

D-Day commemorations

On the 80th anniversary of D-Day, 6th June 1944, several residents of the Upper Deverills mounted a fascinating and poignant display in the village hall of letters, records and artefacts of both their own relatives and villagers at the time. Touching accounts of wartime activities; pages from a busy flying logbook; communications equipment of the period; inspiring narratives of operational action on land, sea and in the air – they were all expertly displayed with clarity and respect. Residents enjoyed a picnic outside the hall before going up to the Beacon which was lit to join others across the country. Our grateful thanks go to the team that assembled the exhibition and organised a memorable event.
