## A letter from Bishop Karen

Some of the joys of a bishop's ministry are Confirmation Services; we have had a good number so far this year and many more in the diary. The service is both corporate, as the congregation prays for each candidate, and personal, as each candidate makes promises, is prayed for and is anointed with oil. The words of the anointing remind all of us who have been confirmed God calls us by name.



## Nature Notes

We have lost the summer-like weather and today it's trying to make up for the lack of rain. The lawn was getting rather parched but it's now lovely and green, as is all the other vegetation.



I reckon the dry weather was good for newly fledged birds and this wetter cooler episode is the complete opposite. I was watching the great tits in the beech tree box when they fledged one evening mid-week when it was windy, wet and quite cool. I had hoped they would wait until the morning, when there might have been better conditions, but when they decide to go, they go. I have since heard young tits calling so hopefully some of them survived. The family of blue tits fledged around the same time. Everything in nature is so weather dependent.

The swallows have excelled themselves this year; on the morning 28th May I looked in the stables to see 6 youngsters sitting on the canes I had placed across the corner for them. I haven't managed to count 6 again for over a week now, it's usually 4. Hopefully, the other 2 are out flying with the parents but I know it's unlikely all 6 will survive. I think both compartments of the house martin dual nestbox are in use but there are no chick sounds yet. Across the road a pair of house martins are busy constructing a new nest which is good; so far I have still not seen many swifts which is concerning as I know they are having trouble.



We have a good number of young house sparrows. I am aware of at least 5 nests and possibly more in the honeysuckle on the end of the house. There have been young goldfinches on the feeders, but no young robins or blackbirds, perhaps I have just missed them. The ground has been so hard and difficult for them to find worms and such but there has been plenty of insects.

The moorhens produced 7 chicks, which I counted on Sunday 25th May, the parents were feeding them nicely on the pond up until Friday 30th but by 9.30 am I realised the pond was empty. The odd chick had come out of the pond to follow a parent onto the grass but I was surprised they left so soon, they seemed too young. In the afternoon one of the parents returned briefly. Then in the evening both parents came back bringing one chick with them. I heard chick noises coming from somewhere close by and finally located 4 on a neighbour's doorstep and managed to get them into a bucket and back to the parents on the pond when it was almost dark. The next morning there were 5 chicks with an adult on the pond but then I saw her moving them back towards the nearby creek and we haven't seen the chicks since, only one adult.

The garden smells lovely at the moment with a trough of dianthus flowering at the front, a yellow summer jasmine and a philadelphus at the back and a honeysuckle is coming out at the front and side of the house.

## Longbridge Deverill Parish Council Ragwort – landowners please action



The Government has listed ragwort as one of the five weeds covered by the **Weeds Act 1959**; which states that ragwort is harmful to equines and other animals. Please see [www.gov.uk/guidance/stop-ragwort-and-other-harmful-weeds-from-spreading](http://www.gov.uk/guidance/stop-ragwort-and-other-harmful-weeds-from-spreading).



The responsibility for controlling the spread and growth of ragwort rests with the occupier of the land on which ragwort is growing. Government advises that occupiers of all land, (including uncultivated land, derelict and waste areas) should be vigilant for the presence of ragwort. Action

to prevent its spread should be taken where ragwort poses a high risk to land used for grazing, or forage production. Livestock owners need to be satisfied that their livestock is not exposed to the risk of ragwort poisoning. In order to prevent ragwort seed production, mowing is at best a short-term measure; as it causes plants to persist and re-grow. Pulling is a more effective strategy; however, it is only feasible for small infestations and re-growth can occur from detached roots left in the soil. The Government support strategic management as opposed to last-minute control, as the most effective way to manage the growth and spread of ragwort.

## Upper Deverills Parish Council Parish Council Elections



Like many other Parishes in Wiltshire we were due to hold elections on 1st May 2025. There were four registered candidates for five places. Consequently, the existing four Councillors were appointed unopposed. In addition, Angie Beloe has been coopted as a new Parish Councillor, details of all Parish Councillors are on page 14.

### Culvert repair on B3095

Parish Councillors met with our Wiltshire Council Highways Engineer and some local residents in April. As a consequence a damaged culvert under the B3095 in Monkton Deverill was repaired by Wiltshire Council in early June.

### Rights of way



On 5th March, Wiltshire Council's Western Area Planning Committee met to review the proposed amendments to three bridledways on Woodcombe Farm, Brixton Deverill. Two of the amendments (to BDev2 + BDev16) aim to make official the unofficial bridledways that many people have been using for decades. The third amendment, to BDev1, would divert the bridledway to the track around the edge of the field which is already in customary use. In addition, there is a fourth proposal to extend the dead-end bridledway (BDev9) so that it loops back to BDev2 to make a fully functional right of way. However, this will come into effect only if the diversion order for the three other bridledway amendments is confirmed. This practical plan was overwhelmingly supported at both the consultation and application phases by right of way users. Wiltshire Council's Planning Committee also gave its unanimous support for the proposed modifications with two councillors expressing incredulity and dismay that this long overdue amendment to three anomalous rights of way had been opposed by anyone. Because the plan was still opposed by the Open Spaces Society, Wiltshire Council is legally obliged to refer it to the planning inspectorate and thereafter to the Secretary of State for official approval. Consequently, this simple revision of three outdated rights of way is expected to take another 12-18 months to be approved.
