## Jack Spratt's scrap heap clock

To St Andrew's, Wootton Rivers, and an invitation to place the first signature in their new visitor's book, after the sixty-year service of its predecessor.

These volumes are found in most village churches and remain a quiet record of the thousands who call into our places of worship, usually unseen, and leave their appreciation with a word or two and, often as not, a coin in the box or a tap on the e-reader!



In Wootton Rivers, they will find in the porch a beautiful board telling the story of local character Jack Spratt, who achieved fame by constructing a church clock made entirely from local scrap to commemorate the coronation of George V in 1911.

As a new installation was too costly, handyman Jack invited villagers to leave him their spare bits and bobs and proceeded to make a clock that ran (and still runs) with pin-point accuracy. Instead of numerals on its face, the tower clock reads 'Glory be to God'.

This eccentric and appealing project bears witness to the steady Anglican faith and resourcefulness vital for our churches to thrive and survive. Also, to the creator God whose spirit can work within us to make something wonderful from the scraps and times of our lives. To him be the glory.

## Compline - Return of a tradition

Following the series of Compline services in Lent and Holy Week, some people expressed an interest in continuing the ancient evening office of the church. There will therefore be a regular Compline on the first



Tuesday evening of each month in addition to the regular Sunday services. The tradition of saying or singing Compline goes back to at least the 6th century when Saint Benedict introduced Compline as an extra final 'office' for prayer, observed at the end of the day. In monastic traditions, Compline marks the beginning of the 'Great Silence', during which members of the community remain silent until the first service of the following day. In recognition of this, it is traditional to leave the service in silence. The Order of Compline which we will be using is included in the Church of England's Common Worship and is one of quiet contemplation which lasts for about 20 minutes, you will be very welcome to join us in the church of St Michael the Archangel, Brixton Deverill starting on **Tuesday 3rd June at 7.00 pm.**

## Dorothy House Hospice Midnight Walk

### **Women get together for Dorothy House Hospice Care and take on the Midnight Walk in Bath!**



The Midnight Walk is returning for another year in Bath as Hospices, including Dorothy House, are facing unprecedented financial challenges across the UK. That is why the Dorothy House Hospice Care is asking the local community to come together and take on this fantastic fundraising event full of walking, talking and dancing.

The Midnight Walk is for anyone aged 12+ and starts at the Bath Pavilion. Arrival is from 9.00 pm, with time to enjoy drinks, food, fun and a funky warm-up with Cheryl Sprinkler from Mojo Moves. Those taking on the 10K walk will set off at 10.30 pm, followed by the 5K walkers who will head out at 10.45 pm, enjoying the sights of Bath on a during wonderful summer night!

This year's theme is again all about pyjamas – it will be the biggest PJ party in town! The Hospice is looking for people to get into the bedtime spirit by snuggling into their own pyjamas, onesies or dressing gowns or upcycle some gorgeous nightwear from one of the Dorothy House shops!

In the UK there are 5.8 million unpaid carers providing care to their loved ones, with over 59% of those being women. Part of the message behind this year's Midnight Walk is to show solidarity to all those unpaid carers in our community. Unpaid carers work together with the Dorothy House team, including the Hospice at Home Carers, to provide support for the entire family.

Over the past three years, the cost of running Dorothy House has risen from £46,000 a day to £52,000 a day. Fundraising done as part of the Midnight Walk will help fund Dorothy House's Hospice at Home Carers. The Hospice is asking each walker to aim to raise a minimum of £50, which could fund two hours of overnight care, provided by one of the charity's compassionate, skilled and experienced Hospice at Home carers. These Hospice at Home Carers support patients and their families, keeping the patient as comfortable as possible within a familiar setting. At the very end of life, our team will work with the family to agree several visits to meet the patient's personal care and emotional support needs.

## Wildlife and Conservation Group

Bluebells are one of an English spring's great spectacles, briefly transforming our woodlands into magical blue-carpeted glades and Wiltshire boasts some of the finest displays in the country.

On a bright Saturday morning at the end of April, eight members of the Wildlife and Conservation Group set off from Kingston Deverill to explore the ancient Bidcombe Wood, a hidden gem high on the ridge beyond Milldown and Cold Kitchen Hill. The climb was well worth it; the wood offered an unspoiled display of Bluebells and Wild Garlic in full bloom. Some walkers retraced their steps, while others continued through Pottle Street to Horningsham, rounding off a memorable walk with a delicious lunch at the Bath Arms.



## Nature Notes

Thank goodness we had the rain on Tuesday, our rain gauge recorded an inch. No surprise, it was so heavy and deafening standing in the conservatory with the plastic roof; it was hailstones at that point! Now we are due to have warm sunny weather for the next week or so. Already there are warnings of possible drought for the summer and we should conserve the water we have.



Looking at the pond recently there were loads of tadpoles and there are still a good number now which are getting bigger but I can't see any legs yet. During the rain, I spotted movement at the top end of the pond and saw three or four amphibians taking advantage of the wetness to leave but when it stopped and the sun came out one changed its mind and jumped back in!

The moorhens are nesting, taking nesting material into the irises and mating on numerous occasions. The eggs are incubated for about three weeks and looking back in my diary we could have chicks any day now. I fear they may have a short life as there are so many predators around. I have caught a heron looking in the irises on several occasions, there are a pair of crows, a family of magpies and also several cats. The male moorhen is good at standing up to the crows and the magpies. We shoo away the heron when we see it. The birds collectively sound off alarm calls if a cat is about; the pheasants are particularly good at this.



The swallow's nest has three beaks poking out of it. On 28th April two house martins looked at boxes on the front of the house, we didn't see them for a while but they are back again. I heard and saw three swifts in town on the 1st May, which I think is earlier than usual, and I have since seen the odd one when driving home. Hopefully their numbers will increase; a sound of summer.

The great tits are busy in the beech tree nest box entering and leaving, as the chicks grow the demand for food increases and the parents have a real job on their hands or should I say beaks! We have house sparrows in the swift box at the back of the house who will soon be fledging. There are house sparrow nests in the honeysuckle on the end of the house. House sparrows are now on the UK Red List, but we seem to have a thriving population around here.



We haven't released any overwintering butterflies from the garage this year indicating falling numbers. I have seen a good number of orange tips, a gatekeeper and a blue but very few in comparison to past years but it is still early so time for numbers to rise. The queen wasp tally is now twenty-four.

I saw a mallard duck with three very young ducklings, first I have seen this year, they were in the road so I waited for her to lead them to safety.
