Bishop Andrew of Ramsbury's letter



The elusive hare

One of the many blessings of the spring is the reappearance of that most mysterious of countryside creatures, the hare. Part of their appeal lies, I think, in elusiveness and movement: barrelling along a lane at night, ahead of us as we drive, or veering across the hillside. We were walking this weekend through an ocean of woodland bluebells, when Effie, our dog, startled a hare (almost the size of a muntjac) mere yards away and off it tore, confounding all attempts at pursuit. Always on the move, they are an Easter marvel.

I was reminded of the hare's dynamism when reading St Mark's account of the resurrection, which that evangelist conveys not as a fact to be proved, or puzzle to be solved, but as a mysterious kind of movement. "He has been raised; he is not here" declares the angel to the women at the tomb. "He is going ahead of you to Galilee". At which their first response, not unreasonably, is terrified flight, before doing as the angel bade them and relating this to the apostles.

Faith, in this light, is our pursuit of the Christ who goes before us. Rejoicing whenever we encounter him, walking his way and hoping earnestly to see him again.

On **Friday 15th May** David, Macmillan cancer support worker, will be at the cancer chat cafe with advice on the support and services available at RUH for patients and families.

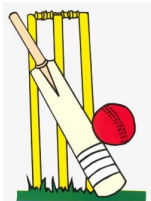

Neighbourhood watch - Scams

Scammers impersonating Wiltshire Police - fraudsters claiming to be from the police call residents telling them a package is being held as part of an investigation, giving a false crime reference number, and you will be called by your bank. The scammers then call impersonating your bank requesting access to your account. NEVER give financial details to callers.

DPD delivery scam - The magazine Which? is aware of a DPD delivery text scam warning of a missed delivery that you need to rearrange or an unpaid fee. The message will instruct you to reply or follow a link to give further information or card details. They use convincing copycat websites, with logos etc. Do not reply to the message or click any link within it. If you think the message could be genuine check what you have ordered by visit DPD's website directly.

Evri Copycat Site - this involves a website impersonating Evri, claiming you have a pending delivery, nature unspecified. You may receive a scam text saying your delivery failed due to a signature being required and provides a hyperlink to reschedule the delivery. This link leads to a convincing Evri copycat site complete with up to date logos and branding. Check links are bona fide before clicking on them, a fraudulent hyperlink can infect your device with malware.

Reporting - on an iPhone report scam calls by texting the word 'call' followed by the phone number to 7726; on an Android mobile text the word 'call' to 7726, you will be asked for the scammer's telephone number. Emails can be forwarded to the National Cyber Security Centre on: report@phishing.gov.uk.



River Day at Boyton

The river Wylde is at the heart of our beautiful valley. One of the UK's rare chalk streams, it runs from Kilmington till it joins the Avon near Salisbury, and is home to a great variety of wildlife. It is certainly a valuable asset, but a vulnerable one too. For many years the river has been under sustained pressure from the results of human intervention and climate change – as demonstrated by factors such as water extraction, flood prevention, sedimentation, pollution and so on.



For the past few years the Wylde Valley Farmers Group has been carrying out work to enhance the river and the surrounding environment. This is often in association with other interested parties such as the fishing clubs and the Wessex Rivers Trust, all of whom share the same aim of a clean and healthy river supporting wide biodiversity.

On **Wednesday 20th May** the WVFG will be holding a River Day at Boyton. This is open to everyone, including children, and is free of charge. It will be an excellent opportunity to learn more about the river and the nature that calls it home, as well as the restoration works that are planned. The day will include guided walks along the river with experts in subjects such as plants and invertebrates. There will be a selection of speakers throughout the day, and lunch and refreshments will also be provided.

NATURE NOTES

The RSPB has issued new advice on feeding garden birds. Their advice is from the beginning of May until the end of October we should pause feeding peanuts and seeds by gradually reducing the nuts and seeds during April and then stop at the beginning of May. If we want to feed the birds from May to October they suggest putting out small amounts of mealworms and suet. This change in policy is because of the drastic impact the parasite *Trichomonas gallinae* has had on many of our finches, especially greenfinches. I have been concerned about feeding seed in warmer and wet weather, in my experience, this is when the parasite thrives. We like to see birds by encouraging them to gather around a feeder but this greatly increases the risk of transmission as the parasite lives in bird's saliva. Finches spend more time at feeders, pulling out seed and breaking it up and spitting out bits which makes them the most susceptible to trichomonosis. So, I have got some mealworms and bought a special mealworm feeder.



There are lots of tadpoles now in the pond swimming around individually, which means they are frogs. We certainly had a good amount of frog spawn but this year didn't have high numbers of toads either in the pond or on the road. There were more males toads than females, I must have removed at least 4 dead female toads from the pond drowned by over amorous males. In past years we have had shoals of toad tadpoles as they congregate together. 'Our' moorhens are still about and I have seen them mating on several occasions. I reckon she is on a nest in amongst the yellow flag irises, which have shot up in the past few weeks and are now affording good protection. There is a heron which comes quite regularly but thankfully it is easily spooked (so far). Recently a pied wagtail, a male - it is very black and white -, has been coming to the pond and lawn to feed. One day a green sandpiper also came to the pond, I got the book out to identify it; it was continually bobbing its tail and head and I realised it was too big to be a wagtail.



With warmer weather the insects are on the increase, some waking after hibernation. We have removed well over a dozen queen wasps from the garage and house. I have seen lots of bee flies; they look like bees but sound like a fly and have a long mouth part making people describe them as a flying narwhale. They seem to be particularly keen on the pulmonaria. It has been good to see a good number of butterflies; brimstone, peacock, orange tip and recently blue.



Summer migrants have returned. On the 11th I spotted a swallow on the wire near the stable and there are a pair in there now. No house martins yet but I have been told of some nearby. Blackcaps are back and swifts will be next.
