Known Unto God



The Somme battlefield takes you by surprise. Visitors pull into a car park in a quiet lane and wander into what looks like a leafy National Trust property. A few yards in, though, and you see the trenches. Gently undulating now, softened by time, but unmistakably the dreadful, snaking pits of our imagination. The Somme, of course, is a river: but, for the last century, a name inseparable from the battle that claimed 60,000 young British lives on its first day.

Scattered about the fields nearby are dozens of small cemeteries, of which the majority, with telling anonymity, commemorate simply 'A soldier of the Great War'. I recently had the opportunity to visit this intense landscape for the first time and the impression made was deep indeed. Most affecting, I think, was an inscription that will be familiar to many on these nameless stones: 'Known Unto God'. However war may distort the human image, those three words underscore that its dignity is a divine gift that even the most appalling tragedies cannot erase.

In this month of recollection, as we give thanks for all those gone before us, the idea that each of them – and us – is 'known unto God' is a deep consolation. May each of you find peace in this remembrance.

Bridleways The Wiltshire Council consultation into the proposed changes to three bridleways on Woodcombe Farm, Brixton Deverill, has now closed. The routes affected are those that have been used unofficially for decades by riders, walkers and bikers. The proposed changes would make them official. Wiltshire Council received 83 responses in total; 73 in favour, five no objections, and five objections. The plan to modify these rights of way will now be reviewed by Wiltshire Council's Highways Department.

Neighbourhood Watch

Neighbourhood Watch in our Parish is a voluntary membership system aimed at helping all within our community, whether private individuals or businesses, feel more secure. It does this by encouraging everyone to take an informed interest in what is going on around them. In essence this means 'watching each others' backs'. The scheme produces regular updates on policing issues and security, aimed to make people aware of local crime and to help reduce its incidence and impact.



You can sign up yourself online, to receive official Neighbourhood Alert messages directly via email. These alerts cover a wide range of general and more specific concerns. There are often special offers of Police-approved security products for homes or business premises, sometimes offered free or at greatly reduced prices. An example is the Selecta DNA marking system for valuables.

The local NW coordinator is Crispian Beattie. He reads all of the various alert messages and Police bulletins and passes on periodic email updates to those who want them, summarising issues or trends that may be of interest. He also keeps in close touch with the local Wiltshire Police representatives. Issues that may concern the Parish Council or other voluntary bodies are referred to them, as appropriate. A telephone call to 999 for genuine emergencies and to 101 for other less urgent issues related to law and order remains the most prompt and efficient means of contacting the Emergency Services.

Flooding this winter 2024

As we all see on the news and weather forecasts many more places in the UK are at risk of flooding, as has been seen throughout this year at various times. This is more often now due to flooding from groundwater as the land is saturated and the water tables are rising, as well as rising river levels.



Please ensure any drains and ditches that are your responsibility are kept clear. It is the homeowner's duty to protect their home from flooding. Where possible, the Council, Emergency Services and Environment Agency will help, but if flooding is over a large area, they may not be able to respond.

We should all be vigilant to the condition of drains and storm drains that are not necessarily our responsibility, if you can safely clear these drains when clogged with mud and debris please do, it may well reduce the likelihood of certain areas and homes from flooding.

Points to consider in case your home is flooded: Store important items and documents in waterproof containers at the highest point of your property. Make sure all electrical appliances, mains gas, electricity and water are turned off. Plug sinks, baths and showers and weigh the plug down to prevent back flow. If possible move as much furniture as you can upstairs or raise off the floor. Check your property insurance. Make an emergency flood kit including blankets, warm/waterproof clothing, bottled water, food, torches, a first aid kit and ensure your mobile phone is fully charged.

Do you know your flood risk? Check if you are at risk of flooding by looking at Flood risk mapping for long term planning and Flood Warning services and River level service which give real time information about flood impacts. Sign up to receive free flood warnings for main rivers and groundwater. Sign up to the Met Office National severe Weather Warning Service via web or app to find out about weather conditions. Call floodline on 0345 988 1188 or visit www.gov.uk/flood and www.gov.uk/check-flooding.

Warminster and Westbury Talking Newspaper

Founded in 1982 on a initiative from the respected Presidents of Warminster and Westbury Rotary, who both wanted a project during their presidential year, it became the birth of the Talking Newspaper movement. They approached me to research it and set it up and I have been involved ever since! Initially recorded on magnetic tapes but with the march of time there was a need to convert to USB memory sticks. There are currently 50 volunteers undertaking a variety of production jobs, producing, editing, fast copying and reading, who produce a weekly edition for 23 customers based on articles from the Warminster Journal and Wiltshire Times. Production is done in St Johns Church Hall, Boreham road every Saturday morning (no editions over Christmas). Our customers get a memory stick reader on loan when they are signed up and the Post Office deliver the memory stick pouches free of charge.

Longbridge Nursing Home 'Love to Move'

Residents have thoroughly enjoyed the start of the British Foundations 'Love to Move' programme. Which is a new 12 week programme being rolled out in Wiltshire, offering much needed and beneficial physical and cognitive exercises to music, with fun and interactive games and actions to songs, starting in care homes, then reaching out to broader communities. During this programme, our activities providers at Longbridge Deverill Nursing Home will become qualified to then continue offering these meaningful activities to all. Music, dance, meaningful actions to rhythm and lyrics as well as the cognitive involvement all allows residents to engage in the physically and mentally stimulating activity. Each session shows visible evidence of improved mood, self-confidence, interactive social engagement, and general sense of wellbeing. It provides opportunities for residents to meet and socialise in a relaxed, fun environment. It's been a really enjoyable experience, and we hope to continue offering this on a regular basis to all residents who wish to participate.



Nature Notes



We seem to have lost the moorhens now. The family of three, the two adults and the surviving youngster, were quite at home until the number of pheasants visiting increased. At first there was just a cock pheasant and he and the moorhens tolerated one another, but he invited his friends! Quite often there are half a dozen out there, usually cocks but occasionally several hens. Yesterday morning was the last time I saw the male moorhen; he tried to hang on but I saw him going away with two cock pheasants following as if they were escorting him off the premises. I doubt if we will see any moorhens now until early spring, I hope the youngster survives. I expect it's missing the nest here the adults made on the edge of the irises where it loved to sit.

I have yet to hear or see any redwings; they should be arriving very soon from Scandinavia, the fieldfares usually follow. Birds are coming and birds are leaving. Just over a week ago I spotted a small flock of hirundines moving south for the winter. Some of the warblers that normally migrate south are choosing to stay here for the winter; blackcaps and chiffchaffs. I have actually heard chiffchaffs calling recently perhaps a sign of global warming.

In the evenings when I go out to feed the hedgehogs I have heard tawny owls, they were especially vocal last night. Autumn is when they establish their territories; the youngsters will be setting them up whilst the adults will be holding on to what they have got. It was a still evening last night so the calls carried well and most importantly no rain. Owl feathers are designed for hunting, soft and fluffy, so quiet when stalking prey but not waterproof, so the wet weather we have been having is no good at all for owls.



There are not so many birds feeding in the garden now, some have moved into the fields but there is a visiting sparrowhawk. Today I heard a small commotion in the hedge next to me; the birds were obviously alarmed at something. When I looked into the hedge I could see a large bird moving about and a few seconds later a sparrowhawk flew away. I don't think it had anything in its talons and was not put off by me, it has quite often flown right past almost touching me.

The hedgehogs are still eating well building themselves up for the winter hibernation. I have put straw in the two houses this time as it will keep drier and give better warmth rather than the hay I used last year. So far, the houses have not been used. We spotted one small hedgehog out during the day looking for food, I was able to get close to it and managed to put some food down next to it which amazingly it accepted. Sometimes it can freak them out when I get that close. Last night I managed to feed it again
