## Letter from Dean of Salisbury Cathedral



800 years ago, on 14 June 1226, an extraordinary event took place at the heart of the post-Conquest still-new Diocese of Salisbury. The bodies of three of its early bishops (Osmund, Roger, Jocelin) were removed from their tombs in Old Sarum cathedral and brought down the hill, and reinterred in the cathedral of New Sarum, then in its seventh year of construction.

It was a sign the cathedral community's centre of gravity had shifted decisively. Its principal place of worship and prayer was no longer the windswept hilltop, under the watchful eye of the royal garrison. The community had moved, and it was important that the remains of its former leaders should move too. In life and in death, God's people belonged together.

It was not a custom peculiar to mediaeval England. Scripture records moments when the bones of the elders are moved as the community moves. On his deathbed, the patriarch Joseph prophesies that God will deliver his people from Egypt. He asks when that day comes his bones should be reburied in the Promised Land.

We could debate the theology of such removals at length. Presumably the unity in Christ of the living and the dead is not contingent on the place where the remains of the dead are located (or, indeed, on the place where the living are resident!). But the care with which such remains were treated, and the importance attached to their being close at hand, tells us something. It suggests our forebears were prepared to view those who had led them with respect and generosity.

Roger, Jocelin and Osmund were all Norman aristocrats heavily embroiled in the politics of the new regime. Despite Osmund's later canonization all must have made enemies (indeed, Jocelin was twice excommunicated by Archbishop Thomas Becket, martyred in 1170, while Roger's predilection for castle-building earned him the perpetual enmity of King Stephen). Yet the community honoured them; honoured the office they had held as Bishops of the Church; honoured (perhaps) whatever good they had seen in them as they exercised that office; and continued to pray for them as brothers in the Lord's family as they were laid to rest in the new cathedral.

Many commentators observe these are difficult times for leaders: I write this wondering who will be our Prime Minister when you read it. The scrutiny leaders are under is intense and expectations of them are high, understandably and necessarily so. Perhaps the strange rite of 800 years ago, that solemn procession from Old Sarum to the New, has something to teach us about our common origin in God's loving purpose, putting our differences into perspective; something about the roles leaders hold which transcends the qualities or defects they bring to them; and something about our vocation to pray constantly and learning to pray for those we find hard to love.

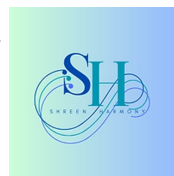

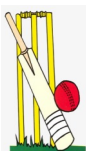

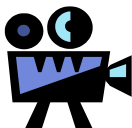

### Crockerton School

What a lovely day, as always, at Warleigh Lodge Farm. The 12 children in Potters, Year R and Year 1 had their annual trip to this farm. The children enjoyed feeding the goats. They milked the cow! Plus, they had a ride in the trailer. Thank you to all the super adults who really enjoyed their day too!

On the same day, we had our Year 1/2 class attend KS1 West Wilts Dance Festival at the Bath Forum. The children have been learning about Rivers and their book, A River, was the inspiration as well as Tina Turner's as we choose her song Rolling like a River as our music. These young children enjoyed performing in front of the school before heading to Bath for the afternoon and evening.



## Nature Notes

It doesn't seem possible we are nearly at the longest day. I love the long summer evenings, but they dupe me into thinking it isn't quite so late and I stay outside longer than I should. At the moment there are several plants flowering with strong scents; honeysuckle, dianthus, philadelphus and sweet pea and their aromas seem to be intensified in the evenings. Soon the buddleias will come into bloom and the summer jasmine adding to the scent in the air.

We think the herons have cleared the pond of goldfish, we've not seen any for ages and the herons don't visit now, we think they know there aren't any left. We are down to one moorhen; a male which turns up most evenings making quite a noise as if looking for its mate. We will never know what happened to the other one but I suspect it was predated, either from the air or land. Recently, I



spotted a red kite circling above the pond, it dropped lower and lower until it touched the pond surface and went off with something (possibly a blackbird taken from the floating weed) in its talons, just like an osprey. The pond also seems to have lost all its tadpoles; this seems to happen each year but perhaps there are still a few, it is a big pond. I did see a great diving beetle, apparently it is a fierce predator so it might have munched on some. On hotter sunny days, we have seen dragonflies, including a broad bodied chaser, and damselflies.

The swallows in the stable appear to have had a brood. I had been reluctant to disturb them with the strong winds we have been experiencing in case I spooked them into trying to fly before they were ready. The parents had built up the nest almost to the ceiling so it was difficult to see if there was anything in it. I was pleased when I looked in a few days ago to see two youngsters in there flying around quite strongly, whether there were more than two in the brood I don't know. Both compartments of the dual house martin nest box are in use and I have been listening for chick sounds. There are definitely chick noises coming from the swift box at the rear of the house; a pair of house sparrows are on their second or third brood. I have only seen a few swifts, one recently in the village flying low over the river and cress beds. We first saw two in town on the 23rd May but since then the numbers have been disappointing.

We have a family of great spotted woodpeckers in the garden, the male has red on the back of its neck, the female has no red on its head, but the youngsters have a red crown on their heads. The clutch size is five to six eggs but it is difficult to count how many young there are as they move around so much. We also have a pair of collared doves, so dainty.



We saw a hummingbird hawkmoth at the end of May, quite early, and two painted lady butterflies. Hopefully there will be more butterflies to come.
