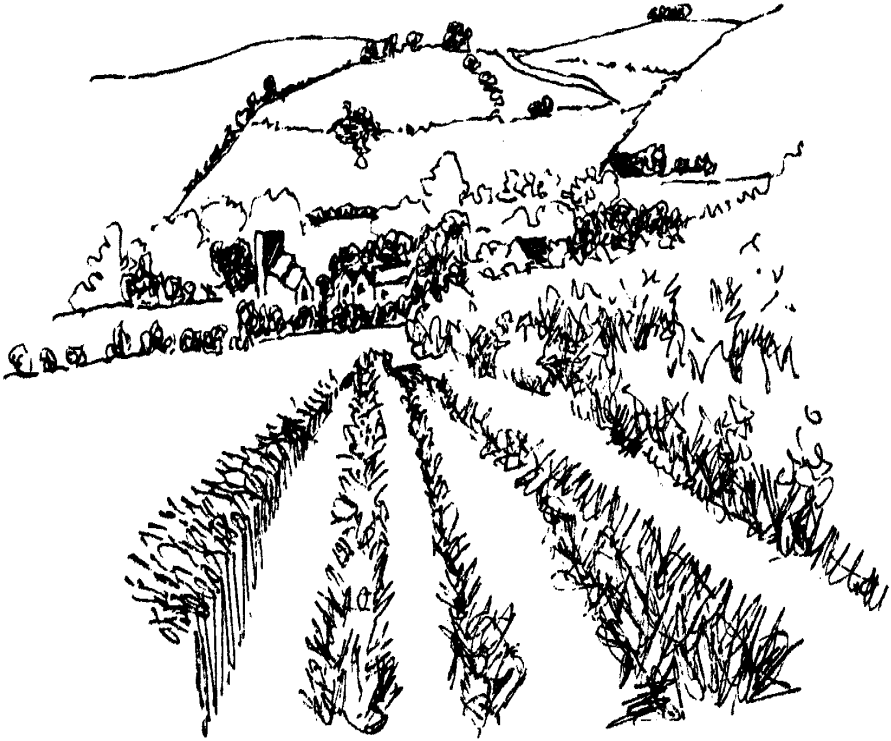

Parish Vacancy – Update

As a parish we have been in Vacancy, without a vicar, since Pauline Reid retired in October last year. The parish services continue as planned with visiting clergy and self-help, a number of baptisms, weddings and funerals are continuing. Work has gone on, across the Benefice with Corsley and Chapmanslade, to prepare a Parish Profile that describes our parishes and the attributes that we seek in a new incumbent.

The process has been hindered by Diocesan financial concerns, as in the past two years we have not paid our full ‘Share’, our contribution to the Diocese to pay for clergy. Therefore, our ability to fund or support a priest has been questioned. There are now some 55 regular givers in our church congregations and the Share request from the Diocese for 2024 was £42,700 – with only 55 contributors and occasional supplement from ‘special’ services like Easter and Christmas, the Diocese is uneasy that our contributions will continue to fall short.

I have been in discussions with Bishop Andrew and the Archdeacon on a way to manage and fund a post for a replacement vicar. We are working on a short term, 3 year, plan to enable the parish to have an incumbent and allow time to address the funding issue.

It is proposed that a new Deanery post is created, a Rural Parish Mission Enabler (RPME), to work in the Heytesbury Deanery, to develop rural churches in their mission. This would be a third role for our vicar (in addition to being the incumbent priest in the 2 parishes). The creation of this post is predicated on a financial grant from the Aldhelm Mission Fund. I will now work with the Archdeacon to develop a funding bid and a job specification with parameters for the working practice for RPME and Benefice priest. This will be a time limited post that needs additional external funding, but will enable us to pay less share and still recruit a new priest. I envisage the funding request being submitted by Christmas and, if successful, a job advert could be published in the Spring. Therefore, we are likely to remain in vacancy until at least the Summer next year. With the Parochial Church Council, I remain committed to ensuring the continued life of our churches.

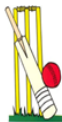

Flood Guidance



On 26th June, Councillor Belinda Stewart-Cox attended Wiltshire Council's Operational Flood Working Group on behalf of the Upper Deverills. As you know, there were major floods in 2023/4 thanks to Storms Babet and Henk, and the rain in between. Over 300 houses were badly flooded in Wiltshire. The Council is working hard to clear drains before next winter. Wiltshire Council has received an extra £1million to do that, and now have more gully tankers, jettors and CCTV units working somewhere in south Wiltshire every 3-weeks.

Reporting flood incidents: to make it more likely Wiltshire Council will send a drainage team to the Deverill Valley, incidents should be reported when they occur via the MyWilts webpage, with map/location and photographic evidence www.wiltshire.gov.uk/mywilts-online-reporting. But please also send your reports to the Parish Council so we have a full record of incidents which we can use to nag the Council if need be (the term used by the head of the drainage team). If a cluster of incidents are reported in this valley, it is more cost-effective, and therefore more likely, the drainage team will tackle them together. Plus, if Wiltshire Council has a well-documented record of floods, it helps them apply for more central government funding to deal with the problem.

DEFRA's Property Flood Resilience (PFR) Scheme: communities, or village clusters, experiencing regular flooding can apply for a £5,000 grant to help rectify the problem, e.g. repair drains or cut new grips, but this requires a suitably qualified surveyor to assess the problem and recommend a solution. If private land is involved, written permission is needed from the landowner. This scheme is proving an administrative headache.

Insuring flood-risk properties: this can be difficult or expensive. According to the Pewsey councillor there are ways round this. Please let Jamie Fagan (details page 14) know if you have problems insuring your property because it is at risk of flooding in practice or it's mapped in a flood zone. If many people in the Deverills have this problem, we could arrange an advisory talk on what to do or if a few people are affected, I can ask to put them in touch with the Pewsey councillor.

Fieldwork at the River Wylye

We are looking for some new Governors



We currently have three vacancies on our Governing Board and we are really eager to encourage members of the local community to think about whether they would like to fill these roles. The three core strategic functions of the school's Governing Body are: To ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction; To hold the Head to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils; To oversee the financial performance of the school and ensure all funds are appropriately allocated.

School Governors work in partnership with the Head, Nic Ilic, and teaching staff to ensure the children's educational experience and achievements are the very best they can be. The Governors relationship with the school's leadership team involves challenging existing processes to drive school improvement. In addition, as a church school our Foundation Governors ensure the school is meeting the expectations of SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican & Methodist Schools).

Currently there are 9 Governors from various backgrounds including parents, teachers, grandparents and members of the local community. Governors do not run the school day to day, their role is at the strategic or policy-making level. You do not need experience in education to be a Governor. Governing bodies tend to be skills-based, the range of skills needed is wide. Common sense and everyday experience of education are as valuable as finance or legal skills, we value the wide range of experience and skills all Governors bring. All training is free and mainly given online. Governors serve for a 4 year term and it does take up time. We have about nine monthly Governing body meetings each year, a maximum of 1 hour, in addition each Governor has a specific area of focus requiring an additional input and meetings with either members of the staff team, or fellow Governors.

Nature Notes



Today, 15th July, is St. Swithin's Day and according to folk-lore if it rains on St. Swithin's Day then it will rain for the next forty days. Let's hope it doesn't! We certainly seem to be having plenty today. Of course, we need the rain to make everything grow; it's a shame it can't just rain overnight and be dry during the day. With the weather being so unsettled I have not seen many butterflies, in fact, it is quite noteworthy when I do see one. The Butterfly Conservation's Big Butterfly Count is on at the moment (12th July to 4th August) and I fear the numbers will be rather low this year.

The moorhens produced a second lot of chicks; at first on the 30th June I thought there were only 3, like the first brood but by 2nd July I counted 6 chicks on the raft with one of the adults. It all looked so lovely and peaceful but it did not last. I soon realised both parents had deserted the pond and there were 3 chicks left that were obviously distressed. I am pretty sure one of the chicks was had by a neighbour's cat and I saw another of our local cats disappearing up the garden with a chick in its mouth. I could see the chick was alive so I zoomed out and was surprised to find the cat had just dropped it under the laburnum and it was making quite a racket. I picked it up quickly and brought it inside. It appeared to be unhurt and for the next couple of days I tried to get it to feed but sadly no luck. It was so young, just hatched and still had the egg tooth on its beak, which is used to break out of the shell. I don't know what happened to the third chick but I can guess. This pair of moorhens we have got are really bad parents and probably new to the whole game. However, they are back again and I have seen them gathering nesting material, maybe it'll be 3rd time lucky.

On a brighter note we have had swallows nesting successfully in the stables. I think there have been 2 active nests; I kept looking at the well-established nest by the light fitting, not seeing much because the nest has been built up so high, but then I spotted 4 young swallows sitting on the edge of a nest looking down at me on the lefthand side of the stable. All three of the house martin nests are in use and I know at least one brood has flown and I can hear chicks being fed in another as I write. I have seen more swifts in the last month, over the river and cress beds and in town, but not in great numbers.



I have seen more of the hedgehogs, yesterday evening there was a big hog and 2 little ones under the feeders, probably a sow with her piglets. Then when I went to put the food down in the feeding stations, I found a youngster in each waiting for the bowl! They are quite used to me now and have me well trained!

This morning a roe buck was in the garden again; he has 3 points on his antlers, meaning he is fully grown, and has just finishing moulting. He will be in the rutting season now, mid-July to mid-August.
