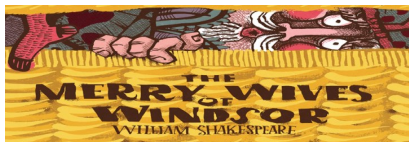

An update of the Vacant Rector's Post

The Parish of the Deverills and Horningsham has now been without a priest since October 2023 and we will remain 'In Vacancy' for the foreseeable future. The post has been advertised twice in the last year and there have been no applicants. After the most recent advert, which closed in June, and following discussions with the Diocese and the Archdeacon we are pausing recruitment, to review the post, job specification and Parish Profile. We hope to be able to readvertise the vacancy in the autumn.

Meanwhile, with the help of a number of retired priests from Warminster and with my role as a Licensed Lay Minister we continue to conduct the usual pattern of services, as listed on pages 8 and 9 of this magazine. Additionally, we have started a monthly Compline service (short reflective evening worship) at Brixton Deverill and continue weekly Morning Prayer at Kingston Deverill. We have had a number of baptisms in our churches this year and in August there will be two weddings.

In the autumn we will have services to be taken by Andrew, Bishop of Ramsbury, on **Sunday 19th October** at Kingston and Louise, the new Archdeacon of Wilts, on **Sunday 30th November** at Horningsham.

We continue to maintain our four Grade 2 listed churches in the parish, which have a number of major repairs looming and we also pay our parish Share. 'Share' is the set contribution levied on each parish by the Salisbury Diocese to pay for clergy, stipend, training, housing and pension. The contribution from our parish is £3,500 per month. With an average weekly congregation of less than 25 people who contribute to the church finances and monthly outgoings for electricity, insurance, repairs and the Share our monthly expenditure exceeds our income and we are now using our reserves, this is not sustainable and we will need to review our position. In the parish we remain legally responsible for the upkeep of the churches, for which there is some external funding from Friends of the Deverill Churches and the Thynne Trust and the 50/50 Club BUT we also need to pay monthly utility bills, insurance and the Share to show that we have the resources to support a priest.

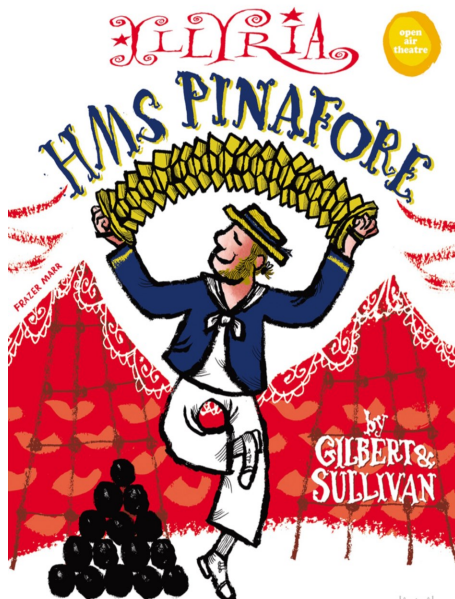

Nature Notes

I hope you all managed to cope with the most recent heatwave. The lawns have not and things are looking parched again. Grass in general is not growing through lack of rain meaning there won't be much silage or hay made. The straw gathered in will be less too as crops will be thinner and there is not so much grown now either. So overall the food available as winter feed will be down. There is still time for that to be improved on in August and September if there is enough rain for the grass to grow.

The hot weather has brought out the butterflies, I have seen a lot more this year than last, brimstone, peacock, red admiral, comma and gatekeeper plus whites but so far no small tortoiseshell. I have also seen a hummingbird hawkmoth several times,



usually in the evenings when I out am watering. Butterfly Conservation will hold their annual butterfly count from 18th July - 10th August this year, with favourable weather there should be good numbers recorded; last year the counts were right down.

In the stables we had another swallow nest in use, I counted 3 beaks poking out on Saturday morning, 12th July, at the height of the heatwave; in the afternoon I could see no movement so hoped they were just dozing. The following morning I found 5 dead swallow chicks on the floor of the stable underneath the nest. I'm pretty sure they succumbed to the excessive heat. We have since seen a swallow back in the stable and yesterday an adult was sitting up in the original nest that produced 6 youngsters earlier, so hopefully we may have another brood.

Both the compartments of the dual house martin nest box have been used but I have no idea how many successfully fledged but it's good they have been used. I saw an adult coming out of the nearest side to me, so they could be having a second brood. Like the swallow nest, house martin nests are susceptible to overheating.

I am pleased to report I have seen swifts in the village and in town since I last wrote. One evening here, when it was looking rather stormy, I kept hearing swifts but at first couldn't see any. There were swallows and house martins and then looking higher up I could just make them out darting around feeding, I reckoned about 50. There were obviously a lot of insects; I have heard they accumulate on the edge of a front and the swifts, swallows and house martins were making the most of it.



A young great spotted woodpecker has been feeding on the fat block, easily identified by the red cap on the head. There have also been green woodpeckers in the garden, especially on the warm days when the ants are more active; our lawn is full of ant nests. The goldfinches and house sparrows are still the predominant birds in the garden with lots of young. I have heard and seen a young blackbird being fed and spotted a young robin but their numbers seem to be down this year.

I did see several tadpoles with legs but not recently, however a kingfisher and heron have been visiting the pond; the moorhens are still there and I think they could have chicks very soon.

The building of the network is due to take place during the autumn, with the aim to bring the network live before the end of this year. I will be organising a meeting for residents in the village hall later this year, to make a presentation and take questions.
