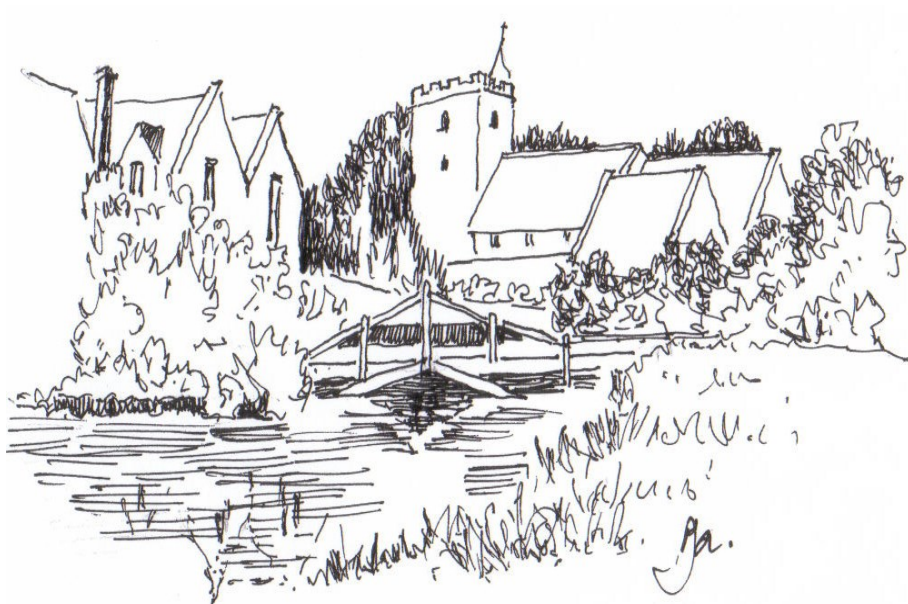

## A Gift to the Church



I write this the day after the funeral of the Rt Revd Mark Santer, former Principal of Westcott House Theological College and Bishop of Birmingham, theologian, and pastor. Mark ended his life and ministry in this diocese, with permission to officiate he continued to serve these last few years in the parish church of St Aldhelm's, Branksome. His funeral at the church was a wonderful celebration of a life well lived, of his rich ministry and the gift of friendship.

We have just under four hundred active retired clergy in the Salisbury diocese. Priests and deacons who have not only served for many years in stipendiary or self-supporting ministry in dioceses, right across the Church of England and overseas, but who are willing to continue to offer their talents and experience to us here. Bishop Andrew and I with our secretaries manage the renewal of their permission to officiate every three years, and new safeguarding training and DBS checks are part of this. This is a tremendous commitment and a gift to the church for which we must be truly thankful. We also, as bishops, meet all those retired clergy moving in to make sure they feel welcomed and supported with ongoing support offered through our network of deanery retirement officers, and diocesan retired clergy officer.

Many of our retired clergy are involved in active ministry in their local church, as well as taking funerals and weddings; others offer spiritual direction, mentoring and coaching or act as reviewers for our ministry review scheme or as deanery and diocesan retirement officers, regularly staying connected with those with PTO and retired clergy who are inactive. This is all a very real reflection of the fact that God continues to use us in many and varied ways throughout our life. Indeed, Bishop Mark preached his final sermon on Easter Sunday at the age of eighty-six! 1st October is the International Day of Older Persons. A day to celebrate the gifts of all those who continue to show us the love of God through their generosity, positivity, and humility. If you include yourself here, thank you!

## Upper Deverills Parish Council



The Wiltshire Council Local Footways and Highways improvement group for the Warminster area met on 4th September. At the request of the Parish Council they continue the process of considering Brixton Deverill for a potential 20 mph zone. Wiltshire Council intend to conduct further road surveys in September as part of their assessment. We hope to have their findings by December. Kingston Deverill and Monkton Deverill were also both considered as part of this process but failed to meet the established criteria.

## Upper Deverills Community Speedwatch



The team has been very active in the valley. Over the last six months we have conducted over 50 hours of monitoring, logging 188 speeding vehicles. On 5th September a Wiltshire Police Community Speed Enforcement Officer caught 10 vehicles speeding in Brixton Deverill. Depending on previous convictions and history, all 10 drivers will be offered a speed awareness course and proceedings will now be undertaken to ensure the most appropriate outcome for the offenders takes place. Data from the police regarding warning letters sent to speeders since July 2020 also makes interesting reading: First letter: 3,054, Second: 408, Third: 126. After a third letter the vehicle owner may be referred to the Community Policing Team for further action.

This is the 14th edition of the calendar, although it becomes more difficult each year to produce a different collection of views, I hope the images do justice to this lovely part of Wiltshire. There are snowdrops at Kingston Deverill featured and on the cover a view from Brimsdown Hill of the fields near Maiden Bradley. It is in the usual format coming with a sturdy mailing envelope.

Last year, 639 copies of the calendar were sold and, when combined with sales of the Nadder Valley Calendar, the total amount raised was just over **£6,800**. All of this money supports the overseas programmes of Hope and Homes for Children, in Eastern Europe, Southern and East Africa and South Asia. The charity remains committed to the belief that every child deserves love and to belong to a safe family home, never the abuse and neglect suffered in orphanages. Since 1994 they have worked with the UN, EU and local and national governments worldwide to close the doors of orphanages forever. Closing an orphanage means finding a loving family for every single child in that orphanage, meeting each of their needs, every time.

## Nature Notes

It feels more like October than September to me at the moment. Last night was really cold for this time of the year with just a touch of frost on the lawn around the back of the house which faces north. With such a cold clear night and not a cloud in the sky this morning, brilliant sunshine and hardly a breath of wind, it was just perfect for the balloons to take off from Longleat. Sadly, they went south and missed coming over the village but I saw a good number from my bedroom window.



I think the swallows and house martins feel it's later in the year as it seems most of them have started their journey south already. The stable feels very empty but they have certainly left their mark with a lot of guano on the floor and everywhere! I would love to know how many young flew from there, my guess is about twelve or more. The house martin nests at the front of the house are quiet now; this will be the first time since the end of April typing these notes without their chattering in the background. The other evening I wondered if I had heard a house martin in one of the nests, possible if one is migrating south from up country and using one of our boxes as an overnight stop. The swifts have long since departed.

The moorhens continue to keep us entertained. Sadly, the four chicks were reduced to two; we don't know what happened. These two were doing well until our neighbour's cat had one which we witnessed one evening. But the remaining youngster is doing fine and is out on the pond with the two adults. It's almost as big as the female and I find I now have to take a closer look to see which is which. They don't always stay here, they have taken to going off for the day and coming back in the evening; having bed and breakfast here!

The hedgerows are looking good with rosehips and blackberries. I associate an autumn hedgerow with red admiral butterflies but sadly there aren't many around. Yesterday one landed on the cover of the rotary washing line and stayed there for some time sunning itself and possibly taking in salts from the surface. I am still not seeing many wasps and there haven't been many dragonflies and damselflies out on the pond. I think the reduced number of insects will mean a reduction in pollination and fruit setting.



Most evenings we see at least one hedgehog out under the feeders before I go out to put the food in the feeding stations. A regular hedgehog comes to the rear feeding station and is often waiting for me to put the food in there; it's got quite use to me and tolerates my proximity. I think the small hedgehogs may have moved on to find new territories. Yesterday walking to the shop, I spotted a dead hedgehog along Sand Street. It looked quite big so I am surprised it was not seen; they have a habit of freezing in headlights making them vulnerable.
