A letter from Bishop Karen

'As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you.'

These wonderful words are used at the start of Morning Prayer each day. It is a rich and powerful prayer asking God to not only go with us into a new day, but also that we may be changed by God's presence with us. Hence our love being a vehicle of God's love in the world.



This is a powerful prayer for our day and age, as the world so much needs the love and light of Christ in so many ways. We can pray it for ourselves and we can pray it for others. Our world leaders, our peace makers, those who put their own lives in danger for the sake of others. November is the month of remembrance, where we give thanks for those who have given their lives in the pursuit of peace, and we reflect on our own calling as peacemakers where we are, in our homes, in our communities, in the decisions we make and our reactions to others.





Heartwarming story

A touching love story that began in Longbridge Deverill during the Second World War has been shared by the family of resident, Sidney Baggs, who died recently aged 96. Sidney met his future wife, Eileen. now 94, when she was evacuated from London at the start of WW2 to live with her grandmother in the village. The pair were pupils at Longbridge Deverill Primary School



and soon became childhood sweethearts. Colin Baggs, their son, said, "In the village, probably on the wall in the picture, they carved a sign of their early love alongside their initials whilst they were at school together. Mum would have been eight or nine, and dad would have been ten or eleven. If you know where it is, you can still just about make it out."



After the war, Eileen returned to London, but she and Sidney kept in touch. The couple married on 25th March 1951 and settled in Longbridge Deverill, where they raised their family and remained ever since. They went on to have two children, four grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren. "I think, when he died, he was probably the longest living

Upper Deverills Wildlife & Conservation Group Visit Cannwood Farm

In early October, twenty members of the Upper Deverills Wildlife and Conservation Group visited Cannwood Farm near North Brewham, at the invitation of environmentalist and author Ben Goldsmith. Cannwood, a 430-acre former dairy farm, has been transformed over recent years into a thriving rewilding landscape.



Ben welcomed us with coffee and pastries before leading a walk through the varied habitats now emerging under his care. Fences have been removed, watercourses 're-wiggled,' and new ponds created to encourage wetland life. What were once arable fields and pasture are now a patchwork of meadow, scrub and woodland edge alive with birds and insects.



We saw the clear signs of beavers at work, gnawed stumps and neat dams holding back pools of water. Their engineering is helping to restore the headwaters of local rivers and reduce the risk of flooding downstream. Cannwood is part of a growing chain of rewilded estates across Somerset and Wiltshire, together forming a wildlife corridor of more than 12,000 acres.

A particular thrill was the chance to see a European Wildcat at close quarters, a striking animal and formidable hunter of grey squirrels. These cats are rarely seen in Britain and their presence is a reminder of what might one day be possible for native species recovery.

Our visit ended with a delicious lunch overlooking the valley: beef casserole from Ben's White Park cattle and a bean stew for the vegetarians. His warmth, knowledge and enthusiasm made the day both informative and memorable.

Nature Notes

The countryside has gone through another transformation and is full of autumnal colours. So far it has been a very quiet time with hardly any winds so the leaves have stayed put for us to enjoy their splendid hues for longer. I fear this is about to



change very soon as more unsettled weather is on the horizon. With it being so still, I have been able to listen for bird calls more easily but I have yet to hear any redwings or fieldfares, our winter visiting thrushes. It's around the middle of October I usually hear my first redwing; a high-pitched seeping call that I often pick up first of all in the evening after dark. In my experience the fieldfares follow the redwings often a good two weeks or more later. I tend to first hear them, with their cha-cha-chack call, in the morning. Our summer visitors have flown south to warmer climes. The redwings and fieldfares come here from Scandinavia so are also migrating to warmer parts where food should be more readily available.

With the stillness and quiet it's been a real treat to hear the tawny owls calling. At this time of the year, they are very active establishing their territories and the young birds are becoming independent from their parents so space is at a premium. They have been particularly vocal about an hour or so after sunset but also around midnight.

We are down to just two young moorhens now. A month ago one of the youngsters was taken by something; having not long counted four young and one adult there was a commotion on the pond and afterwards only three young remained; don't know what took it. The remaining three and one adult stayed together until last week-end, but then I realised there were only two youngsters left. They are doing well on their own, very capable flyers and seem to have their wits about them. I have been putting out food for them on the raft for a while now, probably since the original family group of two adults and five young. I think of the two left one is male and the other female, one is definitely more territorial than the other i.e. the male, chasing woodpigeons coming to steal the food. Hopefully the other youngster and adult made it to the river.



A male green woodpecker has been feeding on the lawn recently. Its colours are beautiful, he comes quite close to the house giving superb views through the telescope, its red moustache plainly visible identifying

it as a male. A pied wagtail has been lawn feeding too. Today two moorhens, three woodpigeons, the male green woodpecker and pied wagtail were all out there. The occasional visit from a heron and a little egret have not been encouraged!

The hedgehogs do not come so regularly now. They were coming every night and clearing all the food but now there is food leftover. I cleaned out the two hibernation houses and put in fresh straw, but it is too early for them to hibernate. I did find a dead hedgehog in the rear hibernation house and two died during the summer. Maybe they have found better food elsewhere or gone on holiday.
