

A letter from Bishop Stephen

It is rare to have the Feast of Candlemas, 2nd February, so close to the start of Lent, Ash Wednesday 18th February. With Easter very early this year, it means that there are only fifteen days between the end of the Christmas cycle and the start of the season of reflection, abstinence and study. Not much time to change gear!

Or to use a liturgical description, only two Sundays of Ordinary Time. The name 'Ordinary Time' comes not from the fact some days are just plain 'ordinary' but all time is ordered as part of the divine nature. Our telling and re-telling of the Christian Year is not merely a nostalgic rehearsal but the re-living of the truths that shape our lives as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Seeing life, and in particular living a Christian life, as an expression of sharing in the divine nature is therefore anything but ordinary. If we believe that we are all created in the image and likeness of God, then how we live our lives can only ever be extraordinary, regardless of what happens to us. If God sees us and our 'ordinary' lives as a gift of himself, how are we to respond? I often wonder what God thinks of us when he sees what we do with this unbelievable gift.

The Christ-child was cared for by Mary and Joseph at his Presentation in the Temple (2nd February), cared for and carried. In Lent, we seek to care more for ourselves with a sacred sense of self-care. How different might this be if we see ourselves as uniquely held by God, whatever the world thinks of us, and, even as we try to better ourselves, see ourselves as a gift, created in the image of God. Yes, this means you.

Psalm 139.13-14 You are the one who created my innermost parts; you knit me together while I was still in my mother's womb. I give thanks to you that I was marvellously set apart. Your works are wonderful - I know that very well.





Longbridge Deverill Parish Council

Precept and Budget Discussions The Parish Council has decided on a budget for 2026/2027. This year's precept was discussed and will be £10,092 an increase of 10.71%, an annual difference of just £2.30 per year for a Band D property. This will allow the council to earmark funds towards a new Speed Indicator Device, one will need replacing soon. Full details on the budget can be found in minutes of the meeting held on 12th January on the website www.longbridgedeverill-pc.gov.uk

The Parish Plan We are currently finalising a questionnaire for residents so we can update our Parish Plan. The Parish Plan is a community-led document which outlines how a community sees itself developing over the next few years. We ask that you take the time to fill in this questionnaire as it allows the Parish Council to ensure that we are reflecting the community's views.

The Parish Steward The Parish Steward works to assist local parishes in essential seasonal maintenance works, working with representatives from the Parish Council to log work requests for review. The Parish Steward scope of work includes the following: hand clearing and cutting of growth from drainage grips and drain gully covers; hand clearing of blocked gullies; rodding of drainage systems; clearing of small culverts, pipes, and pits; clearing storm debris; trimming encroaching hedges and vegetation from around road signs and railings; cleaning and straightening small road signs; hand cutting small visibility areas; reactive emergency repairs including pothole repairs (In accordance with Wiltshire Councils Highways Inspection Manual 2018); find, fix & record potholes (cold repairs only); responding to road closure requests from the emergency services; removal of ragwort (hand pulling or strimming of defined areas); treatment/removal of weeds; graffiti and fly posting removal; clearance of debris and materials from scenes of road traffic collisions including clinical waste; siding out of footways and carriageways; clearance of storm damaged trees from the Highway including the use of a chainsaw. There are certain times of year where we may not have visits from the Parish Steward as they prioritise things like gritting or pothole repairs. Should you notice any work you would like to see included on the Parish Steward's log please email the Parish Council.

Parish Steward The Parish Steward is in the valley on a regular basis. This is certainly a day once a month, but sometimes more pressing issues can be dealt with sooner. There are seasonal jobs that take priority, like verge trimming, gully clearing etc, but many items like cleaning signs, improving sign visibility and strimming can be done at any time of year.

Noticeboard The Parish Noticeboard in Monkton Deverill had become rather dilapidated after many years of good service. Under the guidance of Councillor Andy Harwick the Parish Council has replaced this with a new one. As before, it has a section for Parish Council information and a section for residents to place their own notices.

Wessex Internet We anticipate Wessex Internet will be organizing an open meeting in the Parish probably in March to explain the forthcoming works in the valley and the possible benefits to residents. Further details will follow. The project is still in the planning stage with Wessex Internet contacting landowners for access for the planned fibre network. Once complete the final plans will be passed to the delivery team. Delivery is scheduled for early summer, with the build hopefully starting March/April. Updates will be provided via the newsletter and website as they become available.

Rainfall report 2025 - Deverills & Crockerton Parish

This last year produced a complete contrast to the previous 2 years, in 2025 we received 36.4 inches of rain and a long heat wave. Whereas in both 2023 and 2024 records show we had 51 inches, and a wet summer.

March 2025 started the dry period with minimal rainfall, which continued very dry until the end of August. The heat wave started in early June and we were enjoying temperatures of 20 degrees plus and peaking at 34 degrees on 12th July. The lowest temperature in 2025, recorded during period 9th to 11th January, was minus 4 degrees C.

The rainfall for 2025 taken from 6 different sites within the Parish and averaged out is 36.4 inches which is very close to our 25 year average of 35 inches per annum. The contrast of the amount of rain recorded in the West of the Parish 39.0 inches at Kingston Deverill, and at Longbridge Deverill in the east where we recorded 35 inches, this is quite a normal difference. I was told when I came to live here nearly 59 years ago the difference would be not quite an inch per mile.

For the last 25 years our annual rainfall was about 35 inches per annum. Now over the last 6 years we are seeing an increase in the amount of rain, it has crept up to an average taken over 6 years for the Parish of 42.94 inches per annum. This is significant, I wonder if this increase will be sustained.

I will be very grateful if I can encourage more people to let me have their rainfall records and of course keep a rain gauge plus other weather records.

NATURE NOTES

The weather continues to keep us guessing, one day cold and icy and the next milder and wet. The two adult moorhens on the pond seem to be quite happy in the rain; water off a moorhen's back. They are easily identified as adults by the red frontal plate and bill with a yellow tip. The youngsters have a dull colouration to the bill. Until recently there were only youngsters, usually two or three, but the adults appear to have chased the youngsters off.

The hedgehog food was eaten last night, the bowl licked clean; it was definitely a hedgehog as it deposited some poo, which is reassuring. I have put out a little food each evening just in case it wakes and is hungry, the nights it's taken are those which are warmer. It's hibernation sleep is rather interrupted with the weather being so changeable. I think I have just one hedgehog.

The deer are coming into the garden regularly; there are two obvious places in the hedge at the top of the garden where they exit and enter. Yesterday morning one was still sitting down on the lawn, an adult doe. As they exit the garden, they pass a Christmas tree I planted several years ago and like to nibble its foliage which I wish they wouldn't do. I can understand how foresters find them a pest. I like to see them in the garden so I try to forgive them.



On the 31st of December there was a hard frost with fog and ice on the pond and we had an influx of fieldfares and redwings feeding on the fallen apples; the first time this has happened this winter. They were joined by about thirty starlings, but they didn't stay long. Since then, we've just had the odd fieldfare which is noticeable when it chases away other birds from the apples, keeping the larder to itself. It was lovely to see the starlings; I had seen a similar size flock before flying about but nowadays there seem less than there used to be.



About ten days ago I was walking on the outskirts of the village and saw a flock of birds flying towards me with a characteristic flappy flight and heard a call, "pee-wit", which identified them as lapwings. I haven't seen any lapwings for several years. We used to see them on the farm most winters and this flock actually turned and flew off in that direction. The other names for lapwing are green plover and peewit.

Two herons came fishing at different times when the pond wasn't frozen, one was easily disturbed flying off, but the other was more difficult to chase away but it got the message eventually. Most mornings, I see a cock pheasant entering the garden looking for left over food in the places where I put it out, even the raft on the pond, and being such a big bird the moorhens don't chase it off, and it's getting bigger eating so well.
