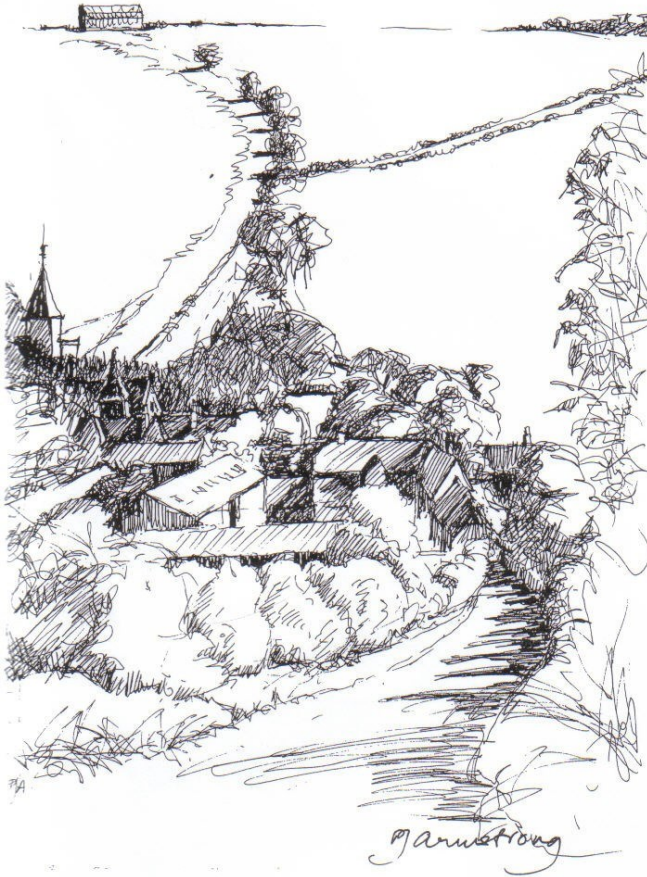

## New Rector for Benefice of Cley Hill Villages

I am delighted to share the news with you, that after 2½ years without a Rector, we interviewed 2 applicants for the post and the Bishop of Ramsbury offered the post to one of them. The Revd Mark Windsor has accepted and will join us in September. Mark is currently a Team Vicar in the Vale of Pewsey and is required to give three months notice. As I have worked to maintain our services, a heartfelt thanks to all those people who have supported the Parish during the Vacancy. Church life continues with our normal routine of services; there will be 3 weddings this summer, baptisms, memorial services.

Mark will move in to the Rectory in Longbridge over the Summer and he will be licensed as Rector of the Cley Hill Benefice by Bishop John Inge at 3.00 pm on **Sunday 13th September** at St Peter and St Paul's, Longbridge Deverill. In the mean time we will continue to be supported by the Rural Dean and a number of retired clergy from Warminster, who will be presiding at our Communion services.

Lastly, a message from Bishop Karen, the acting Bishop of Salisbury; "As you are aware, Bishop Stephen has stepped back from active ministry while a financial audit of two funds is underway. While the necessary official processes are still progressing and will take a little more time to conclude, please be assured that we are navigating this period carefully whilst continuing to focus on our vision to Make Jesus Known."

## One Church, One Faith, One Lord

It has been a joy these first four months of the year being the acting bishop of Stepney. The former bishop moved on in the autumn, and bishop (now archbishop) Sarah asked me to support the team as she moved on to Lambeth. Familiar with parts of London, the Windrush Line was new to me, so getting to know Islington, Tower Hamlets and Bethnal Green has been a new discovery, finding new vibrancy and life in the East End. Spending a couple of days a week in our capital city I discovered frequent buses, the ability to walk thousands of steps a day between tube stations, churches and hotels and a great area team, Archdeacon, Missioner and Director of Ordinands. I met parish clergy, committed laity and young people; the newly ordained and the long serving area dean; interns testing their vocation, vicars to be licensed and new believers ready to be baptised and confirmed.



Yet the challenges of urban ministry are not too different from the challenges we face here in the Salisbury diocese, some churches struggle while others thrive; areas of deprivation adjoin areas of plenty; and partnerships and collaboration are encouraged as a way of sharing resources and working together joyfully in God's world. And the opportunities are the same too. A chance to reach out to those in need and offer hospitality, extending a welcome to newcomers in whom Christ is working, and walking alongside individuals in their faith journey.

As I have been energised by a new experience, so the London diocese have gained from my insights and objectivity. Now a new bishop begins in Stepney and I pass the baton on. It is always good to be reminded that the church is much bigger than our own experience of it, and we share together in God's amazing plan, thankful for brothers and sisters everywhere and for all they can teach us.

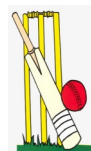

### Julie Wallder

She was born in Kingston Blount, Oxfordshire on 5th February 1941, after her Mum Violet with older siblings, Vin and Dorothy, had been evacuated from London due to WW2; her Dad Thomas was a Reserve fireman in London. Julie attended Brownies and Guides and was in the Red Cross. She also had a Saturday job at Woolworths. She went to Bromley Technical College to learn shorthand and typing and when she left college she got a job with a firm of solicitors.

She married Robert on 4th September 1961. Their son Stephen was born in 1965 and Paul followed in 1967. During the 1980's Bob and Julie ran their own business. In the 1990's Julie was a PA for the company Ferryman, Fyans and Hudson in South East London and was living in Chislehurst, Kent.

Towards the end of 2000 Bob and Julie moved to Orchard Way, Crockerton. Bob died 27th February 2007 - after her husband's death Julie became involved in the Crockerton and Deverills WI and becoming their secretary. She was very involved with the church at Longbridge Deverill including helping at the Toddler group with her friend Sylvia Titt.

In April 2022 Julie moved into OSJCT Watersmead Care Home in Westbury where she died peacefully in her sleep in the early morning of Easter Monday 6th April 2026. Her funeral took place on Monday 18th May 2026 at West Wiltshire Crematorium, Semington.

### Bridleway closed

There is a broken footbridge mid-way along the public bridleway which starts from the Maiden Bradley road (on the corner 200 yards east of Dairy Farmhouse) and ends on the No Through Road at Rodmead Farm. Wiltshire Council have erected a notice stating that a 70 metre section mid-way along that route is temporarily closed until 10th November to enable bridge repair, and no alternative route is available.

A company has reportedly been going door-to-door claiming urgent roof repairs are needed. Please be cautious of anyone arriving uninvited and pressuring residents into agreeing to work or making immediate payments. Wiltshire Police are also promoting “No Cold Calling” stickers and general crime prevention advice for residents.

Always: • Ask for ID and company details • Get written quotes from trusted local traders • Take time before agreeing to any work • Check reviews, recommendations independently • Contact family, neighbours, friends if unsure.

Never: • Feel pressured into making quick decisions • Pay cash upfront • Allow unexpected callers onto your roof without verification.

## NATURE NOTES

Everything in nature is dependent on the weather; nothing grows without rain and development relies on warmth. With being colder than normal things seem to have gone on a go-slow. The frog tadpoles have not got hind legs yet, I am sure it's because the water in the pond hasn't warmed up. Amphibians being poikilothermic absorb heat from their surroundings, and there's definitely been a lack of heat. There is due to be an increase of some 10 degrees C at the end of next week so I hope to see limbs appearing soon. We had a good number of goldfish in the pond but we don't see any now. Whether this is because it's been colder and the fish have stayed down deeper in the weed, or because we do have a heron that comes to angle and they are taking evading action or the heron has eaten them! I can't believe that the heron could eat all of them because there were over a 100 and many of them were black. The pair of moorhens keep me guessing as to what they are up to. I think they have delayed breeding because of the cold weather; they seem to come to the pond for bed and breakfast and then go off for the day. The pond is probably looking at its best right now with the yellow flag irises flowering.



It took a while for the birds to accept the mealworm feeder. It is working especially well for a pair of blue tits that have a brood of chicks in the nest box on the old cherry tree. As soon as I put the mealworms out and walk away it's not long before one of the pair is there taking a worm away. Occasionally they come at the same time I'm putting the worms in! I've noticed the parents don't always go straight back to the nest; they put in little diversions going left or right to confuse any onlookers with predatory thoughts. I am feeding suet too in the form of blocks or cakes, insect or mealworm flavour, and suet to go fat balls insect flavour. The suet to go fat balls are a hit and they soon disappear. I was buying them in bags of 6 but I've recently invested in a box of 50!

The swallows are in residence in the stable. When I looked in this afternoon, I could see they had built up the nest with fresh mud, showing up in a darker colour. There is a good pile of guano below now. As far as I could see the swallow wasn't sitting yet. Perhaps they too are waiting for warmer weather to breed, especially as they are insect eaters. Identifying the hirudines (swallows and martins) can be a bit tricky but a swallow has a red throat, pale underside and tail streamers (longer in a male), a house martin can be picked out by its white rump. On Saturday evening 16th May I saw my first house martins this year at the front of the house. I'm sure they had just arrived back; there were 4 of them and 2 swooped up to the dual nest box as if checking it was still there for them to use. Hopefully the warmer weather will bring the swifts.
