A letter from Bishop Stephen

This December, Carol and I will visit the tiny Channel Island of Alderney. It is a beautiful but a heavily fortified place having been both the first line of defence historically and an occupied and evacuated community. Having marked the 80th Anniversary of Liberation in Guernsey in May, Alderney has its own unique act of remembrance on 15th December known as Home Coming.



Alderney was not liberated because it had been evacuated. The people of Alderney could not return until later in the year when the war ended because the island was in such a state having been brutalised by the German occupation. In particular there were three concentration camps to provide forced labour. This December it is the 80th anniversary of the people of Alderney coming home which must have been both joyous and hugely challenging.

In these days of Advent we prepare ourselves for the coming home of our Saviour. Dark days prevail and I reflect upon what that darkness really means for those currently under oppression or war such as in Sudan and South Sudan. It can be difficult to imagine as we prepare for a happy English Christmas, what it must be like if your home is under threat.

At Christmas, wherever we are, and however full or fragile our lives are, we mark perhaps the greatest moment in human history. The very fact that God chooses to lower himself and to be born among us, and to make His home as one of us, marks out the Christian experience from any other in our world. Our preparations and our celebrations make it all too easy to miss the full meaning of the incarnation. The fact that God is with us is a liberation all of its own and



calls us to make every home in our world as safe and as free as possible. This Christmas as families, and as some remain alone, let us remember before anything else that the God who made his home among us calls us to return to Him and to live lives that proclaim the good news. May the home coming of Jesus be with you this Christmas.

The Link will continue to take people to medical appointments during Christmas and New Year holidays. However, our phone will not be 'manned' on 24th, 25th, 26th, 31st December 2025 or 1st & 2nd January 2026. If you have a medical appointment between these dates please let us know by Friday 20th December, if possible, to give us the best chance of getting you a driver.

October was the busiest month so far this year with 143 trips completed, 21 cancelled and only 1 with no driver available. Our drivers did 5,803 miles and 343 hours and the co-ordinators made/received an estimated 800+ phone calls. A staggering effort from everyone. We need more drivers to help us meet the demand so if you are interested in volunteering as a driver please call our co-ordinator on 01747 860096. This could be one of your New Year's resolutions! Our volunteer drivers choose when they want to drive and where they want to go and receive 45p/mile to cover the additional costs of using their own car.

If you want to use the Link, once you have an appointment please call 01747 860096 to book a driver. But please remember we are not a taxi service! **Our co-ordinators work from home, we do not have an office, so please call between 9.00 am - 5.00 pm Monday to Friday using 01747 860096.** If possible we require a minimum of 48 hours notice (not including Saturdays and Sundays). We cannot guarantee a co-ordinator will be home for last minute requests.

With the nights drawing in and ALABARÉ preparing for what we expect to be another busy winter season, we remain determined to support those facing the crisis of homelessness towards a brighter and independent future.

Can you and your community help? We have launched our Winter Appeal for 2025, focussing on the issue of veterans' homelessness. Sue served her country before working in bars and restaurants. When the COVID pandemic struck and she was furloughed, Sue found it hard to make ends meet, lost her home and possessions, and was separated from her children. She was sleeping in her car, feeling hopeless, forgotten, and ashamed, when she came to ALABARÉ. We provided her with safe, secure accommodation, vital mental health support and the means to start turning her life around. Through coaching, wellbeing programmes, employability training, Sue began to believe in herself again. Today she is bidding for a place of her own, to call home *"I feel like I can breathe again. ALABARÉ gave me my life back, and I've never felt better."*

Rugby Legend Maggie Alphonsi Inspires Pupils

On Friday 3rd October, Crockerton School had the honour of welcoming Maggie Alphonsi MBE - former England rugby star and BBC broadcaster for the Women's Rugby World Cup 2025. The visit was attended by enthusiastic pupils and staff from Crockerton, along with guests from Wylde Valley, Horningsham, and Sambourne Schools. Fresh off the excitement of England's recent Women's Rugby World Cup triumph in September, Maggie's visit couldn't have come at a better time. She shared her personal journey to becoming a World Cup winner, including the heartbreak of losing to New Zealand in both 2006 and 2010, before finally lifting the trophy in 2014 after defeating Canada - a team England once again overcame in the 2025 final.

Mrs Ilic, head teacher at Crockerton, reflected on the moment: *"I spent all summer watching the Roses play. I was incredibly proud to see England's women dominate in their sport, especially following on from the Lionesses' success earlier in the year."*

In the afternoon, Maggie led engaging rugby activities with each class, bringing energy and excitement to the playground. She also took time to sign copies of her books for the children, leaving them with lasting memories and inspiration.

Miss Sides, another member of staff, shared her thoughts: *"This was truly inspiring. What an incredible person Maggie is, we feel that passions and minds have grown as a result of this visit."*

NATURE NOTES

Storm Claudia has arrived and is currently delivering torrential rain. So far, the wind isn't too bad but there's plenty of time for it to whip up. It should be helping to fill the reservoirs. It is still quite mild but things are due to change next week with a cold snap forecast. Being so mild we have plants flowering that wouldn't normally do so until the spring. There is a *Ionicera fragrantissima* blooming which has beautiful lily of the valley scent and the winter jasmine is covered in yellow flowers brightening up even the dullest of days. The ceanothus, Californian lilac, still has a few bluey mauve flowers on it which would normally have gone over by at the end of summer. A Welsh poppy was out recently, lovely custard yellow, again not the norm. I saw a red admiral butterfly last Saturday, 8th November, and a dragonfly on the pond on the 1st December.



I normally hear redwings in the middle of October as they arrive for the winter, but this year I did not hear any until the 6th November and then just two of their high-pitched seeping calls after dark but nothing since. In my experience fieldfares arrive several weeks after redwings so consequently I have yet to see or hear any of them. It appears the whole season is about a month adrift. I have noticed more blackbirds in the last few days, they come from the continent to overwinter here; and about fifty starlings, hopefully their numbers will increase and we will be able to see some murmurations.



There are still berries on the pyracanthas and cotoneasters, but with the odd blackbird taking an interest and their numbers increasing the berries could soon disappear. With so many fruits in hedgerows the garden ones have been spared for longer this year.

I have still not seen any signs of hedgehogs, I asked several people in the village and they are finding the same. Perhaps they have moved on due to there being too many here or an overload of parasites in the area. The two hedgehogs I had which died were covered in ticks and fleas, I had often found a tick in one of the feeding stations. Ticks and fleas are debilitating in high numbers, leading to severe anaemia and death in extreme cases.

The moorhens are still on the pond, the two youngsters have been joined by their sibling, I am pretty sure it is as they seem to know one another and get on well. They are juveniles lacking the red frontal plate and yellow tip on the beak of an adult. I hope the youngster which returned will show the other two the way to the river where they will find more food when the weather turns colder.

A roe deer came into the garden this month, a doe with two well grown youngsters, one buck and the other a doe. One morning though we had a gorgeous mature buck with a splendid set of antlers.
